The Board of Trustees convened in regular session at 7:00 P.M. on this 3rd day of February, 2014 in the Municipal Building of the Village of Steger with President Peterson in the Chair and presiding and Village Clerk Carmen S. Recupito, Jr. attending.

The Village Clerk called the roll and the following Trustees were present: Skrezyna, Kozy, Sarek, Lopez and Perchinski. Trustee Banicki was absent. Also present were HR/Dispatch Director Mary Jo Seehausen, Director of Public Infrastructure Dave Toepper, Community Center Director Diane Rossi, Village Administrator Mike Tilton, Fire Chief Jeff Roesner, EMA Chief Tom Johnston and Police Chief Greg Rambo.

MINUTES

Trustee Perchinski made a motion to approve the minutes as written. Trustee Kozy seconded the motion. Voice vote was called; all ayes. Motion carried.

AUDIENCE PARTICIPATION

Sherry Newquist of 3511 Union Avenue approached the Board and requested an extension of her temporary business license. Trustee Perchinski made a motion to extend Amici's temporary business license. Trustee Kozy seconded the motion. Roll was called and the following Trustees voted aye; Skrezyna, Kozy, Lopez, Sarek and Perchinski. Mayor Peterson voted aye. Motion carried.

REPORTS

Village Administrator Mike Tilton reported that the Safe Route to School grant was submitted on January 31st. Mr. Tilton also stated that the bids for the lighting retrofitting project are out. February 10th at 11am will be the pre bid meeting. Mr. Tilton reported that Cook County has a GIS system that could save the Village approximately \$6,000.

Director of Public Infrastructure Dave Toepper reported that the Village has a small amount of salt still in reserve. Salt usage is now in "conservation mode" in hopes of getting through the winter with what is on hand. Mayor Peterson thanked Director Toepper for the great job his department has been doing cleaning Village streets during this extremely harsh winter.

Fire Chief Jeff Roesner was called away from the meeting. Trustee Perchinski read his report. In January the Fire Department had 113 total calls; 12 fire calls, 98 medical calls and 3 were toned out in error. Mutual Aid was received 13 times and given 18 times.

Police Chief Greg Rambo had no report

EMA Chief Tom Johnston reported that some businesses in the down town district have moved snow into the crosswalks and that customers are having trouble using crosswalks. Mayor Peterson asked Administrator Tilton to reach out to businesses and encourage them to keep crosswalks clear.

Community Center Director Diane Rossi reported that the Community Center has a new recumbent bicycle for the exercise room and members are very pleased. Mrs. Rossi reported that softball and flag football registration is underway. Volleyball and Basketball seasons have begun. Mrs. Rossi also stated that the new cleaning company is “wonderful”.

HR Director Mary Jo Seehausen reported that there will be a meeting with East-com on Wednesday, February 5th and that she and the Mayors and Chiefs of each department have been invited to attend. Steger is the topic of the conversation at the meeting. Mrs. Seehausen has been working with our Risk Management Agency regarding training. They are looking at using Ingalls for Occupational Health. She expects to have log ins for everyone for next week.

The sports field mix will cost \$1,500 or more. Trustee Sarek will talk to the Recreation Board about sharing the cost of the dirt.

Beginning on Tuesday February 18, 2014, Bremontowne Manor Apartments in Tinley Park will begin distributing application information packets to persons interested in placing their names on the facility's waiting list.

Bremontowne Manor is a federally-subsidized apartment complex which provides affordable housing to low-income senior citizens and persons with mobility impairments. Applicants for the housing for senior citizens must be at least 62 years of age. All applicants must have a total annual income of less than **\$25,350** (one person) or **\$29,000** (two persons). A full description of eligibility restrictions and other detailed information about Bremontowne Manor is contained in the application packet. All apartments are one bedroom. Rents are subsidized under the HUD Section 8 Rental Assistance program. Under this program, tenants pay a monthly rent equal to 30% of their monthly income, after adjustments for medical expenses.

**AN ORDINANCE REPEALING ORDINANCE NO. 1048
FOR THE VILLAGE OF STEGER.**

WHEREAS, the Village of Steger, Counties of Cook and Will, State of Illinois (the "Village") is a duly organized and existing municipality and unit of local government created under the provisions of the laws of the State of Illinois, and is operating under the provisions of the Illinois Municipal Code, and all laws amendatory thereof and supplementary thereto, with full powers to enact ordinances and adopt resolutions for the benefit of the residents of the Village; and

WHEREAS, on or about September 3, 2013, the Village President (the "President") and Board of Trustees of the Village (the "Village Board and together with the President, the "Corporate Authorities") adopted Ordinance No. 1048 titled, "*An Ordinance Establishing the Position of Telecommunications Supervisor for the Village of Steger*" ("Ordinance No. 1048"); and

WHEREAS, the management position of Telecommunications Supervisor has not been filled; and

WHEREAS, after the adoption of Ordinance No. 1048, the Corporate Authorities determined and do hereby determine that it is no longer necessary, advisable or in the Village's best interests to fill the position of Telecommunications Supervisor; and

WHEREAS, in connection with the foregoing, the Corporate Authorities have determined that it is necessary, advisable and in the best interests of the Village to repeal Ordinance No. 1048 and eliminate the position of Telecommunications Supervisor; and

**AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING AND APPROVING AN INTERGOVERNMENTAL
PUBLIC SAFETY AGREEMENT ESTABLISHING A CENTRALIZED PUBLIC
SAFETY COMMUNICATIONS SYSTEM FOR THE VILLAGE OF STEGER.**

WHEREAS, the Village of Steger, Counties of Cook and Will, State of Illinois (the "Village") is a duly organized and existing municipality and unit of local government created under the provisions of the laws of the State of Illinois, and is operating under the provisions of the Illinois Municipal Code, and all laws amendatory thereof and supplementary thereto, with full powers to enact ordinances and adopt resolutions for the benefit of the residents of the Village; and

WHEREAS, Article VII, Section 10 of the Constitution of the State of Illinois, adopted in 1970, expressly permits units of local government to jointly obtain or share services and to exercise, combine, or transfer their powers or functions, in any manner not otherwise prohibited by law or ordinance; and

WHEREAS, the Intergovernmental Cooperation Act (5 ILCS 220/1, *et seq.*) (the "Act") authorizes public agencies, which include units of local government, to jointly enjoy and/or exercise powers, privileges, functions, or authority with other public agencies, except where specifically and expressly prohibited by law; and

WHEREAS, the Act authorizes public agencies, such as the Village, to enter into intergovernmental agreements with other public agencies; and

WHEREAS, the Village of University Park, the Village of Crete, the Village of Peotone, the Village of Beecher, the Village of Monee, the Beecher Fire Protection District, the Monee Fire Protection District, the Crete Township Fire Protection District, the Peotone Fire Protection District, the Village of South Chicago Heights

and the Steger Estates Fire Protection District (collectively, the "Units of Government") are public agencies under the laws of the State of Illinois; and

WHEREAS, some or all of the Units of Government currently operate a centralized public safety communications system rather than maintaining their own emergency dispatch departments; and

WHEREAS, the above-referenced communications system, known as the Eastern Will County Communications Center ("EASTCOM"), allows the Units of Government to achieve cost savings, achieves the standardization of telecommunication equipment that individual Units of Government may not be able to purchase and provides for an unprecedented level of cooperation between numerous Police and Fire agencies; and

WHEREAS, the Village President (the "President") and the Board of Trustees of the Village (the "Village Board" and with the President, the "Corporate Authorities") have reviewed the operations of EASTCOM and along with the Units of Government, have determined that EASTCOM can adequately serve the needs of the Village and the Units of Government; and

WHEREAS, the Corporate Authorities have determined that participating in EASTCOM is necessary, advisable and in the best interests of the Village and the health and safety of its residents; and

WHEREAS, the Village's participation in EASTCOM shall commence as of 12:00 a.m. on April 30, 2014; and

WHEREAS, in connection with the foregoing, the Corporate Authorities have determined that it is in the best interests of the Village and its residents to enter into an intergovernmental public safety agreement (the "Agreement"), attached hereto and incorporated herein as Exhibit A, whereby the Village and the Units of Government will jointly establish, maintain and operate EASTCOM; and

WHEREAS, the procedures for the joint establishment, maintenance and operation of EASTCOM are further set forth in the By-Laws of EASTCOM (the "Bylaws"), which are attached as an exhibit to the Agreement, and incorporated herein as if fully set forth; and

WHEREAS, the Corporate Authorities have determined that it is advisable and in the best interests of the Village and its residents to enter into and approve an agreement with terms substantially the same as the terms of the Agreement and to agree to be bound by the Bylaws; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the President and the Board of Trustees of the Village of Steger, Counties of Cook and Will, and the State of Illinois, as follows:

**ARTICLE I.
IN GENERAL**

SECTION 1: Incorporation Clause.

The Corporate Authorities hereby find that all of the recitals hereinbefore stated as contained in the preambles to this Ordinance are full, true, and correct and do hereby, by reference, incorporate and make them part of this Ordinance as legislative findings.

SECTION 2: Purpose.

The purpose of this Ordinance is to authorize the President or his designee to enter into the Agreement whereby the Village and the Units of Government will jointly establish, maintain and operate EASTCOM, to authorize the acceptance of the Bylaws as binding upon the Village's participation in EASTCOM and to further authorize the President or his designee to take all steps necessary to carry out the terms and intent of this Ordinance and to ratify any steps taken to effectuate those goals.

**ARTICLE II.
AUTHORIZATION**

SECTION 3: Authorization.

That the Village Board hereby approves the Agreement and the Bylaws as binding upon the Village's participation in EASTCOM. The Village Board further authorizes and directs the President or his designee to enter into and approve the Agreement, or any modifications thereof, and to ratify any and all previous action taken to effectuate the intent of this Ordinance. The Village Board further authorizes and directs the President or his designee to execute the Agreement with such insertions, omissions, and changes as shall be approved by the President and the Village Attorney. The Village Clerk is hereby authorized and directed to attest to and countersign the Agreement and any other documentation as may be necessary to carry out and effectuate the purpose of this Ordinance. The Village Clerk is also authorized and directed to affix the Seal of the Village to such documentation as is deemed necessary. The officers, agents, and/or employees of the Village shall take all action necessary or reasonably required by the Town to carry out, give effect to, and effectuate the purpose of this Ordinance and shall take all action necessary in conformity therewith.


