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MINUTES OF THE REGULAR MEETING OF THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF STEGER, WILL & COOK COUNTIES, ILLINOIS

The Board of Trustees convened in regular session at 7:00 P.M. on this 15th day of November 2021 in the Municipal Building of the Village of Steger and via Teleconference that was made available to all residents. Mayor Peterson led all in attendance in the Pledge of Allegiance to the flag.

Mayor Peterson called for the roll. The following Trustees were present, Thurmond, Lopez, Kozy, Joyce and Perchinski. Mayor Peterson was present. Trustee Trotier was absent.

Also present: Village Administrator Mary Jo Seehausen, Director of Public Infrastructure Dave Toepper, Police Chief Kevin Shaughnessy, Deputy Fire Chief James Baines, EMA Deputy Chief Jason Stephenson and Community Center Director Diana Rossi.

AWARDS, HONORS AND SPECIAL RECOGNITION

Mayor Peterson appointed Gregory D. Smith as the new Police Chief for the Village of Steger.

Trustee Perchinski made a motion to approve the appointment of Gregory D. Smith as Chief of Police. Trustee Lopez seconded the motion. Roll was called. The following Trustees voted aye; Thurmond, Lopez, Kozy, Joyce and Perchinski. Mayor Peterson Voted Aye. Motion carried.

Village Clerk Zagone gave the Oath of Office to newly appointed Police Chief Gregory D. Smith.

Mayor Peterson explained the extensive search used to find Greg Smith for Police Chief. Mayor Peterson also thanked Kevin Shaughnessy for his exemplary job as interim Police Chief and for staying longer than originally planned. He thanked him for getting us through this period and for having a positive influence on our community and our police department.

Presentation by Jaemi Jackson from CMAP, CIP Technical Assistant Grant and Marla Kindred of Jacobs Engineering, CMAP Capital Improvement Program. CMAP is the Chicago Metropolitan Agency for Planning. They described the Capital Improvement Program Technical Assistance Program that they have been working with the Village on for the past six months. Their goal was to evaluate the needs of the Village and help direct the Village on priority of needs, how to seek grants to finance these needs and recommendations on investment decisions. Steger is one of six communities that has taken part in this program. The program goals are threefold: 1. To be able to identify Capitol Projects through asset inventories and monetary thresholds. 2. Project Development which includes evaluating and prioritizing those projects. 3. Funding of Capital projects and guiding to grants to help finance these projects. As part of the

project, an Existing Conditions report was created, an initial Capital Project inventory, evaluation standards, a recommendation memo and 10 hours of training for staff and officials. A complete report on the plan and its recommendations will be presented to the Village in December. The plan is to have a complete Capital Improvement Plan in place within the coming year.

Mayor Peterson thanked them for the partnership and for providing valuable information for helping the Village of Steger to move forward.

MINUTES

Trustee Perchinski made a motion to approve the minutes of the November 1st Regular Meeting as written. Trustee Lopez seconded the motion. Voice vote; all ayes. Motion carried.

AUDIENCE PARTICIPATION

Steger resident Erikka English, invited residents to a fundraiser on Sunday November 21st. Her not for profit, My Path, My Purpose has adopted an adult autistic protocol and will be at the Community Center from 3-6. She invited all to come see what her program is all about.

Village Administrator Mary Jo Seehausen Thanked Chief Shaughnessy for the past 13 months, working with you was a pleasure. Also, welcome to Chief Smith, I look forward to working with him. A couple updates: JJ Chicken had one outstanding item on their list of things that needed to be done, the roof will be done by the end of the month. The Citco project has hired L&M Construction to take over as General Contractor and is in the process of getting licensed in the Village to begin continuation of the project. The new contractor will be meeting with Administrator Seehausen and Dave Toepper to go over the action plan to move forward. Plans will be presented to the board in December. We were denied for the 2021 CBDG grant application for Steger roads projects with water mains. We will reapply for 2022. Later in the meeting will be the renewal for the liability and workmen's comp. There are two options, I recommend going with option 1. An update on the rec programs: Communication with Assistant Superintendent Diehl stated that COVID mandates were at issue and a meeting on Thursday will deal with this. The new IGA should be settled soon.

Trustee Perchinski made a motion to give Administrator Seehausen authority to approve the new contract with School District 194 within certain parameters with advice from our counsel. Trustee Joyce seconded the motion. Roll was called. The following Trustees voted aye; Thurmond, Lopez, Kozy, Joyce and Perchinski. Mayor Peterson Voted Aye. Motion carried

Trustee Joyce made a point of order to have this vote ratified at the next Village Board meeting since it was not on this meeting's agenda.

Director of Public Infrastructure Dave Toepper Iroquois Paving is close to being done paving on the street and sidewalk program currently underway. Final yard waste pick up is the end of this month on November 24th and will resume in the Spring. Final street sweeping is being scheduled based on all leaves being down from trees. Should be the first week of December.

Deputy Fire Chief James Baines No Report.

Police Chief Kevin Shaughnessy I just want to thank you and the board for the opportunity to lead your police department. I want to thank Mary Jo who I worked very closely with on a daily basis. Pat left the department in good shape and Deputy Chief Ruff has helped in the transition. The Chief shared a story that convinced him that our department is as competent and professional and hardworking as any I have been around or part of. You are in good hands; I know that Chief Smith will do an excellent job and I know you will support him. Thank you again for the opportunity.

EMA Deputy Chief Jason Stevenson No Report.

Community Center Director Diana Rossi We will have our annual Senior Holiday Luncheon on Thursday December 16th at 12 noon. We are glad to get things back to normal. We are getting a Kid's Party ready on December 18th that will include lunch with Santa beginning at Noon.

Village Attorney

Treasurer Still working with the audits to be completed. Through July all comparisons year to year seem to be on track. We are lacking on housing taxes, Cook and Will have recently closed and we should be seeing those funds soon.

MAYORS REPORT No Report.

<u>VILLAGE CLERK</u> The Village Hall will be closed on Thursday November 25th and Friday November 26th in observance of Thanksgiving.

TRUSTEES' REPORTS

Trustee Thurmond I talked with Jason regarding work on landscaping around the new Steger signs. We will probably have to wait until the Spring based on weather and timing. Also, regarding the school district, I did talk to Eric Diehl about the conflict of the contract negotiations and getting things approved. I encouraged him to get together with the Rec Department to discuss the provisions regarding COVID so we can get the kids in the gyms. Finally, I would like to wish everyone a Happy Thanksgiving.

Trustee Trotier No report.

Trustee Joyce Attended the Municipal Engineering Class at the University of Wisconsin last week. Took part in a class involving Street planning, design maintenance, water system supplies, water distribution, water treatment for ground water and service water. Went over sanitary sewer systems, storm water drainage and control systems and then plan reviews. Going over a lot of the information and will be sharing with Dave Toepper and his staff.

Trustee Lopez Thanked Chief Shaughnessy for his contributions and welcome to Chief Smith.

Trustee Perchinski I would also like to thank Chief Shaughnessy for all your hard work and dedication and leadership. Welcome Chief Smith, we are here to support to you and I think this board is unanimous in support for our Police Department. I also want to congratulate the Lopez family; Trustee Lopez's son Nick has been named head coach of the Marian Catholic High School Football Team. Also, my daughter Abby and the Marian Catholic Marching Band did very well in the National Competition, out of 600 bands, they came in 25th overall and 2nd in their division. Finally, Mayor Peterson and I met with the developer for the K-Mart site. Things are still on track; the developer is being allowed in the building to work on planning. They are anticipating the closing by the end of the year.

Trustee Kozy No Report.

Trustee Joyce made a motion to approve the bills listed when funds are available. Trustee Perchinski seconded the motion.

Roll was called. The following Trustees voted aye; Thurmond, Lopez, Kozy, Joyce and Perchinski. Mayor Peterson Voted Aye. Motion carried.

CORRESPONDENCE None

UNFINISHED BUSINESS

Trustee Joyce made a motion to deny ORDINANCE NO. 1262: AN ORDINANCE APPROVING AN AMENDMENT TO SECTIONS 2 AND 4 OF THE COMPREHENSIVE AMENDMENT TO THE ZONING ORDINANCE OF THE VILLAGE OF STEGER, ILLINOIS. Trustee Thurmond seconded the motion.

Trustee Perchinski stated that Ordinance No. 1215 was passed in May of 2019, that I believe addresses this more broadly, but we do need to enforce this. I think too much

work is being done on businesses without getting any approval. I don't know how we convey to the downtown businesses that there are Architectural Standards in place. Trustee Thurmond shared research he had done regarding how other municipalities deal with this same issue. Trustees Joyce, Thurmond and Perchinski will research this issue further and present findings at a future meeting.

Roll was called. The following Trustees voted aye; Thurmond, Lopez, Kozy, Joyce and Perchinski. Mayor Peterson Voted Aye. Motion carried.

NEW BUSINESS:

Trustee Lopez made a motion to approve the 12/1/21-12/1/22 Liability/Workers Compensation Renewal based on the Village Administrator's recommendation of Option 1. Trustee Joyce seconded the motion.

Trustee Perchinski voiced concern about changes in the Village's Real Properties coverages. His concern being that, with increased cost to replace, the stated values may be too low. Concerns also were raised regarding the payroll on which the premium is based for Worker's Comp. Trustee Thurmond questioned the timing of seeing this estimate so close to renewal, and Trustee Perchinski suggested we should have it at least 35 days in advance of renewal going forward.

Trustee Lopez amended his motion to include giving the Village Administrator the authority to ratify the contract but, to let board members know these changes first and do a voice vote to ratify at the next meeting.

Roll was called. The following Trustees voted aye; Thurmond, Lopez, Kozy, Joyce and Perchinski. Mayor Peterson Voted Aye. Motion carried.

Trustee Perchinski made a motion to approve the Tentative 2021 Tax Levy. Trustee Lopez seconded the motion. Roll was called. The following Trustees voted aye; Thurmond, Lopez, Kozy, Joyce and Perchinski. Mayor Peterson Voted Aye. Motion carried.

INTERGOVERNMENTAL AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE VILLAGE OF STEGER AND STEGER SCHOOL DISTRICT 194

This Intergovernmental Agreement is made on the day of <u>Necember</u> 2021, by and between the Board of Education of Steger School District 194 (the "District") and the Village of Steger (the "Village"), both of which are sometimes referred to collectively as the "parties."

AWITNESSETH

WHEREAS, The District and the Village authorized by the Intergovernmental Cooperation Act (5 ILCS 220/1 et seq.) to jointly exercise any of the powers, privileges, functions and/or authority that may be exercised by them individually, and to perform any service, activity or undertaking that may be performed by either party individually; and

WHEREAS, The District and the Village desire to take advantage of their combined ability to provide services to and for the benefit of the youth of the area served by the parties; and

WHEREAS, The District and the Village desire to enter into this Intergovernmental Agreement pursuant to 5 ILCS 220/5 subject to and conditioned upon approval by their respective governing boards.

NOW, THEREFORE, the parties hereby enter into the following Intergovernmental Agreement effective as of the date written above.

- The Village of Steger will provide Steger School District 194 with the following services:
 - O The Village of Steger will mow the Steger School District 194 fields at Columbia Central, Steger Intermediate Center, Steger Primary Center and Parkview Schools, including the area where the former Central Junior High School was located. The retention basin at Columbia Central will be mowed when the ground is dry enough to support the weight of the tractor. A map depicting the areas is attached hereto as Exhibit A.
 - The Village of Steger will salt all District 194 parking lots and driveways, including those at the three schools in the Village of Steger (Columbia Central, Steger Intermediate Center, Parkview), the Administration Center, and the warehouse located at 3244 Loverock. Following an overnight or early morning snowfall, salting will be completed as early in the day as possible. Steger School District 194 will be responsible for all potholes_and repairs to the District 194 parking lots and driveways that may be caused by, or result from, the Village

of Steger salting the foregoing lots and driveways or any salt provided by the Village of Steger.

- O The Village of Steger will provide crossing guard services for children walking to and from Columbia Central and the Steger Intermediate Center at the start of the school day and at dismissal so long as Steger School District 194 informs the Village of Steger of the start and dismissal times. The number of crossing guards and their placement on Village of Steger roadways shall by mutual agreement between the Steger Police Chief and the Superintendent of Steger School District 194.
- Steger School District 194 will, as part of this agreement, allow Steger Recreation to use school gymnasiums when such use does not interfere with the activities and operations of District 194for Steger Recreation Programs as follows:
 - The Village of Steger will submit annually, a schedule of the times it would like to use the school gymnasiums for basketball and volleyball team practices and games. This request shall be submitted on the District's Facility Use Request Form.
 - Within 30 days after submission by the Village of Steger to Steger School District 194 of the requested schedule of times it would like to use the gyms for practices and games, Steger School District 194 will either approve such schedule as requested or will indicate to the Village any times that cannot be approved. District 194 retains final discretion on whether to approve or deny any requested use of the school gymnasiums. If, after the final approval of schedules, the District must cancel a scheduled use, the District will work with the Village to add additional days as needed. At any times any games are held during an approved time, the Village of Steger/Steger Recreation may operate a concession stand to sell food and other items. Steger School District 194 agrees to provide appropriate space to the Village of Steger/Steger Recreation to operate such concession stand. This is for games only and not practices. The Village shall comply with any and all applicable rules and regulations of the Department of Public Health with respect to the operation the concession stand. The Village shall staff the concession stand with at least one individual age 18 or over at all times it is open or in operation. No one under age 12 shall be allowed to work in or operate the concession stand.
 - o The Village of Steger/Steger Recreation will be responsible for providing proper supervision of all its activities at the District and of the participants in those activities. Steger School District 194 agrees that it shall open and close the gyms and schools and provided the necessary heating and cooling of the facilities and access to restrooms and drinking fountains in order to accommodate the approved use of the gyms.
 - The Village of Steger/Steger Recreation will be responsible for reimbursing District 194 for reasonable costs of any damages (other than normal wear and tear) to the facilities caused directly by the negligence or misconduct of Steger Recreation and/or any of its participants in its activities at the District.

- The Village of Steger/Steger Recreation will provide a Certificate of Liability insurance annually to Steger School District 194, a copy of which shall be attached to the Facility Use Request Form submitted by the Village/Steger Recreation.
- Steger School District 194 will be responsible for unlocking the buildings, cleaning the facilities used, and locking the buildings in order to accommodate approved use of the buildings and facilities. The Village/Steger Recreation shall be responsible to perform light cleaning of the Concession Stand per the District's Concession Stand Cleaning Procedures (attached as Exhibit B) on days/times when the Village/Steger Recreation works in or operates the concession stand.
- The Village and the School District agree to indemnify and hold each other harmless from any claims or damages, including attorney fees, incurred by the Village or School District due, respectively, to the School's or Village's acts or omissions, provided, however, that the Village shall retain responsibility and liability for any damage to the property of third persons or for the personal injury of third persons caused by the Village while salting District 194 parking lots and driveways. Notwithstanding (a) and (b) above, nothing contained in this clause shall constitute a waiver of any privileges, defenses or immunities either of the Parties may have under the Local Government and Governmental Employee Tort Immunity Act (745 ILCS 10/1-101 et seq.) This obligation of this provision shall survive termination of this Agreement.
- o The Village of Steger/Steger Recreation shall be allowed to use the School District ball fields on a first priority basis (when the School District does not need the fields) and shall pay a reduced fee as established by the School District for non-tournament use. When the fields are used for tournaments, a high use fee will apply. Each year, the School District will prepare a fee schedule for use of the ball fields. The provisions of this Agreement shall serve as express consent for Village of Steger Police Officers to enter and discharge policing duties on Steger School District 194 property any time the Village of Steger and/or Steger Recreation is occupying and using Steger School District 194 facilities.
- The use of District 194 facilities by the Village and/or Steger Recreation is subject to the Village's and Steger Recreation's (and their participants) compliance with Covid-19 protocols and mitigation measures in place at District 194 at the time of such use.

This agreement will be in effect for five years through June 30, 2026. After June 30, 2026 this agreement may be renewed if both the Village of Steger and Steger School District 194 approve the extended agreement. Either party may terminate this agreement for any reason with six months written notice to the other party. This agreement may be terminated at any time by either party for cause. Cause means the failure of a party to comply with any material term of this Agreement. For purposes of this Agreement, cause for termination specifically includes, but is not necessarily limited to, failure by the Village/Steger Recreation (and its participants) to comply with Department of Public Health rules and regulations, and/or Covid-19 protocols required by the State of Illinois, the Illinois State Board of Education, the Illinois Department of Public Health or District 194.

This agreement does not provide for or cover any other services provided by the Village of Steger to Steger School District 194 or by School District 194 to the Village of Steger. Any such services provided outside of this Intergovernmental Agreement shall be provided as agreed to by the parties, including any compensation for such services.



AN ORDINANCE APPROVING CERTAIN LAND USE RELIEF (SPECIAL USE PERMIT) FOR THE PROPERTY LOCATED AT 3240 LOVEROCK AVENUE, STEGER, ILLINOIS.

WHEREAS, the Village of Steger, Counties of Cook and Will, State of Illinois (the "Village") is a duly organized and existing municipality and unit of local government created under the provisions of the laws of the State of Illinois, and is operating under the provisions of the Illinois Municipal Code, and all laws amendatory thereof and supplementary thereto, with full powers to enact ordinances and adopt resolutions for the benefit of the residents of the Village; and

WHEREAS, Dainus Majauskas/Doni Team, LLC (the "Applicant") submitted a request to the Village of Steger (the "Village") for land use relief for the property located at 3240 Loverock Avenue, Steger, Illinois (PIN: 32-33-409-049-0000) (the "Subject Property"), which is located within an area designated as a M-2 General Manufacturing District, to allow for the use of truck maintenance and repair on the Subject Property (the "Proposed Use"); and

WHEREAS, the Village's Planning and Zoning Board of Appeals (the "PZBA") held a hearing, pursuant to proper notice, at which the Applicant provided testimony regarding the Proposed Use; and

WHEREAS, the PZBA considered granting the Applicant a special use

permit in compliance with Section 10.3-6.6 of the "Comprehensive Amendment to the Zoning Ordinance of the Village of Steger, Illinois," commonly referred to as the "Zoning Code," to allow for the Proposed Use (the "Land Use Relief"); and

WHEREAS, evidence was introduced at the aforesaid hearing establishing that: (a) the Proposed Use is consistent with existing uses in the general vicinity thereof; (b) the Subject Property is suitable for the Proposed Use; (c) the Land Use Relief will not negatively alter the essential character of the locality; (d) the Land Use Relief will not endanger the public safety; and (e) the Land Use Relief will not be detrimental to the public welfare or injurious to other property or improvements; and

WHEREAS, based on the foregoing, the PZBA made certain findings of fact, which are set forth on the "Recommendation", attached hereto and incorporated herein as Exhibit A, and made a recommendation to approve the Land Use Relief; and

WHEREAS, in light of the foregoing, the Village President (the "President") and the Board of Trustees of the Village (the "Village Board" and with the President, the "Corporate Authorities") have determined that it is in the best interests of the Village to approve the Land Use Relief;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the President and the Board of Trustees of the Village of Steger, Counties of Cook and Will, and the State of Illinois, as follows:

Section 1. Recitals. The foregoing recitals are herein incorporated and made a part of this Ordinance as if fully set forth herein.

Section 2. Approval of Land Use Relief. The findings of fact and Recommendation of the PZBA are hereby adopted, and, in accordance with said findings of fact and Recommendation, the Village Board approves the Land Use Relief for the Subject Property.

Section 3. Savings Clause. This Ordinance shall not affect suits pending or rights existing at the time this Ordinance takes effect, but such suits and rights shall continue in force to the same extent and with like effect as if this Ordinance be taken, construed or held to avoid or impair any cause of action now existing under any ordinance of the Village, or any amendment thereto, but as to any consideration of action now existing, such ordinance and amendment thereto, shall be continued in full force and effect.

Section 4. Effective Date. This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect upon its passage and publication as provided by law.

VILLAGE OF STEGER (THE "VILLAGE") PLANNING & ZONING BOARD OF APPEALS RECOMMENDATION

RE: Special use permit application to allow for the use of truck maintenance and repair on a property located within a M-2 General Manufacturing District within the Village.

President and Board of Trustees:

The Planning & Zoning Board of Appeals ("PZBA") met on Thursday, November 4, 2021 and discussed the petition of Dainus Majauskas/Doni Team, LLC (the "Petitioner") for a special use permit in compliance with Section 10.3-6.6 of the "Comprehensive Amendment to the Zoning Ordinance of the Village of Steger, Illinois," commonly referred to as the "Zoning Code," related to allowing the use of truck maintenance and repair on a property located within a M-2 General Manufacturing District (the "Special Use Permit"). Proper notice of the Meeting was provided in accordance with Section 10.4.3 of the Zoning Ordinance.

During the public hearing, testimony and evidence were introduced establishing that the Petitioner is the contract purchaser of a parcel of real estate within the Village, commonly known as 3420 Loverock Avenue, Steger, Illinois with Property Index Number 32-33-409-049-0000 ("Subject Property"). At the hearing, Petitioner presented to the PZBA a request for a Special Use Permit to allow for the use of truck maintenance and repair on a property located within a M-2 General Manufacturing District ("Proposed Use"). Further, the Petitioner provided credible evidence showing that: (a) the Proposed Use is consistent with existing uses in the general vicinity thereof; (b) the Subject Property is suitable for the Proposed Use; (d) the Special Use Permit will not negatively alter the essential character of the locality; (e) the Special Use Permit will not endanger the public safety; and (f) the Special Use Permit will not be detrimental to the public welfare or injurious to other property or improvements.

In light of the testimony introduced at the public hearing, the PZBA found that Proposed Use of the Subject property is in furtherance of the public interest and will not be detrimental to the health, safety, and welfare of the Village and its residents.

It is the recommendation of the PZBA to approve the special use permit application to allow for the Proposed Use.

ORDINANCE NUMBER 1264

THE ANNUAL TAX LEVY ORDINANCE OF THE VILLAGE OF STEGER, COOK COUNTY AND WILL COUNTY, ILLINOIS FOR THE FISCAL YEAR BEGINNING JANUARY 1, 2021 AND ENDING DECEMBER 31, 2021

WHEREAS, the Village of Steger, Cook County and Will County, Illinois (the "Village") is a duly organized and existing municipal corporation created under the provisions of the laws of the State of Illinois and under the provisions of the Illinois Municipal Code, as from time to time supplemented and amended.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the President and Board of Trustees of the Village of Steger, Cook County and Will County, Illinois, as follows:

- **Section 1**. That the above recital is found to be true and correct and is hereby incorporated herein and made a part hereof, as if fully set forth in its entirety.
- **Section 2**. This Ordinance is and shall be designated as "The Annual Tax Levy Ordinance of the Village of Steger, Cook County and Will County, Illinois for the Fiscal Year beginning January 1, 2021 and ending December 31, 2021."
- **Section 3**. The total amount of appropriations for all corporate purposes, legally made to be collected from the property tax levy of the current year is ascertained to be the sum of \$2,308,102.
- **Section 4**. The purpose of which appropriations are made, and the amount appropriated for each purpose, respectively, to be collected for the Tax Levy of the current year are, as follows (see attached insert):

Section 5. There is hereby certified to the County Clerk of Cook County and the County Clerk of Will County, Illinois, the several sums aforesaid, constituting the total amount of \$2,308,102, which said total amount the Village of Steger, Cook County and Will County, Illinois requires to be raised by taxation for the current municipal fiscal year January 1, 2021 to December 31, 2021 of said Village, and the Village Clerk is hereby directed to file within the time required by law, a certified copy of this Ordinance and also to certify within said mentioned time to said County Clerk the total amount required to be raised by taxation; as aforesaid, in accordance with the provision of the revenue laws of the State of Illinois.

Section 6. If any section, paragraph, clause, or provision of this Ordinance shall be held invalid, the invalidity thereof shall not affect any other provision of this Ordinance.

Section 7. All ordinances, resolutions, motions, or orders in conflict with this Ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict.

Section 8. This Ordinance is declared to be urgent and necessary for the immediate preservation of public peace, health and safety of the general public and shall, therefore, take effect and be in full force immediately upon its passage and approval by the Village President.
