
Mary Law of 3437 Jennifer Ct. she thanked Public Infrastructure Director Dave Toepper for having the park way tree trimmed.

Trustee Buxton Treasurer's Report is attached.





The Bid Opening for the above-referenced project was held August 22, 2016 at 10:00am local time at the Village of Steger Village Hall. There were three (3) bid packages opened in the order shown on the attached Tabulation of Bids. Knight has reviewed the bids and offers the following analysis and recommendation.

The attached Tabulation of Bids provides detail information taken from the bid opening as well as the Engineer's Estimate for construction costs. The low bidder, Iroquois Paving Corporation, provided a total bid of \$504,250.17. Bids for D. Construction, Inc. and Gallagher Asphalt Corporation totaled \$517,111.83 and \$572,561.37, respectively.

All bids were significantly lower than the Engineer's Estimate. Unit prices for HMA binder and surface as well as HMA surface removal items were 34% to 61% lower than expected, which contributed towards a majority of the total bid difference.

Based on the results of the bid opening summarized above and on the attached, we believe the low bid is representative of the total cost of the project. Therefore, Knight recommends that the Village award this contract to the low bidder, Iroquois Paving Corporation.



I am requesting Board approval to purchase two new 2017 Ford Police Utility Interceptors, from Terry's Ford Fleet Department located in Peotone, IL. Terry's Ford is providing competitive pricing offered through the Suburban Purchasing Cooperative, (SPC) specifically offered to municipalities for purchase of new equipment. Each unit is priced at \$27,525.00 for a total price of \$55,050.00. We have \$70,000.00 budgeted for this planned purchase. Please refer to the attached documents.

These squads will require some associated new equipment and installation expenses not expected to exceed the total budgeted amount. 


