THE ANNUAL TAX LEVY ORDINANCE OF THE VILLAGE OF STEGER, COOK COUNTY AND WILL COUNTY, ILLINOIS FOR THE FISCAL YEAR BEGINNING JANUARY 1, 2017 AND ENDING DECEMBER 31, 2017

ORDINANCE NUMBER 1181 THE ANNUAL TAX LEVY ORDINANCE OF THE VILLAGE OF STEGER, COOK COUNTY AND WILL COUNTY, ILLINOIS FOR THE FISCAL YEAR BEGINNING JANUARY 1, 2017 AND ENDING DECEMBER 31, 2017

WHEREAS, the Village of Steger, Cook County and Will County, Illinois (the "Village") is a duly organized and existing municipal corporation created under the provisions of the laws of the State of Illinois and under the provisions of the Illinois Municipal Code, as from time to time supplemented and amended.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the President and Board of Trustees of the Village of Steger, Cook County and Will County, Illinois, as follows:

- **Section 1**. That the above recital is found to be true and correct and is hereby incorporated herein and made a part hereof, as if fully set forth in its entirety.
- Section 2. This Ordinance is and shall be designated as "The Annual Tax Levy Ordinance of the Village of Steger, Cook County and Will County, Illinois for the Fiscal Year beginning January 1, 2017 and ending December 31, 2017."
- **Section 3**. The total amount of appropriations for all corporate purposes, legally made to be collected from the property tax levy of the current year is ascertained to be the sum of \$2,119,500.00.
- **Section 4.** The purpose of which appropriations are made and the amount appropriated for each purpose, respectively, to be collected for the Tax Levy of the current year are, as follows (see attached insert):

- Section 5. There is hereby certified to the County Clerk of Cook County and the County Clerk of Will County, Illinois, the several sums aforesaid, constituting the total amount of \$2,119,500.00, which said total amount the Village of Steger, Cook County and Will County, Illinois requires to be raised by taxation for the current municipal fiscal year January 1, 2017 to December 31, 2017 of said Village, and the Village Clerk is hereby directed to file within the time required by law, a certified copy of this Ordinance and also to certify within said mentioned time to said County Clerk the total amount required to be raised by taxation; as aforesaid, in accordance with the provision of the revenue laws of the State of Illinois.
- **Section 6**. If any section, paragraph, clause or provision of this Ordinance shall be held invalid, the invalidity thereof shall not affect any other provision of this Ordinance.
- **Section 7**. All ordinances, resolutions, motions or orders in conflict with this Ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict.
- **Section 8**. This Ordinance is declared to be urgent and necessary for the immediate preservation of public peace, health and safety of the general public and shall, therefore, take effect and be in full force immediately upon its passage and approval by the Village President.

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING AND APPROVING THE DISPOSAL OF PERSONAL PROPERTY FOR THE VILLAGE OF STEGER.

WHEREAS, the Village of Steger, Counties of Cook and Will, State of Illinois (the "Village") is a duly organized and existing municipality and unit of local government created under the provisions of the laws of the State of Illinois, and is operating under the provisions of the Illinois Municipal Code, and all laws amendatory thereof and supplementary thereto, with full powers to enact ordinances and adopt resolutions for the benefit of the residents of the Village; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 11-76-4 of the Illinois Municipal Code (65 ILCS 5/11-76-4), whenever a municipality that owns any personal property, which in the opinion of a simple majority of the corporate authorities then holding office, is no longer necessary or useful to, or for the best interests of the city or village, such a majority of the corporate authorities then holding office: (1) by ordinance may authorize the sale of that personal property in such manner as they may designate, with or without advertising the sale; or (2) may authorize any municipal officer to convert that personal property into some other form that is useful to the municipality by using the material in the personal property; or (3) may authorize any municipal officer to convey or turn in any specified article of personal property as part payment on a new purchase of any similar article; and

WHEREAS, the Village Administrator has provided a recommendation to the Corporate Authorities (as defined below) that it is necessary and advisable to dispose of certain chattel (the "Personal Property"), as set forth in certain documents (the "Documents"), attached hereto and incorporated herein as Group Exhibit A; and

WHEREAS, the Village President (the "President") and the Board of Trustees of the

Village (the "Village Board" and with the President, the "Corporate Authorities") have reviewed the Documents and have determined that retaining the Personal Property, which is obsolete, no longer usable or repairable or is surplus property or rubbish, is no longer necessary or useful to, or for the best interests of the Village; and

WHEREAS, to ensure that the Village operates in an efficient and economical manner, it is necessary for the Village and Village employees to have adequate space, functional equipment and personal property; and

WHEREAS, based on the foregoing, the Corporate Authorities find that it is necessary for conducting Village business, the effective administration of government and in the best interests of the Village and its residents to authorize the Village Administrator to sell the Personal Property on such terms as the Village Administrator determines to be in the best interests of the Village;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the President and the Board of Trustees of the Village of Steger, Counties of Cook and Will, and the State of Illinois, as follows:

ARTICLE I. IN GENERAL

SECTION 1.0: Incorporation Clause.

The Corporate Authorities hereby find that all of the recitals hereinbefore stated as contained in the preambles to this Ordinance are full, true and correct and do hereby, by reference, incorporate and make them part of this Ordinance as legislative findings.

SECTION 2.0: Purpose.

The purpose of this Ordinance is to authorize the Village Administrator to sell the Personal Property to help ensure that the Village and Village employees have adequate space, functional equipment and personal property and to take all necessary steps to effectuate the intent of this Ordinance.

ARTICLE II. AUTHORIZATION

SECTION 3.0: Authorization.

That the Village Board hereby authorizes and directs the Village Administrator to sell the Personal Property on such terms as the Village Administrator determines to be in the best interests of the Village and ratifies any and all previous action taken to effectuate the intent of this Ordinance. The Village Board authorizes and directs the President or his designee to execute any and all documentation that may be necessary to carry out the intent of this Ordinance. The Village Clerk is hereby authorized and directed to attest to and countersign any documentation as may be necessary to carry out and effectuate the purpose of this Ordinance. The Village Clerk is also authorized and directed to affix the Seal of the Village to such documentation as is deemed necessary.

ARTICLE III. HEADINGS, SAVINGS CLAUSES, PUBLICATION, EFFECTIVE DATE

SECTION 4.0: Headings.

The headings of the articles, sections, paragraphs and subparagraphs of this Ordinance are inserted solely for convenience of reference and form no substantive part of this Ordinance nor should they be used in any interpretation or construction of any substantive provision of this Ordinance.

SECTION 5.0: Severability.

The provisions of this Ordinance are hereby declared to be severable and should any provision of this Ordinance be determined to be in conflict with any law, statute or regulation by a court of competent jurisdiction, said provision shall be excluded and deemed inoperative, unenforceable and as though not provided for herein, and all other provisions shall remain unaffected, unimpaired, valid, and in full force and effect.

SECTION 6.0: Superseder.

All code provisions, ordinances, resolutions, rules and orders, or parts thereof, in conflict herewith are, to the extent of such conflict, hereby superseded.

SECTION 7.0: Publication.

A full, true and complete copy of this Ordinance shall be published in pamphlet form or in a newspaper published and of general circulation within the Village as provided by the Illinois Municipal Code, as amended.

SECTION 8.0: Effective Date.







WHEREAS, the Village of Steger, Counties of Cook and Will, State of Illinois (the "Village") is a duly organized and existing municipality and unit of local government created under the provisions of the laws of the State of Illinois, and is operating under the provisions of the Illinois Municipal Code, and all laws amendatory thereof and supplementary thereto, with full powers to enact ordinances and adopt resolutions for the benefit of the residents of the Village; and

WHEREAS, the Village President (the "Village President"), and the Board of Trustees (the "Village Board" and together with the Village President, the "Corporate Authorities"), are committed to ensuring the effective administration of government; and

WHEREAS, Sec. 11-5-2 of the Illinois Municipal Code provides that the corporate authorities of each municipality may prevent trespasses in any public or private place; and

WHEREAS, Chapter 58 of the Municipal Code of Steger, Illinois (the "Village Code") provides for regulations regarding certain offenses (the "Existing Regulations"); and

WHEREAS, the Corporate Authorities desire to amend the Village Code to update the Existing Regulations by adding a section regarding criminal trespass to property; and

WHEREAS, with the foregoing in mind, the Corporate Authorities have determined that it is necessary, advisable and in the best interests of the Village and its residents to amend Chapter 58 of the Village Code as set forth herein;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the President and the Board of Trustees of the Village of Steger, Counties of Cook and Will, and the State of Illinois, as follows:

ARTICLE I. IN GENERAL

SECTION 1.0: Incorporation Clause.

The Corporate Authorities hereby find that all of the recitals hereinbefore stated as contained in the preambles to this Ordinance are full, true and correct and do hereby, by reference, incorporate and make them part of this Ordinance as legislative findings.

SECTION 2.0: Purpose.

The purpose of this Ordinance is to amend Chapter 58 of the Village Code to add a section regarding criminal trespass to property.

ARTICLE II. AUTHORIZATION; AMENDMENT TO CHAPTER 58 OF THE MUNICIPAL CODE OF STEGER, ILLINOIS

SECTION 3.0: Amendment to Chapter 58.

That the Municipal Code of Steger, Illinois is hereby amended, notwithstanding any provision, ordinance, resolution or Village Code section to the contrary, by amending Chapter 58 as follows:

Sec. 58-16.1 Criminal Trespass.

- (a) A person commits the illegal act of criminal trespass to land when he or she:
 - Knowingly and without lawful authority enters or remains within or on a building; or

- 2) Enters upon the land of another, after receiving notice from the owner or occupant prior to entry that such entry is forbidden; or
- Remains upon the land of another, after receiving notice from the owner or occupants to depart; or
- 4) Presents false documents or falsely represents his or her identity orally to the owner or occupants of a building or land in order to obtain permission from the owner or occupants to enter or remain in the building or on the land.
- (b) A person commits the act of criminal trespass to public property when he or she knowingly:
 - 1) Enters upon real property owned or leased by the Village, Will or Cook
 County, the United States of America or any unit of local government,
 school district or community college district with the power to levy taxes
 or any entity that is a subdivision thereof, enters any building on such
 land, after receiving notice from the State or its representative, prior to
 entry, that such entry is forbidden or remains upon such land or in such
 building after receiving notice from the State or its representative to
 depart, and who thereby interferes with another person's lawful use or
 enjoyment of such building or land. A person has received notice from
 the State within the meaning of subsection (1) if he has been notified
 personally, either orally or in writing, or if a printed or written notice
 forbidding such entry to him or a group of which he is a part, has been
 conspicuously posted or exhibited at the main entrance to such land or
 the forbidden part thereof;
 - Enters upon real property owned or leased by the Village, Will or Cook
 County, the United States of America or any unit of local government,

school district or community college district with the power to levy taxes or any entity that is a subdivision thereof or enters any building on such land by presenting false documents or falsely represents his or her identity orally to the State or its representatives in order to obtain permission from the State or its representatives to enter or remain upon such land or in such building, and who thereby interferes with another person's lawful use or enjoyment of such building or land.

Sec. 58-16.2 Penalty.

(a) Penalty: A person found in violation of the provisions of Section 58-16.1 shall be subject to a fine not less than twenty-five dollars (\$25.00), nor more than seven hundred fifty dollars (\$750.00).

SECTION 3.1: Other Actions Authorized.

The officers, employees and/or agents of the Village shall take all action necessary or reasonably required to carry out, give effect to and consummate the amendment contemplated by this Ordinance and shall take all action necessary in conformity therewith. The officers, employees and/or agents of the Village are specifically authorized and directed to draft and disseminate any and all necessary forms or notices to be utilized in connection with the intent of this Ordinance.

ARTICLE III. HEADINGS, SAVINGS CLAUSES, PUBLICATION, EFFECTIVE DATE

SECTION 4.0: Headings.

The headings of the articles, sections, paragraphs and subparagraphs of this Ordinance are inserted solely for convenience of reference and form no substantive part of this Ordinance nor should they be used in any interpretation or construction of any substantive provision of this Ordinance.

SECTION 5.0: Severability.

The provisions of this Ordinance are hereby declared to be severable and should any provision of this Ordinance be determined to be in conflict with any law, statute or regulation by a court of competent jurisdiction, said provision shall be excluded and deemed inoperative, unenforceable and as though not provided for herein, and all other provisions shall remain unaffected, unimpaired, valid and in full force and effect.

SECTION 6.0: Superseder.

All code provisions, ordinances, resolutions, rules and orders, or parts thereof, in conflict herewith are, to the extent of such conflict, hereby superseded.

SECTION 7.0: Publication.

A full, true and complete copy of this Ordinance shall be published in pamphlet form or in a newspaper published and of general circulation within the Village as provided by the Illinois Municipal Code, as amended.

SECTION 8.0: Effective Date.

This Ordinance shall be effective January 1, 2018 subject to its passage, approval and publication in accordance with applicable law.

WHEREAS, the Village President (the "Village President"), and the Board of Trustees (the "Village Board" and together with the Village President, the "Corporate Authorities"), are committed to ensuring the effective administration of government; and

WHEREAS, Section 11-5-2 of the Illinois Municipal Code, 65 ILCS 5/11-5-2 provides that the corporate authorities of each municipality may prevent or suppress riots, routs, affrays, noises, disturbances, trespasses, and disorderly assemblies in any public or private place; and

WHEREAS, Section 11-5-3 of the Illinois Municipal Code, 65 ILCS 5/11-5-3, provides that the corporate authorities of each municipality may prevent intoxication, fighting, quarreling, dog fights, cock fights, and all other disorderly conduct; and

WHEREAS, Chapter 58 of the Municipal Code of Steger, Illinois (the "Village Code") provides for regulations regarding certain offenses (the "Existing Regulations"); and

WHEREAS, the Corporate Authorities desire to amend the Village Code to update the Existing Regulations by adding a section regarding breaches of the peace; and

WHEREAS, with the foregoing in mind, the Corporate Authorities have determined that it is necessary, advisable and in the best interests of the Village and its residents to amend Chapter 58 of the Village Code as set forth herein;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the President and the Board of Trustees of the Village of Steger, Counties of Cook and Will, and the State of Illinois, as follows:

ARTICLE II. AUTHORIZATION; AMENDMENT TO CHAPTER 58 OF THE MUNICIPAL CODE OF STEGER, ILLINOIS

SECTION 3.0: Amendment to Chapter 58.

That the Municipal Code of Steger, Illinois is hereby amended, notwithstanding any provision, ordinance, resolution or Village Code section to the contrary, by amending Chapter 58 as follows:

Sec. 58-17 Fighting, Noise, Riot and Other Breaches of Peace

a) No person shall:

- 1) Engage in, cause or provoke any fight, brawl or riotous conduct;
- 2) Make, aid, countenance or assist in making, any improper noise, riot, disturbance, diversion, or other breach of the peace, or use threatening, abusive or profane language or obscene gestures toward any person, leading to a breach of the peace, in the streets or elsewhere in the Village;
- Unnecessarily jostle or aggressively crowd another person in any public place within the Village, including on school grounds.

SECTION 3.1: Other Actions Authorized.

The officers, employees and/or agents of the Village shall take all action necessary or reasonably required to carry out, give effect to and consummate the amendment contemplated by this Ordinance and shall take all action necessary in conformity therewith. The officers, employees and/or agents of the Village are specifically authorized and directed to draft and disseminate any and all necessary forms or notices to be utilized in connection with the intent of this Ordinance.

ARTICLE III. HEADINGS, SAVINGS CLAUSES, PUBLICATION, EFFECTIVE DATE

SECTION 4.0: Headings.

The headings of the articles, sections, paragraphs and subparagraphs of this Ordinance are inserted solely for convenience of reference and form no substantive part of this Ordinance nor should they be used in any interpretation or construction of any substantive provision of this Ordinance.

SECTION 5.0: Severability.

The provisions of this Ordinance are hereby declared to be severable and should any provision of this Ordinance be determined to be in conflict with any law, statute or regulation by a court of competent jurisdiction, said provision shall be excluded and deemed inoperative, unenforceable and as though not provided for herein, and all other provisions shall remain unaffected, unimpaired, valid and in full force and effect.

SECTION 6.0: Superseder.

All code provisions, ordinances, resolutions, rules and orders, or parts thereof, in conflict herewith are, to the extent of such conflict, hereby superseded.

SECTION 7.0: Publication.

A full, true and complete copy of this Ordinance shall be published in pamphlet form or in a newspaper published and of general circulation within the Village as provided by the Illinois Municipal Code, as amended.

SECTION 8.0: Effective Date.

This Ordinance shall be effective January 1, 2018 subject to its passage, approval and publication in accordance with applicable law.

ORDINANCE No. 1185

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF GENERAL OBLIGATION BONDS (ALTERNATE REVENUE SOURCE) OF THE VILLAGE OF STEGER, COOK AND WILL COUNTIES, ILLINOIS, IN AN AGGREGATE PRINCIPAL AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED \$3,500,000.

WHEREAS, the Village of Steger, Cook and Will Counties, Illinois (the "Village"), is a duly organized and existing municipality operating under the provisions of the Illinois Municipal Code, as amended, and under the laws of the State of Illinois; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Trustees of the Village (the "Board") has determined that it is advisable, necessary and in the best interests of the Village (i) to pay the cost of the construction of a police station and other capital improvements throughout the Village in accordance with the plans and specifications therefor and on file with the Village Clerk (the "Project"), (ii) to pay capitalize interest, if any, and (iii) to pay costs of issuance and expenses incident thereto, all for the benefit of the inhabitants of the Village; and

WHEREAS, the estimated cost of the Project, including engineering, legal, financial, bond discount, printing and publication costs, capitalized interest, and other expenses is \$3,500,000; and there are insufficient funds on hand and lawfully available to pay such costs; and

WHEREAS, such costs are expected to be paid for from proceeds of alternate bonds authorized to be issued at this time pursuant to the Local Government Debt Reform Act of the State of Illinois, as amended (the "Act"); and

WHEREAS, it is necessary and in the best interest of the Village that the Village proceed with the Project, and in order to raise the funds required therefor it will be necessary for the Village to borrow an amount not to exceed \$3,500,000, and in evidence thereof to issue alternate bonds in an aggregate principal amount not to exceed \$3,500,000, all in accordance with the Act; and

WHEREAS, the Village has previously adopted, approved and created a redevelopment project area known as the Chicago Road Redevelopment Project Area (the "Chicago Road TIF"); and

WHEREAS, the Village has determined that the Project and debt service on any obligations issued to finance such Project are "redevelopment project costs" within the meaning of Section 8 of the Tax Increment Allocation Redevelopment Act and properly payable from the tax allocation funds generated in the Chicago Road TIF;

WHEREAS, the revenue sources that will be pledged to the payment of the principal and interest on the alternate bonds will be (i) certain sales tax revenues received by the Village, and (ii) such other funds of the Village as may be lawfully available and annually appropriated for such payment; and

WHEREAS, if the above-mentioned revenue sources are insufficient to pay said alternate bonds, ad valorem property taxes upon all taxable property in the Village without limitation as to rate or amount are authorized to be extended to pay the principal of and interest on said alternate bonds;

Now, Therefore, Be It Ordained by the President and Board of Trustees of the Village of Steger, Cook and Will Counties, Illinois, as follows:

Section 1. <u>Incorporation of Preambles</u>. The Board hereby finds that all of the recitals contained in the preambles to this ordinance are full, true and correct and does incorporate them into this ordinance by this reference.

Section 2. <u>Determination to Issue Bonds</u>. It is necessary and in the best interest of the Village to proceed with the Project in accordance with the preliminary plans and estimate of cost as previously approved by the Board, and that for that purpose alternate bonds of the Village

are hereby authorized to be issued and sold from time to time in an aggregate amount of not to exceed \$3,500,000 to be known as "General Obligation Bonds (Alternate Revenue Source), Series 2018" (or similar designation as appropriate) (the "Bonds").

Section 3. <u>Publication</u>. This authorizing ordinance, together with a notice in the statutory form, shall be published in a newspaper of general circulation in the Village, and if no petition, signed by the greater of (i) 7.5% of the registered voters in the Village or (ii) 200 of those registered voters or 15% of those registered voters, whichever is less, (the notice published pursuant to this Section shall contain the specific number of voters required to sign a petition requesting that the issuance of the alternate bonds be submitted to referendum) asking that the issuance of the Bonds be submitted to referendum, is filed with the Village Clerk within thirty (30) days after the date of the publication of this authorizing ordinance and notice, then the Bonds shall be authorized to be issued.

Section 4. Additional Ordinances. If no petition meeting the requirements of applicable law is filed during the petition period referred to above, then the Board may adopt additional ordinances or proceedings supplementing or amending this ordinance providing for the issuance and sale of the Bonds and prescribing all the details of the Bonds, so long as the maximum amount of the Bonds as set forth in this ordinance is not exceeded and there is no material change in the Project as described herein. Such additional ordinances or proceedings shall in all instances become effective immediately without publication or posting or any further act or requirement. This authorizing ordinance, together with such additional ordinances or proceedings, shall constitute complete authority for the issuance of the Bonds under applicable law.

Section 5. <u>Severability</u>. If any section, paragraph or provision of this ordinance shall be held to be invalid or unenforceable for any reason, the invalidity or unenforceability of such section, paragraph or provision shall not affect any of the remaining provisions of this ordinance.

Section 6. <u>Conflicting Ordinances</u>. All ordinances, resolutions and parts thereof, in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

Section 7. <u>Effective Date</u>. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its adoption.
