AN ORDINANCE ABATING THE LEVY OF TAXES RELATED TO GENERAL OBLIGATION BONDS (ALTERNATIVE REVENUE SOURCE), SERIES 2018 FOR THE VILLAGE OF STEGER, COOK AND WILL COUNTIES, ILLINOIS.

WHEREAS, the Village of Steger, Counties of Cook and Will, State of Illinois (the "Village") is a duly organized and existing municipality and unit of local government created under the provisions of the laws of the State of Illinois, and is operating under the provisions of the Illinois Municipal Code, and all laws amendatory thereof and supplementary thereto, with full powers to enact ordinances and adopt resolutions for the benefit of the residents of the Village; and,

WHEREAS, on February 5, 2018, the Village President (the "President"), and the Board of Trustees of the Village (the "Village Board" and together with the President, the "Corporate Authorities") passed and approved an ordinance designated as Ordinance No. 1186 (the "Bond Ordinance"), which provided for the borrowing of money and the issuance of General Obligation Bonds (Alternative Revenue Source), Series 2018, in an amount not to exceed Three Million, Five Hundred Thousand and No/100 U.S. Dollars (\$3,500,000.00) (the "Series 2018 Bonds"); and

WHEREAS, acting pursuant to the Bond Ordinance, the President executed a bond order (the "Bond Order"), which provided certain terms for the Bonds; and

WHEREAS, the Bond Order provides for the levy of taxes in the Village's tax levy year 2018 sufficient to provide Two Hundred Twenty-Nine Thousand, Seven Hundred Twenty-Five and No/100 U.S. Dollars (\$229,725.00) for the purpose of paying the interest and/or principal on the Series 2018 Bonds; and

WHEREAS, since the Village has received documentation from the Paying Agent (as defined in the Bond Ordinance) certifying that funds are available to pay the principal of and/or interest on the Series 2018 Bonds and those funds are on deposit in the Bond Fund (as defined in the Bond Ordinance), created pursuant to the Bond Ordinance, the Corporate Authorities are required by the Bond Ordinance to cause the deposit of such amount into the Bond and Interest Account (as defined in the Bond Ordinance), created pursuant to the Bond Ordinance, to abate the levy described above and to cause proper notification of that abatement to be filed with the Office of the Cook County Clerk, Illinois; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the President and the Board of Trustees of the Village of Steger, Counties of Cook and Will, State of Illinois, as follows:

ARTICLE I. IN GENERAL

SECTION 1.0: Incorporation Clause.

The Corporate Authorities hereby find that all of the recitals hereinbefore stated as contained in the preambles to this Ordinance are full, true and correct and do hereby, by reference, incorporate and make them part of this Ordinance as legislative findings.

ARTICLE II. ABATEMENT

SECTION 2.0 Transfer of funds.

The sum of Two Hundred Twenty-Nine Thousand, Seven Hundred Twenty-Five and No/100 U.S. Dollars (\$229,725.00) has been or will be transferred pursuant to Section 7 of the Bond Ordinance to the Bond and Interest Account, created by the

Bond Ordinance, and shall be irrevocably pledged for the payment of the principal and/or interest due on the Series 2018 Bonds.

SECTION 3.0 Abatement.

There is hereby abated the of sum Two Hundred Twenty-Nine Thousand, Seven Hundred Twenty-Five and No/100 U.S. Dollars (\$229,725.00) of the levy of taxes for the Village's tax levy year 2018, being the levy appearing and set forth in the Bond Order. It is intended that this abatement shall apply to the entire amount scheduled to be levied for the Village's tax levy year 2018 pursuant to the terms of the Bond Order in connection with the Series 2018 Bonds.

SECTION 4.0 Direction to the Village Clerk.

Having received certificates or such other evidence as the Village Clerk deems necessary to determine that the transfer described in Section 3.0 of this Ordinance has been completed, the Village Clerk is directed to file, or cause the filing of a certified copy of this Ordinance with the Office of the Clerk of Cook County, Illinois and the Office of the Clerk of Will County, Illinois.

ARTICLE III. HEADINGS, SAVINGS CLAUSES, PUBLICATION, EFFECTIVE DATE

SECTION 5.0: Headings.

The headings of the articles, sections, paragraphs and subparagraphs of this Ordinance are inserted solely for convenience of reference and form no substantive part of this Ordinance nor should they be used in any interpretation or construction of any substantive provision of this Ordinance.

SECTION 6.0: Severability.

The provisions of this Ordinance are hereby declared to be severable and should any provision of this Ordinance be determined to be in conflict with any law, statute or regulation by a court of competent jurisdiction, said provision shall be

excluded and deemed inoperative, unenforceable and as though not provided for herein, and all other provisions shall remain unaffected, unimpaired, valid and in full force and effect.

SECTION 7.0: Superseder.

All code provisions, ordinances, resolutions, rules and orders, or parts thereof, in conflict herewith are, to the extent of such conflict, hereby superseded.

SECTION 8.0: Publication.

A full, true and complete copy of this Ordinance shall be published in pamphlet form or in a newspaper published and of general circulation within the Village as provided by the Illinois Municipal Code, as amended.

SECTION 9.0: Effective Date.

This Ordinance shall be effective immediately after its passage, approval and publication in accordance with applicable law.

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 10 OF THE MUNICIPAL CODE OF STEGER, ILLINOIS BY ADDING REGULATIONS REGARDING RAFFLES FOR THE VILLAGE OF STEGER, ILLINOIS.

WHEREAS, the Village of Steger, Counties of Cook and Will, State of Illinois (the "Village") is a duly organized and existing municipality and unit of local government created under the provisions of the laws of the State of Illinois, and is operating under the provisions of the Illinois Municipal Code, and all laws amendatory thereof and supplementary thereto, with full powers to enact ordinances and adopt resolutions for the benefit of the residents of the Village; and

WHEREAS, the Illinois Raffles and Poker Runs Act (230 ILCS 15/0.01 et. seq.) (the "Act") has established minimum standards which municipalities must impose in connection with an ordinance regulating raffles; and

WHEREAS, a municipality may regulate raffles within its corporate boundaries pursuant to the Act; and

WHEREAS, the Municipal Code of Steger, Illinois (the "Village Code") does not currently contain regulations regulating raffles within the corporate limits of the Village; and

WHEREAS, the President of the Village (the "President") and the Board of Trustees of the Village (the "Village Board" and together with the President, the "Corporate Authorities") have determined that it is necessary, advisable and in the best interests of the Village and its residents to amend the Village Code to include regulations regulating raffles; and

WHEREAS, the Corporate Authorities have determined that it is necessary, advisable and in the best interests of the Village and its residents to amend Chapter 10 of the Village Code as set forth herein;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the President and the Board of Trustees of the Village of Steger, Counties of Cook and Will, State of Illinois, as follows:

ARTICLE I. IN GENERAL

SECTION 1.0: Incorporation Clause.

The Corporate Authorities hereby find that all of the recitals hereinbefore stated as contained in the preambles to this Ordinance are full, true and correct and do hereby, by reference, incorporate and make them part of this Ordinance as legislative findings.

SECTION 2.0: Purpose.

The purpose of this Ordinance is to amend Chapter 10 of the Village Code to add regulations regarding raffles.

ARTICLE II. AUTHORIZATION; AMENDMENT TO CHAPTER 10 OF THE MUNICIPAL CODE OF STEGER, ILLINOIS

SECTION 3.0: Amendment to Chapter 10.

That Chapter 10 of the Municipal Code of Steger, Illinois is hereby amended, notwithstanding any provision, ordinance, resolution or Village Code section to the contrary, by adding Article IX entitled "Raffles" to read as follows:

Article IX. - Raffles.

Section 10-214. – Definitions.

The following words, terms and phrases, when used in this article, shall have the meanings ascribed to them in this section, except where the context clearly indicates a different meaning:

Business: A voluntary organization composed of individuals and businesses who have joined together to advance the commercial, financial, industrial and civil interest of a community.

Charitable: An organization or institution organized and operated to benefit an indefinite number of the public and is licensed by the state as charitable. The service rendered to those eligible for benefits must also confer some benefit on the public.

Educational: An organization or institution organized and operated to provide systematic instruction in useful branches of learning by methods common to schools and institutions of learning which compare favorably in their scope and intensity with the course of study presented in tax-supported schools.

Fraternal: An organization of persons having a common interest, the primary interest of which is to both promote the welfare of its members and to provide assistance to the general public in such a way as to lessen the burdens of government by caring for those that otherwise would be cared for by the government and is a local detachment of a state or national fraternal organization.

Labor: An organization composed of workers organized with the objective of betterment of the conditions of a higher degree of efficiency in their respective occupations.

Net proceeds: The gross receipts from the conduct of raffles, less reasonable sums expended for prizes, license fees, and other reasonable operating expenses incurred as a result of operating a raffle.

Non-profit: An organization or institution organized and conducted on a not-for profit basis with no personal profit inuring to anyone as a result of the operation and is licensed as such by the State of Illinois.

Raffle: Means a form of lottery, as defined in Section 28-2(b) of the Criminal Code of 2012, conducted by an organization licensed under this Act, in which:

- (1) The player pays or agrees to pay something of value for a chance, represented and differentiated by a number or by a combination of numbers or by some other medium, one or more of which chances is to be designated the winning chance;
- (2) The winning chance is to be determined through a drawing or by some other method based on an element of chance by an act or set of acts on the part of persons conducting or connected with the lottery,

except that the winning chance shall not be determined by the outcome of a publicly exhibited sporting contest.

Religious: Any church, congregation, society, or organization founded for the purposes of religious worship.

Veterans: An organization or association comprised of members of which substantially all are individuals who are veterans of military service, the primary purpose of which is to promote the welfare of its members and to provide assistance to the general public in such a way as to confer a public benefit.

Section 10-215. – License Required.

- (a) Except as provided herein, it shall be unlawful for any person to conduct or operate a raffle or a raffle event in the village, or to sell, offer for sale, convey, issue, or otherwise transfer for value a chance on a raffle, unless conducted pursuant to a license issued pursuant to and in accordance with the provisions of this article.
- (b) Raffles conducted by Political Committees licensed by the State Board of Elections pursuant to 230 ILCS 15/8.1 are exempt from the requirements of this article.
- (c) Raffles conducted by law enforcement agencies and statewide associations that represent law enforcement officials may conduct raffles within the village and are exempt from the requirements of this article.

Section 10-216. – Application.

- (a) Applications shall be made in writing through the village clerk's office at least twenty (20) days prior to the first day intended for the sale of the raffle chances. The application shall be on a form furnished by the village clerk.
- (b) Applications for license under this article must contain the following information:

Name of applicant;

A copy of applicant's not-for-profit articles of incorporation and/or charter;

Address:

Purpose of raffle;

Area within the village where the raffle is to be conducted:

Time period during which chances will be sold or issued;

Sworn statement attesting to not-for-profit character of the prospective licensee organization, signed by the presiding officer and secretary of the organization;

Date, time and location at which winning chances will be determined; The aggregate retail value of all the prizes or merchandise to be awarded by a single raffle;

The maximum to be charged for each raffle chance and the number of chances to be issued for each raffle; and

The name(s) and address(es) of the operator of the raffle if not an office or member of the applicant organization.

- (c) Validity of license. Each such license shall be valid for one (1) raffle or for a specified number of raffles during a specified period not to exceed one (1) year and may be suspended or revoked by the corporate authorities in the event of violation of the terms of this article or of any applicable state law.
- (d) *Ineligibility for license*. The following are ineligible for any license under this article:
 - (1) Any person whose felony conviction will impair the person's ability to engage in the licensed position. The village, upon a finding that an applicant for a license was previously convicted of a felony shall consider any evidence of rehabilitation and mitigating factors contained in the applicant's record, including any of the following factors and evidence, to determine if the conviction will impair the ability of the applicant to engage in the position for which a license is sought:
 - a. The lack of direct relation of the offense for which the applicant was previously convicted to the duties, functions, and responsibilities of the position for which a license is sought;
 - Whether five (5) years since a felony conviction or three (3)
 years since release from confinement for the conviction,
 whichever is later, have passed without a subsequent
 conviction;

- c. If the applicant was previously licensed or employed in this state or other states or jurisdictions, then the lack of prior misconduct arising from or related to the licensed position or position of employment;
- d. The age of the person at the time of the criminal offense;
- Successful completion of sentence and, for applicants serving a term of parole or probation, a progress report provided by the applicant's probation or parole officer that documents the applicant's compliance with conditions of supervision;
- f. Evidence of the applicant's present fitness and professional character;
- g. Evidence of rehabilitation or rehabilitative effort during or after incarceration, or during or after a term of supervision, including, but not limited to, a certificate of good conduct under section 5-5.5-25 of the Unified Code of Corrections or a certificate of relief from disabilities under section 5-5.5-10 of the Unified Code of Corrections; and
- Any other mitigating factors that contribute to the person's potential and current ability to perform the duties and responsibilities of the position for which a license or employment is sought;
- (2) Any person who is or has been a professional gambler or gambling promoter;
- (3) Any person who is not of good moral character;
- (4) Any firm or corporation in which a person defined in paragraph (1),(2) or (3) of this subsection has a proprietary, equitable or credit interest, or in which such person is active or employed;
- (5) Any firm or corporation in which a person defined in paragraph (1),(2) or (3) of this subsection is an officer, director, or employee, whether compensated or not;
- (6) Any organization in which a person defined in paragraph (1), (2) or (3) of this subsection is to participate in the management or operation of the raffle for which the license is being sought.

(e) Not-for-profit organizations. A raffle license shall be issued only to bona fide non-profit religious, charitable, labor, fraternal, educational or veterans' organizations as defined in section 10-214 which operate without profit to their members and which have been in existence continuously for a period of five (5) years immediately before making application for a license and which have had during that entire five (5) year period a bona fide membership engaged in carrying out their objectives, or to a non-profit fund raising organization that the licensing authority determines is organized of the sole purpose of providing financial assistance to the identified individual or group of individuals suffering extreme financial hardships as the results of an illness, disability accident or disaster.

(f) Limitations.

- (1) The aggregate retail value of all prizes or merchandise awarded by a licensee in a single raffle under this article and in accordance with applicable state law is limited to \$250,000.00.
- (2) The maximum retail value of each prize awarded by a licensee in a single raffle is limited to \$200,000.00.
- (3) The maximum price which may be charged for each raffle chance issued or sold is limited to \$100.00.
- (4) The maximum number of days during which chances may be issued or sold is limited to 120 days.
- (5) Licenses issued shall be valid for one raffle or for a specified number of raffles to be conducted during a specified period not to exceed one year and may be suspended or revoked for any violation of state statute or of this article.
- (g) Fees. The fee for a raffle license to conduct a raffle shall be \$20.00.
- (h) Approval. The village shall, within twenty (20) days, evaluate and either approve or disapprove of said application. The village's approval of an application for a license shall constitute the license for the conduct of the raffle applied for the applicant.

Section 10-217. - Conduct of raffles.

The conducting of raffles is subject to the Illinois Raffles Act requirements, and to the following restrictions:

- (a) *Proceeds.* The entire net proceeds of any raffle must be exclusively devoted to the lawful purpose of the organization permitted to conduct that game.
- (b) Participation in management. No person except a bona fide member of the sponsoring organization may participate in the management or operation of the raffle.
- (c) Remuneration. No person may receive any remuneration or profit for participating in the management or operation of the raffle.
- (d) Premises. A licensee may rent a premises on which to determine the winning chance or chances in a raffle only from an organization which is also licensed under this article.
- (e) *Locations*. Raffles chances may be sold or issued only within the area specified on the license and winning chances may be determined only at those locations specified on the license.
- (f) Age of participants. No person under the age of eighteen (18) years may participate in the conducting of raffles or chances or the purchase of chances. A person under the age of eighteen (18) years may be within the area where winning chances are being determined only when accompanied by his/her parent or guardian.

Section 10-218. - Records.

- (a) Each organization licensed to conduct raffles and chances shall keep records of its gross receipts, expenses and net proceeds for each single gathering or occasion at which winning chances in a raffle are determined. All deductions from gross receipts for each single gathering or occasion shall be documented with receipts or other records indicating the amount, a description of the purchased item or service or other reason for the deduction, and the recipient. The distribution of net proceeds shall be itemized as to payee, purpose, amount and date of payment.
- (b) Gross receipts from the operation of each single raffle shall be segregated from other revenues of the organization, including bingo receipts, if bingo games are also conducted by the same nonprofit organization pursuant to a license issued by the state department of revenue, and placed in a separate account. Each organization shall have separate records of each separate raffle. The person who accounts for gross receipts, expenses, and

- net proceeds from the operation of each raffle shall not be the same person who accounts for other revenues of the organization.
- (c) Each organization licensed to conduct a raffle under the provisions of this chapter shall report to its membership, and to the village, its gross receipts, expenses and net proceeds from each raffle and to the distribution of the net proceeds itemized as required in this section. Such report to the village shall be made within ten (10) business days after the conclusion of each raffle.
- (d) Each organization licensed to conduct raffles shall, for each and every raffle, keep records of the name and address of each person to whom a raffle chance has been sold or issued, and the number of raffle chances sold or issued to such person.
- (e) Each organization licensed to conduct raffles shall report monthly to its membership, and to the village, its gross receipts, expenses and net proceeds from raffles, and the distribution of net proceeds itemized as required in this section. Such reports shall be filed with the village clerk.
- (f) Each organization licensed to conduct raffles shall report monthly to its membership, and to the village, its gross receipts, expenses and net proceeds from raffles, and the distribution of net proceeds itemized as required in this section. Such reports shall be filed with the village clerk.
- (g) Records required by this section shall be kept for three (3) years and organizations shall make available their records relating to the operation of any raffle for public inspection at reasonable times and places.

Section 10-219. – Bond required.

All operation of and the conduct of raffles shall be under the supervision of a single raffles manager designated by the organization. The manager shall give a fidelity bond in the sum of \$50,000.00 or two (2) times the aggregate value of prizes, whichever is less, in favor of the license conditioned upon his or her honesty in the performance of his or her duties. The bond shall provide that notice shall be given in writing to the village not less than thirty (30) days prior to its cancellation. A bond(s) as provided for in this section may be waived by the village president, or designee, provided that the license issued for such raffle shall contain a waiver provision and shall only be granted after proof that the organization approved such waiver by unanimous vote of the members of the licensed organization.

Section 10-220. - Suspension/revocation.

Any license granted under this article may be suspended or revoked by the village at any time it appears that the proposed or actual operation of the raffle will be or is such as to constitute a public nuisance or to endanger the public peace, health, safety or welfare. Any license granted under this article may be suspended or revoked in whole or in part at any time that the raffle is conducted contrary to the license or to any state or village law, or when such raffle or portion thereof is conducted so as to constitute a public nuisance or to disturb the peace, health, safety or welfare. Suspension or revocation shall become effective immediately. It shall be a violation for any person to operate, engage or participate in except as a patron, any raffle which license has been suspended or revoked. The village administrator shall have the authority to suspend or revoke a license in accordance with this article; any license hold may appeal such decision to suspend or revoke if filed within thirty (30) days by requesting a hearing before the village board. Such hearing shall be conducted pursuant to public notice given by posting on the village website and at the village hall not less than forty-eight (48) hours prior to the hearing and said hearing shall be held within ten (10) days of the request for appeal.

Section 10-221. - Punishment.

Any raffle permit issued under this article shall be revoked or suspended if the permit holder violates any terms of the license or any other provisions of this article. Any violation of this article shall be subject to a fine up to \$750.00. Each day that a violation hereof exists shall be considered a separate offense. Each raffle held in violation hereof shall be considered a separate offense. The penalties provided for herein are exclusive of and in addition to any other remedies available to the village at law or in equity.

SECTION 3.1: Other Actions Authorized.

The officers, employees and/or agents of the Village shall take all action necessary or reasonably required to carry out, give effect to and consummate the amendment contemplated by this Ordinance and shall take all action necessary in conformity therewith. The officers, employees and/or agents of the Village are

specifically authorized and directed to draft and disseminate any and all necessary forms or notices to be utilized in connection with the intent of this Ordinance. This Ordinance is a declaration of existing law and policy of the Village.

ARTICLE III. HEADINGS, SAVINGS CLAUSES, PUBLICATION, EFFECTIVE DATE

SECTION 4.0: Headings.
