MINUTES OF THE SPECIAL MEETING
OF THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE
VILLAGE OF STEGER, WILL & COOK
COUNTIES, ILLINOIS

The Board of Trustees convened in regular session at 7:00 P.M. on this 5TH day of June, 2017 in the Municipal Building of the Village of Steger with the Village Clerk Joseph M. Zagone, Jr. attending with Mayor Kenneth A. Peterson presiding.

Village Joseph M. Zagone, Jr. called the roll. The following Trustees were present; Joyce, Sarek, Perchinski, Skrezyna and Buxton. Trustee Lopez was absent. Also present were, Fire Chief Nowell Fillion, Police Chief Ken Boehm, Director of Public Infrastructure Dave Toepper, EMA Chief Tom Johnston, Housing Director Alice Peterson and Community Center Director Diane Rossi, Assistant Village Administrator Mary Jo Seehausen and Village Administrator Mike Tilton.

AWARDS, HONORS, SPECIAL RECOGNITIONS AND PRESENTATIONS –Phil of Construction services and Ron Cassidy an engineer for EMCOR discussed analyzing the Village Water System. The process takes about 3 months. After analyzing the water system, EMCOR will return to the Board with its results.

MINUTES

Trustee Perchinski made a motion to approve the minutes of the May 24, 2017 Board meeting, as all members have copies. Trustee Sarek seconded the motion. Voice vote; all ayes. Motion carried.

AUDIENCE PARTICIPATION-Michael Balanow of 3328 Florence approached the Board. Mr. Balanow asked for status updates on the BP Project, the Brown Onion Project and suggested a noise ordinance to control the volume of music in cars and homes and the status on the Village Hall project. Mr. Tilton explained that the BP project should begin tomorrow. Brown Onion Pub west building is coming down this week. A noise ordinance exists. Mayor Peterson urged Mr. Balanow to call the Police Department when he witnesses violators of the ordinance. Mayor Peterson explained that to finalize financing of the Police Station project, the audit report for the Village is necessary. Mayor Peterson has been assured by the Village auditing firm, the report will be complete by the end of June. After the Police Department project is "off the books" attention will turn to the Village Hall.

Janet Streck of Communities for Christ reported the Steger Day of Prayer is an occasion when all congregations come together to pray for the Village of Steger, its residents, schools, leadership, etc. Ms. Streck thanked Public Works for delivery of picnic tables and trash cans for the event. Ms. Streck also reported on a very beautiful ceremony at the Park of Hope. She expressed gratitude to the Village for the donation of the land for the park. She encouraged those who have not seen the park to do so.

Jason Stevenson of the Boy Scouts reported on the recent event held at Veterans Park. Over 200 Boy Scouts participated.

AN ORDINANCE CORRECTING CERTAIN SCRIVENER'S ERRORS FOR THE VILLAGE OF STEGER, ILLINOIS.

WHEREAS, the Village of Steger, Counties of Cook and Will, State of Illinois (the "Village") is a duly organized and existing municipality and unit of local government created under the provisions of the laws of the State of Illinois, and is operating under the provisions of the Illinois Municipal Code, and all laws amendatory thereof and supplementary thereto, with full powers to enact ordinances and adopt resolutions for the benefit of the residents of the Village; and

WHEREAS, on June 5, 2017, the Board of Trustees of the Village (the "Village Board") passed and adopted Ordinance No. 1154, entitled, "An Ordinance Amending Chapter 2, Section 2-482 of the Municipal Code of Steger, Illinois Regarding the Combined Planning and Zoning Board of Appeals for the Village of Steger, Illinois (the "Code Amendment Ordinance"), a copy of which is attached hereto as Exhibit A; and

WHEREAS, on June 5, 2017, the Village Board passed and adopted Ordinance No. 1155, entitled, "Ordinance Establishing Prevailing Wages for the Village of Steger (the "Prevailing Wage Ordinance" and together with the Code Amendment Ordinance, the "Ordinances"), a copy of which is attached hereto as Exhibit B; and

WHEREAS, it is necessary and desirable to correct certain scrivener's errors in the Ordinances, as the Ordinances were incorrectly numbered; and

WHEREAS, the correction of said scrivener's errors will not alter the purpose and intent of the Ordinances; and

WHEREAS, the Code Amendment Ordinance is hereby re-numbered to Ordinance No. 1159; and

WHEREAS, the Prevailing Wage Ordinance is hereby re-numbered to Ordinance No. 1160; and

WHEREAS, the Village President (the "Village President") and the Village Board (the Village Board and together with the Village President, the "Corporate Authorities") hereby determine that the re-numbering of the Ordinances is in the best interests of the Village;

**ARTICLE I.

The Corporate Authorities hereby find that all of the recitals hereinbefore stated as contained in the preambles to this Ordinance are full, true and correct and do hereby, by reference, incorporate and make them part of this Ordinance as legislative findings.

SECTION 2.0: Purpose.

The purpose of this Ordinance is to correct certain scrivener's errors in the numbering of the Ordinances and to authorize the Village President or his designee to take all steps necessary to carry out the terms of this Ordinance and to ratify any steps taken to effectuate those goals.

**ARTICLE II.
AUTHORIZATION**

SECTION 3.0: Authorization.

The scrivener's error in the Code Amendment Ordinance is hereby corrected and the Code Amendment Ordinance shall be re-numbered to Ordinance No. 1159. The scrivener's error in the Prevailing Wage Ordinance is hereby corrected and the Prevailing Wage Ordinance shall be re-numbered to Ordinance No. 1160. The Village Board further authorizes the Village President or his designee to execute any and all additional documentation that may be necessary to carry out the intent of this Ordinance. The Village Clerk is hereby authorized and directed to attest to and countersign any documentation as may be necessary to carry out and effectuate the purpose of this Ordinance. WHEREAS, Section 11-12-4 of the Illinois Municipal Code (65 ILCS 5/11-12-4) provides that a plan commission shall consist of a chairman and members serving for such terms as the corporate authorities of the municipality may prescribe by ordinance; and

WHEREAS, the Village President (the "Village President"), and the Board of Trustees (the "Village Board" and together with the Village President, the "Corporate Authorities"), are committed to ensuring the effective administration of government and to ensuring that the Village's land use regulations adequately provide for the health, safety, welfare and prosperity of the Village's residents and businesses; and

ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING PREVAILING WAGES
FOR THE VILLAGE OF STEGER.

WHEREAS, the Village of Steger, Counties of Cook and Will, State of Illinois (the "Village") is a duly organized and existing municipality and unit of local government created under the provisions of the laws of the State of Illinois, and is operating under the provisions of the Illinois Municipal Code, and all laws amendatory thereof and supplementary thereto, with full powers to enact ordinances and adopt resolutions for the benefit of the residents of the Village; and

WHEREAS, the State of Illinois has enacted the Prevailing Wage Act (820 ILCS 130/0.01, *et seq.*) (the "Act"), which regulates the wages of laborers, mechanics and other workers employed in any public works by the state, county, city, or any public body or political subdivision or by anyone under contract for public works; and

WHEREAS, the Act requires that the Village investigate and ascertain the prevailing rate of wages as defined in the Act for laborers, mechanics and other workers in the locality of the Village employed in performing the construction of any public works for the Village; and

WHEREAS, the Illinois Department of Labor's ("IDOL") most current prevailing wage rates were issued effective June 5, 2017; and

WHEREAS, in order to provide adequate notice to workers in the Village, the Village President (the "President") and Board of Trustees of the Village (the "Village Board" and together with the President, the "Corporate Authorities") have determined that it is in the best interests of the Village to adopt the revised prevailing rates of wages for

the construction of public works projects for the Village (collectively, the "Determination") as set forth on Exhibit A, attached hereto and incorporated herein;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the President and Board of Trustees of the Village of Steger, Counties of Cook and Will and State of Illinois as follows:

SECTION 1: To the extent and as required by the Act, the general prevailing rate of wages in the locality of the Village for laborers, mechanics and other workers engaged in the construction of public works coming under the jurisdiction of the Village is hereby ascertained to be the same as the prevailing rate of wages for construction work in Cook and Will Counties, as applicable, as determined by IDOL as of June 2017, a copy of the Determination being attached hereto and incorporated herein as Exhibit A. As required by the Act, any and all revisions of the prevailing rate of wages by the Department shall supersede the Department's June determination and apply to any and all public works construction undertaken by the Village. The definition of any terms appearing in this Ordinance that are also used in the Act shall be the same as in the Act.

SECTION 2: Nothing herein contained shall be construed to apply said general prevailing rate of wages as herein ascertained to any work or employment except public works construction of the Village to the extent required by the Act.

SECTION 3: The Village Clerk shall publicly post or keep available for inspection by any interested party in the main office of the Village the Determination or any revisions of such prevailing rate of wage. A copy of the Determination or of the current revised determination of prevailing rate of wages then in effect shall be attached to all contract specifications to the extent required by the Act.

SECTION 4: The Village Clerk shall mail a copy of the Determination to any employer, and to any association of employers and to any person or association of employees who have filed their names and addresses, requesting copies of any

determination stating the particular rates and the particular class of workers whose rates will be affected by such rates.

SECTION 5: The Village Clerk shall promptly (and in no event later than July 15, 2017) file a certified copy of this Ordinance with the Department and shall, with thirty (30) calendar days after such filing, publish in a newspaper of general circulation within the Village a notice that the Determination is effective.

SECTION 6: The Village Clerk shall cause to be published this Ordinance in pamphlet form.

WHEREAS, with the foregoing in mind, the Corporate Authorities have determined that it is necessary, advisable and in the best interests of the Village and its residents to amend Chapter 2, Section 2-482 of the Village Code as set forth herein;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the President and the Board of Trustees of the Village of Steger, Counties of Cook and Will, and the State of Illinois, as follows:

**ARTICLE I.

SECTION 6.0: Superseder.

All code provisions, ordinances, resolutions, rules and orders, or parts thereof, in conflict herewith are, to the extent of such conflict, hereby superseded.

SECTION 7.0: Publication.

A full, true and complete copy of this Ordinance shall be published in pamphlet form or in a newspaper published and of general circulation within the Village as provided by the Illinois Municipal Code, as amended.

SECTION 8.0: Effective Date.

This Ordinance shall be effective immediately after its passage, approval and publication in accordance with applicable law.

WHEREAS, the Village of Steger, Counties of Cook and Will, State of Illinois (the "Village") is a duly organized and existing municipality and unit of local government created under the provisions of the laws of the State of Illinois, and is operating under the provisions of the Illinois Municipal Code, and all laws amendatory thereof and supplementary thereto, with full powers to enact ordinances and adopt resolutions for the benefit of the residents of the Village; and

WHEREAS, the State of Illinois has enacted the Prevailing Wage Act (820 ILCS 130/0.01, *et seq.*) (the "Act"), which regulates the wages of laborers, mechanics and other workers employed in any public works by the state, county, city, or any public body or political subdivision or by anyone under contract for public works; and

WHEREAS, the Act requires that the Village investigate and ascertain the prevailing rate of wages as defined in the Act for laborers, mechanics and other workers in the locality of the Village employed in performing the construction of any public works for the Village; and

WHEREAS, the Illinois Department of Labor's ("IDOL") most current prevailing wage rates were issued effective June 5, 2017; and

WHEREAS, in order to provide adequate notice to workers in the Village, the Village President (the "President") and Board of Trustees of the Village (the "Village Board" and together with the President, the "Corporate Authorities") have determined that it is in the best interests of the Village to adopt the revised prevailing rates of wages for the construction of public works projects for the Village (collectively, the "Determination") as set forth on Exhibit A, attached hereto and incorporated herein;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the President and Board of Trustees of the Village of Steger, Counties of Cook and Will and State of Illinois as follows:

SECTION 1: To the extent and as required by the Act, the general prevailing rate of wages in the locality of the Village for laborers, mechanics and other workers engaged in the construction of public works coming under the jurisdiction of the Village is hereby ascertained to be the same as the prevailing rate of wages for construction work in Cook and Will Counties, as applicable, as determined by IDOL as of June 2017, a copy of the Determination being attached hereto and incorporated herein as Exhibit A. As required by the Act, any and all revisions of the prevailing rate of wages by the Department shall supersede the Department's June determination and apply to any and all public works construction undertaken by the Village. The definition of any terms appearing in this Ordinance that are also used in the Act shall be the same as in the Act.

SECTION 2: Nothing herein contained shall be construed to apply said general prevailing rate of wages as herein ascertained to any work or employment except public works construction of the Village to the extent required by the Act.

SECTION 3: The Village Clerk shall publicly post or keep available for inspection by any interested party in the main office of the Village the Determination or any revisions of such prevailing rate of wage. A copy of the Determination or of the current revised determination of prevailing rate of wages then in effect shall be attached to all contract specifications to the extent required by the Act.

SECTION 4: The Village Clerk shall mail a copy of the Determination to any employer, and to any association of employers and to any person or association of employees who have filed their names and addresses, requesting copies of any determination stating the particular rates and the particular class of workers whose rates will be affected by such rates.

SECTION 5: The Village Clerk shall promptly (and in no event later than July 15, 2017) file a certified copy of this Ordinance with the Department and shall, with thirty (30)

calendar days after such filing, publish in a newspaper of general circulation within the Village a notice that the Determination is effective.

SECTION 6: The Village Clerk shall cause to be published this Ordinance in pamphlet form.

WHEREAS, the Act requires that the Village investigate and ascertain the prevailing rate of wages as defined in the Act for laborers, mechanics and other workers in the locality of the Village employed in performing the construction of any public works for the Village; and

WHEREAS, the Illinois Department of Labor's ("IDOL") most current prevailing wage rates were issued effective June 5, 2017; and

A copy of the Determination or of the current revised determination of prevailing rate of wages then in effect shall be attached to all contract specifications to the extent required by the Act.

SECTION 4: The Village Clerk shall mail a copy of the Determination to any employer, and to any association of employers and to any person or association of employees who have filed their names and addresses, requesting copies of any

Section 3.0: Amendment to Chapter 22, Section 22-2.

That the Municipal Code of Steger, Illinois is hereby amended, notwithstanding any provision, ordinance, resolution or Village Code section to the contrary, by amending Chapter 22, Section 22-2 as follows:

Sec. 22-2. –Minimum Hourly Wages and Paid Sick Leave.

(a) Employers located within the Village shall comply with all applicable federal and/or State laws and regulations as such laws and regulations may exist from time to time with regard to both the payment of minimum hourly wages and paid sick leave. Employee eligibility for paid sick leave and minimum hourly wages shall also be in compliance with all applicable federal and/or State laws and regulations as such laws and regulations may exist from time to time.

(b) No additional obligations with regard to paid sick leave, or minimum hourly wages, including, without limitation, any additional obligations by ordinance adopted by the County of Cook Board of Commissioners, shall apply to employers located within the Village, except those required by federal and/or State laws and regulations as such laws and regulations may exist from time to time.

(c) For the purposes of this Section, the term "employee" means an individual permitted to work by an employer regardless of the number of persons the employer employs, and the term "employer" means any person employing one or more employees, or seeking to employ one or more employees, if the person has its principal place of business within the Village or does business within the Village.

(d) For the purposes of this Section, the term "employer" does not mean:

1. the government of the United States or a corporation wholly owned by the government of the United States;
2. a Native American tribe or a corporation wholly owned by a Native American tribe;
3. the government of the State or any agency or department thereof;
or
4. the government of any municipality.

SECTION 3.1: Other Actions Authorized.

The officers, employees and/or agents of the Village shall take all action necessary or reasonably required to carry out, give effect to and consummate the amendment contemplated by this Ordinance and shall take all action necessary in conformity therewith. The officers, employees and/or agents of the Village are specifically authorized and directed to draft and disseminate any and all necessary forms or notices to be utilized in connection with the intent of this Ordinance. This Ordinance is a declaration of existing law and policy of the Village.
