Fire Chief Nowell Fillion Thanked the Mayor, Administrator Seehausen, the board and the Police and EMA and all our departments for doing a great job helping each other out through all this. It has kept us all safe and to date we have no illness throughout our Village in these departments. So thank you all. We have transported three confirmed patients; we have transported four that are under investigation That is our total for transporting in our Village. Our PPE supplies are holding up well, thanks to Cook and Will Counties that have helped supply us. We so far have plenty of gowns, gloves, masks and caps. Firefighter Anderson is looking into a grant that will help with disinfectant equipment like foggers and PPE for the Village. Steger got a stimulus payment for EMS and I am working with Finance and Administrator to see how we want to move forward. It is money that is set aside specifically for COVID-19. Working with Village Administrator regarding hiring two new paramedics. Thank you for all your help.

Police Chief Patrick Rossi Echoed Chief Fillion's comments of thanks. We have received a lot of PPE from different sources as well as from the community. Cook and Will Counties have also provided needed supplies.

EMA Chief Tom Johnston Echoed reports from both Chief Fillion and Chief Rossi that we have all been working really well. We have been on patrol every week, so that hasn't changed. Communication has been maintained and all vehicles are being sterilized twice a week. Also want to remind residents that storm season is here and stay aware.

Since that time, water rates have been increased to make the Water Department self-sufficient. This resolution simplifies the corrections needed to pay the bills during 2016 and 2017.

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING AND APPROVING AN INTERGOVERNMENTAL AGREEMENT WITH CERTAIN MEMBERS OF MUTUAL AID BOX ALARM SYSTEM DIVISION 27 FOR THE VILLAGE OF STEGER, ILLINOIS.

WHEREAS, the Village of Steger, Counties of Cook and Will, State of Illinois (the "Village") is a duly organized and existing municipality and unit of local government created under the provisions of the laws of the State of Illinois, and is operating under the provisions of the Illinois Municipal Code, and all laws amendatory thereof and supplementary thereto, with full powers to enact ordinances and adopt resolutions for the benefit of the residents of the Village; and

WHEREAS, the Intergovernmental Cooperation Act (5 ILCS 220/1, et seq.) (the "Act") authorizes public agencies, which include units of local government and agencies of the government of the State of Illinois, to jointly enjoy and/or exercise powers, privileges, functions or authority with other public agencies, except where specifically and expressly prohibited by law; and

WHEREAS, the Village of Steger Fire Department is a member of Mutual Aid Box Alarm System Division 27 ("MABAS Division 27"); and

WHEREAS, the Village has been presented with a certain intergovernmental agreement by and between the following members of MABAS Division 27: Beecher Fire Protection District, Chicago Heights Fire Department, Crete Fire Department, Crete Township Fire Protection District, Ford Heights Fire Department, Frankfort Fire Protection District, Matteson Fire Department, Monee Fire Protection District, Park Forest Fire Department, Peotone Fire Protection District, Richton Park Fire Department, Sauk Village Fire Department, South Chicago Heights Fire Department,

Steger Fire Department, Steger Estates Fire Protection District, University Park Fire Department (collectively referred to as the "Parties"), a copy of which is attached hereto and incorporated herein as Exhibit A (the "Agreement"), which sets forth the terms and in which the Parties agree, based on need and availability, that each Party will attempt in good faith to lend the other Parties vehicles, assets, and/or equipment upon request by another Party, provided that the vehicles, assets, and/or equipment are available to be lent as determined by the lending Party in its sole discretion; and

WHEREAS, the Parties are units of local governments as defined in the Illinois Constitution and are public agencies pursuant to the Intergovernmental Cooperation Act; and

WHEREAS, the Parties recognize the need to cooperate in maintaining their concern for public safety; and

WHEREAS, the Parties, from time to time, find it necessary to borrow vehicles and other assets from one another during times of particular shortages in their respective equipment rosters; and

WHEREAS, based on the foregoing and in order to ensure the health, safety and welfare of the Village and its residents, the Village President (the "President") and the Board of Trustees of the Village (the "Village Board" and with the President, the "Corporate Authorities") have determined that it is advisable and in the best interests of the Village and its residents to enter into and approve an agreement with terms substantially the same as the terms of the Agreement; and

WHEREAS, the President is authorized to enter into and the Village Attorney (the "Attorney") is authorized to revise agreements for the Village making such insertions, omissions and changes as shall be approved by the President and the Attorney;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the President and the Board of Trustees of the Village of Steger, Counties of Cook and Will, and the State of Illinois, as follows:

ARTICLE I. IN GENERAL

SECTION 1: Incorporation Clause.

The Corporate Authorities hereby find that all of the recitals hereinbefore stated as contained in the preambles to this Ordinance are full, true and correct and do hereby, by reference, incorporate and make them part of this Ordinance as legislative findings.

SECTION 2: Purpose.

The purpose of this Ordinance is to authorize the President or his designee to enter into the Agreement and to further authorize the President or his designee to take all steps necessary to carry out the terms and intent of this Ordinance and to ratify any steps taken to effectuate those goals.

ARTICLE II. AUTHORIZATION

SECTION 3: Authorization.

That the Village Board approves the Agreement. The Village Board further authorizes and directs the President or his designee to enter into and approve the Agreement, or any modifications thereof, and to ratify any and all previous action taken to effectuate the intent of this Ordinance. The Village Board further authorizes and directs the President or his designee to execute the Agreement with such insertions, omissions and changes as shall be approved by the President and the Attorney. The Village Clerk is hereby authorized and directed to attest to and countersign the Agreement and any other documentation as may be necessary to carry out and effectuate the purpose of this Ordinance. The Village Clerk is also authorized and

directed to affix the Seal of the Village to such documentation as is deemed necessary. The officers, agents and/or employees of the Village shall take all action necessary or reasonably required by the Village to carry out, give effect to and effectuate the purpose of this Ordinance and shall take all action necessary in conformity therewith.

ARTICLE III. HEADINGS, SAVINGS CLAUSES, PUBLICATION, EFFECTIVE DATE

SECTION 4: Headings.

The headings of the articles, sections, paragraphs and subparagraphs of this Ordinance are inserted solely for convenience of reference and form no substantive part of this Ordinance nor should they be used in any interpretation or construction of any substantive provision of this Ordinance.

SECTION 5: Severability.

The provisions of this Ordinance are hereby declared to be severable and should any provision of this Ordinance be determined to be in conflict with any law, statute or regulation by a court of competent jurisdiction, said provision shall be excluded and deemed inoperative, unenforceable and as though not provided for herein, and all other provisions shall remain unaffected, unimpaired, valid and in full force and effect.

SECTION 6: Superseder.

All code provisions, ordinances, resolutions, rules and orders, or parts thereof, in conflict herewith are, to the extent of such conflict, hereby superseded.

SECTION 7: Publication.

A full, true and complete copy of this Ordinance shall be published in pamphlet form or in a newspaper published and of general circulation within the Village as provided by the Illinois Municipal Code, as amended.

SECTION 8: Effective Date.

This Ordinance shall be effective and in full force immediately upon passage and approval.

EXHIBIT A

INTERGOVERNMENTAL AGREEMENT

This Agreement is made and entered into on the last date set forth next to the signature of each party hereto, by and between the following members of MABAS Division 27: BEECHER FIRE PROTECTION DISTRICT, CHICAGO HEIGHTS FIRE DEPARTMENT, CRETE FIRE DEPARTMENT, CRETE TOWNSHIP FIRE PROTECTION DISTRICT, FORD HEIGHTS FIRE DEPARTMENT, FRANKFORT FIRE PROTECTION DISTRICT, MATTESON **FIRE** MONEE FIRE DEPARTMENT. PROTECTION DISTRICT, PARK FOREST **FIRE** DEPARTMENT, PEOTONE FIRE PROTECTION DISTRICT, RICHTON PARK FIRE DEPARTMENT, SAUK VILLAGE FIRE DEPARTMENT, SOUTH CHICAGO HEIGHTS FIRE DEPARTMENT, STEGER FIRE DEPARTMENT, STEGER ESTATES FIRE PROTETION DISTRICT, UNIVERSITY PARK FIRE DEPARTMENT (collectively referred to as the "Parties"), which have approved this Agreement in the manner provided by law.

WHEREAS, Article VII, Section 10, of the Illinois Constitution of 2770 authorizes units of local government to cooperate with each other in order to accomplish common goals and objectives; and

WHEREAS, the Intergovernmental Cooperation Act (5 ILCS 220/1 et seg.) provides that any power or powers, privilege or authority exercised or which may be exercised by a public agency or this State may be exercised, combined, transferred, and enjoyed jointly with any other public agency; and

WHEREAS, the Parties are units of local governments as defined in the Illinois Constitution and are public agencies pursuant to the Intergovernmental Cooperation Act; and

WHEREAS, the Illinois Fire Protection District Act (70 ILCS 705/6(i) provides that the board of trustees of a fire protection district has the power to pass all necessary ordinances, and rules and regulations for the proper management and conduct of the business of the board of trustees; and

WHEREAS, the Parties recognize the need to cooperate in maintaining their concern for

public safety; and

WHEREAS, the Parties, from time to time, find it necessary to borrow vehicles and other assets from one another during times of particular shortages in their respective equipment rosters; and

WHEREAS, the Parties seek to develop an Agreement to set forth the rights, obligations and responsibilities with regard to each situation where one party may need to borrow equipment from the other party.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Parties hereby enter into this Intergovernmental Agreement upon the following terms and conditions:

Section 1: The Parties agree, based on need and availability, that each Party will attempt in good faith to lend the other Parties vehicles, assets, and/or equipment upon request by another Party, provided that the vehicles, assets, and/or equipment are available to be lent as determined by the lending Party in its sole discretion. The determination of availability of any vehicle and/or equipment for loan hereunder shall be made in the sole discretion of the owner of said property, and no claim shall lie against them for such determination.

Section 2: Whenever property or vehicles are loaned, the borrowing Party agrees to indemnify and hold the lending party harmless for all claims, losses or damages claimed as a result from the use of the vehicle, and any other acts or omissions of the borrowing Parties' personnel or agents, including for any costs, reasonable attorneys fees which emanate from the execution and performance of this Agreement and use of the vehicles and/or equipment which may follow under this Agreement.

Section 3: The Parties agree that whenever property or assets are lent, the borrowing Party shall return the property in the same condition in which it was lent to the borrowing Party. The borrowing Party shall be required to pay for all required and/or necessary maintenance, fuel, or repairs during the period in which the property is lent to the borrowing party. The Parties further agree that the lending Party may demand and receive the vehicle or

equipment returned whenever the lending party determines the equipment or vehicle is needed and therefore no longer available. The determination of availability of any vehicle, asset, and/or equipment for loan hereunder shall be made in the sole discretion of the owner of said property, and no claim shall lie against them for such determination. If the lending Party requests that a vehicle or piece of equipment be returned, the borrowing Party shall return the item(s) immediately.

Section 4: The Parties agree that the borrowing party shall defend, indemnify and hold harmless the elected and appointed officials and all other agents, representatives and employees of the lending party against any claim, suit or cause of action arising out of the actions of any employee, volunteer or agent of the borrowing party.

Section 5: The Parties agree further that the borrowing Party shall ensure it has obtained suitable insurance coverage for the vehicle, asset, or equipment borrowed by the borrowing Party for the entire period that the borrowed item is in the possession and control of the borrowing Party, with the lending party named as an additional insured. Before taking possession, the lending Party must approve the insurance arrangement in advance of receiving possession and control of any vehicle, asset, or equipment from the borrowing party.

Section 6: This Agreement shall only be amended by a written instrument approved and signed by all parties hereto. Such amendment shall take effect immediately upon its execution.

Section 7: This Agreement shall remain in force and effect until terminated by the Parties. Any Party may terminate its involvement in this Agreement by giving 90 days' written notice to the Fire Chief or his designee of the other Parties. The Agreement shall continue in full force and effect among the non-withdrawing Parties.

Section 8: This Agreement shall be governed, interpreted and construed in accordance with the laws of the State of Illinois.

Section 9: This Agreement may be executed in one or more counterparts, each of

which shall be deemed an original, but all of which together shall constitute one and the same instrument. This Agreement shall not be effective until the execution and delivery between each of the Parties of at least one set of the counterparts.

To Whom It May Concern:

At the regular meeting of the Board of Trustees of the Thorn Creek Basin Sanitary District on May 20, 2020, the Board approved a user charge rate increase of 5%, effective July 1, 2020. The District works hard to hold its expenses as low as possible, but the District found it necessary to increase rates to help defray the cost of the IEPA loan payments for the completed CIPP sewer reconstruction project and decreased revenues.

This Board action was taken on Wednesday, May 20, 2020, as result of a live stream meeting between the off-site Board of Trustees and the staff at the District office located at 700 West End Avenue in Chicago Heights following the scheduled public hearing. Effective July 1, 2020, the base user charge rate will increase to \$1.583 per ccf or \$2.117 per 1000 gallons. This will result in an increase of approximately \$9.12 annually for an average user.

This new base user charge for all users of the District's facilities becomes effective for the billing that includes the month of July 2020 usage. For the billing that includes the month of June usage, one-half of the rate increase should be applied. For accounts that are billed every month (if applicable), then the full rate increase is applied beginning with the month when July usage is billed.

Any fixed base user rate charge (flat rate) for any non-metered user is implemented in a fashion similar to the above paragraph.

The handling charge will remain unchanged. The penalty charge of 10% added to delinquent accounts also remains the same as previously billed.

The rate changes are detailed on the attached "User Charges Rate Table." Please call if you have any questions.
