The Board of Trustees convened in regular session at 7:00 P.M. on this 18th day of April, 2022 in the Municipal Building of the Village of Steger and via Teleconference that was made available to all residents. Mayor Peterson led all in attendance in the Pledge of Allegiance to the flag.

Mayor Peterson called for the roll. The following Trustees were present; Thurmond, Lopez, Kozy, Trotier, Joyce and Perchinski. Mayor Peterson was present.

Also present: Village Administrator Mary Jo Seehausen, Director of Public Infrastructure Dave Toepper, Police Chief Greg Smith, Deputy Fire Chief James Baine and EMA Chief Tom Johnston. Community Center Director Diana Rossi was absent.

MINUTES

Trustee Perchinski made a motion to approve the minutes of April 4th meeting as all members have copies. Trustee Lopez seconded the motion. Voice vote; all ayes. Motion carried.

AUDIENCE PARTICIPATION

Erica N. Longo-Womack of 3419 Susan Ln, Steger addressed the board regarding the issuing of tickets on streets surrounding the former Colonies Apartment complex where parking is restricted to resident parking only. The police department is going to look into the tickets issued to residents and how to alleviate the problem. The Village will also revisit the issue and determine if the radius now restricted needs to be adjusted. The ordinance was never meant to punish homeowners, rather keep the street available for residents to use for parking.

Mary Laws of 3457 Jennifer Ct. addressed the board questioned the bad potholes on her street. Dave Toepper is going to look in to repairs on Jennifer Ct. She also stated that her block has restricted parking because of overflow from the apartments. She wants the restrictions to remain in place on her street.

REPORTS

Village Administrator Mary Jo Seehausen The Village received a donation of \$250 from the Village of South Chicago Heights to offset costs of the Summer Band Program. Our renewal for health insurance on July 1st will reflect increases of 3.1% on our PPO policy and .4% decrease on our HMO policy. Finally, we have not yet heard from the Secretary of State regarding car registrations in the Village.

Director of Public Infrastructure Dave Toepper Reported 22 tickets in the last two weeks, 18 reoccupancy inspections, issued 17 new building permits, one for a new home on Crystal, work is being done on Citgo station, we had 3 water main breaks and B&K will be out this week to start inspections on the water tower.

Deputy Fire Chief James Baine So far this year we have had 551 calls, up a little from last year. The Easter Egg Hunt went well, we had over 111 kids take part. On a personal note I want to thank the Village, EMA and everyone involved for the condolences and every thing that was done for my family. Special thanks to Assistant Chief Long, Lt. Ragsin and the entire department for stepping up so I could be with my family.

Police Chief Greg Smith Last year at this time we had 3943 calls. Already this year we have had 4622. This is on average with past years as there was a decrease last year.

EMA Chief Tom Johnston No Report

Community Center Director Diana Rossi Trustee Kozy reported the softball 12U team won their tournament. No update on football. Volleyball season ended, thanks to Steve and Christine Zemon for doing a great job with the kids. Also thanks to custodian Justin for all his efforts at the school, and thanks to the School District 194 for having us there.

Trustee Perchinski made a motion to approve the mayor's appointments as listed to the Steger Economic Development Corporation. Trustee Lopez seconded the motion.

Discussion: Trustee Thurmond stated that he is not aware of what the Economic Development Corporation is. Trustee Thurmond asked if it could be tabled so he could get further information about the corporation documents and description of duties. Mayor Peterson stated that part of the process is to appoint them so they can create those documents and duties. The ordinance is already adopted and in place. The intent of the EDC is to help the Village with economic development here in town. That will include managing Village owned properties, since they don't have the same restrictions as the Village, they can better dispose of properties held by the Village. We need to get these properties back on the Tax Rolls and out from under the maintenance of the Village. This is the best way to do that. The intent of the EDC is to work closely with this board to help with economic development. They will also help market the Village of Steger all through this board. All businesses would still all come through the Village Board. With the Mayor's explanation the motion to table was not pursued.

Roll was called. The following Trustees voted aye; Lopez, Kozy, Trotier, and Perchinski. Mayor Peterson voted aye. Trustees Thurmond and Joyce voted no. Motion carried.

Additionally: Mayor Peterson appointed Trustee Tim Perchinski as the Trustee Liaison to the Steger Economic Development Corporation.

Still in discussion with Desiderio regarding designs for the new Welcome Signs. I have spoken with Jason about having the scouts participate. Finally, Trustee Thurmond questioned missing bills. Village Administrator stated that the only bills to be paid are the ones on the list.

Mayor Peterson stated that this like other Village acquired properties were acquired either because of back taxes, or like this one, the house was torn down by the Village as no family was left and it was acquired through the county.

Discussion was begun regarding Village Sticker Fees for the 2023-2024 sticker year. Trustee Perchinski stated that we did not yet have the information from the Secretary of State to move forward with this discussion. Trustee Thurmond distributed a list of proposed increases and late fees based on research of surrounding communities. Mayor Peterson recommended that the board study this and compare to current fees so that a future decision can be made.

Discussion was begun on Village Sticker late fees. Trustees Joyce and Perchinski agree that late fees should be double the original fee. Trustee Thurmond stated that in his research, none of the municipalities do less than double the base cost. Trustee Thurmond said he would prefer to eliminate village stickers and charge a maintenance

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fee to all homeowners for street maintenance. A request to raise the late fees for Village Stickers will be on a future agenda for the purpose of being voted upon.

Being no further business:

Trustee Perchinski made a motion to adjourn the meeting. Trustee Joyce seconded the motion. Voice vote; all ayes. Motion carried.

A RESOLUTION PROVIDING AN INDUCEMENT TO THE VILLAGE OF STEGER AND THE OWNER OF CERTAIN REAL PROPERTY LOCATED AT 3312 CHICAGO ROAD, STEGER, ILLINOIS IN CONNECTION WITH THE REDEVELOPMENT OF CERTAIN REAL PROPERTY LOCATED IN THE VILLAGE OF STEGER FOR THE VILLAGE OF STEGER, COUNTIES OF COOK AND WILL, STATE OF ILLINOIS.

WHEREAS, the Village of Steger, Counties of Cook and Will, State of Illinois (the "Village") is a duly organized and existing municipality and unit of local government created under the provisions of the laws of the State of Illinois, and is operating under the provisions of the Illinois Municipal Code, and all laws amendatory thereof and supplementary thereto, with full powers to enact ordinances and adopt resolutions for the benefit of the residents of the Village; and

WHEREAS, the Village President (the "President") and the Board of Trustees of the Village (the "Village Board" and with the President, the "Corporate Authorities") are committed to ensuring that areas located within the Village do not become blighted areas, that the stable economic and physical development of the Village is not endangered by blighting factors and that where blighting factors exist, the Village actively works to ameliorate blighting factors on such blighted property; and

WHEREAS, blight may be manifested by and blighting factors found where there are, among other things: (1) progressive and advanced deterioration of structures; (2) the overuse of housing and other facilities; (3) a lack of physical maintenance of existing structures; (4) obsolete and inadequate community facilities; (5) a lack of sound community planning; (6) the existence of adverse environmental conditions; and (7) a combination of the abovementioned factors; and

WHEREAS, as a result of the existence of blighted factors, there is an excessive and disproportionate expenditure of public funds, inadequate public and private investment, unmarketability of property, growth in delinquencies and crime and housing and zoning law violations in such areas; and

WHEREAS, if not addressed, the economic decline and distress may: (1) impair the value of private investments; (2) threaten the sound growth and the tax base of the Village and the taxing districts having the power to tax real property in the Village; and (3) threaten the health, safety, morals and welfare of the public; and

WHEREAS, there exists certain real property within the corporate limits of the Village (the "Property"), which is located at the address commonly known as 3312 Chicago Road, Steger, IL 60475 and identified as Property Index No. 32-32-428-017-0000; and

WHEREAS, to aid in removing and alleviating the blight and to address the economic decline and distress affecting certain areas of the Village, the Village has determined that it is in the Village's best interests to commission and conduct a study to explore the possibility of the Village negotiating and thereafter entering into a Tax Increment Financing ("TIF") redevelopment agreement (the "Redevelopment Agreement") with the owner of the property located at 3312 Chicago Road, Steger, Illinois, or its preapproved designee(s), (collectively, the "Developer") pursuant to and in accordance with the Tax Increment Allocation Redevelopment Act (65 ILCS 5/11-74.4-1, *et seq.*) (the "Act"), whereby the Village may provide financial incentives including, but not limited to, TIF, to incentivize the Developer's redevelopment of the Property; and

WHEREAS, the Developer is currently expending money with respect to project expenses associated with the redevelopment of the Property, including, but not limited to, site engineering, legal, design, remediation, property acquisition and other

expenses which could be reimbursed if a Redevelopment Agreement is entered into by the Village and the Developer (the "Developer's Potential Eligible Redevelopment Costs"); and

WHEREAS, the Village's payment of Developer's Potential Eligible Redevelopment Costs is contingent on the Village and the Developer entering into a Redevelopment Agreement, which shall require, among other things, the Developer to complete a project eligible for reimbursement under the Act (the "Project"); and

WHEREAS, the Developer's Potential Eligible Redevelopment Costs shall not exceed two hundred thousand and no/100 (\$200,000.00) (the "Maximum Reimbursement Amount"), and the Village shall not reimburse the Developer for any expenditures in excess of the Maximum Reimbursement Amount; and

WHEREAS, the successful completion of the Project is contingent upon economic assistance from the Village and the taxing districts located within the Village, and, but for said assistance, the Developer would not undertake the Project; and

WHEREAS, the Village acknowledges that, but for the benefit of economic assistance from TIF, the Project could not proceed; and

WHEREAS, the Village acknowledges that it will not be able to commence the Project unless the expenditures the Village incurs are reimbursable under the Act; and

WHEREAS, the Village acknowledges that a third party will not be able to complete the Project without economic assistance from the Village; and

WHEREAS, in an effort to encourage public and private investment in the Village, the Corporate Authorities do hereby agree to undertake, in good faith, an investigation into the appropriateness of allowing the Village to use TIF in connection with the Project; and

WHEREAS, the Village may make certain expenditures necessary to commence the Project on the basis that TIF may be used, entirely or in part, to finance

the Project; and

WHEREAS, after adoption of this Resolution, the Village agrees to consider providing municipal and/or other governmental economic assistance including, but not limited to, TIF, through the execution of a Redevelopment Agreement, to the extent that such assistance may lawfully and practically be available and in the best interests of the Village; and

WHEREAS, notwithstanding the foregoing, this Resolution does not obligate the Village to enter into a Redevelopment Agreement with the Developer, but rather it is intended to induce the Developer to pursue plans for the Project and provide for the potential reimbursement of the Developer's Potential Eligible Redevelopment Costs in the event, and contingent upon, a Redevelopment Agreement is entered into between the Village and the Developer;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the President and the duly authorized Board of Trustees of the Village of Steger, Counties of Cook and Will, State of Illinois, as follows:

ARTICLE I. IN GENERAL

Section 1.0 Findings.

The Corporate Authorities hereby find that all of the recitals hereinbefore stated as contained in the preambles to this Resolution are full, true and correct and do hereby, by reference, incorporate and make them part of this Resolution as legislative findings and substantive enactments of the Resolution as applicable.

Section 2.0 Purpose.

The purpose of this Resolution is to induce the Village and the Developer to proceed with the potential redevelopment of the Property, to incur costs pending the possible approval of a Redevelopment Agreement, and to further authorize the

President to take all steps necessary to carry out the terms of this Resolution and ratify any steps taken to effectuate those goals.

**ARTICLE II.
PROPOSED INDUCEMENTS AND AUTHORIZATION**

Section 3.0 Proposed Project Inducements.

The Corporate Authorities will study and consider whether all or a portion of the Project is appropriate for participation in municipal and/or other governmental economic incentive program(s) including, but not limited to, TIF. If the Village determines that the Project is appropriate for such municipal and/or other governmental economic incentive program(s) including, but not limited to, TIF, and such costs are qualified costs under the Act, the Village may make certain TIF eligible expenditures to commence the Project and bargain in good faith with the Developer regarding the Project, including reimbursement for the expenditures so authorized, provided that such reimbursements are lawfully permitted and practically available. Accordingly, the Village and other third parties designated by the Village including, but not limited to, the Developer are hereby induced to make such reasonable expenditures in furtherance of the Project, contingent upon a Redevelopment Agreement being entered into between the Village and the Developer.

Section 3.1 Authorization.

That the Village Board hereby authorizes and directs the President and the Village Attorney to take all steps and incur all costs necessary to negotiate and draft agreements and other documents necessary to carry out the intent of this Resolution. After such agreements or documents are in a form satisfactory to the President and the Village Attorney, said agreements or documents shall be presented to the Village Board to consider for approval and passage, as provided by law.

**ARTICLE III.
HEADINGS, SAVINGS CLAUSES, PUBLICATION,
EFFECTIVE DATE**

Section 4.0 Headings.

Section 6.0 Superseder.

All code provisions, ordinances, resolutions, rules and orders, or parts thereof, in conflict herewith are, to the extent of such conflict, hereby superseded.

Section 7.0 Publication.

**AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 82-79 OF THE MUNICIPAL CODE OF
STEGER, ILLINOIS REGARDING NEW FEES FOR VEHICLE STICKERS**

WHEREAS, the Village of Steger, Counties of Cook and Will, State of Illinois (the "Village") is a duly organized and existing municipality and unit of local government created under the provisions of the laws of the State of Illinois, and is operating under the provisions of the Illinois Municipal Code, and all laws amendatory thereof and supplementary thereto, with full powers to enact ordinances and adopt resolutions for the benefit of the residents of the Village; and

WHEREAS, the Village President (the "Village President"), and the Board of Trustees (the "Village Board" and together with the Village President, the "Corporate Authorities"), are committed to ensuring the effective administration of government; and

WHEREAS, the Village is required to maintain a road network for vehicular travel; and

WHEREAS, the costs of maintaining the road network have increased; and

WHEREAS, Chapter 82 of the Municipal Code of Steger, Illinois (the "Village Code") provides for certain vehicle sticker rates (the "Rates"); and

WHEREAS, with the foregoing in mind, the Corporate Authorities have determined that it is necessary, advisable and in the best interests of the Village and its residents to amend Chapter 82, Section 82-79 of the Village Code as set forth herein to reflect the increase in road network maintenance costs;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the President and the Board of Trustees of the Village of Steger, Counties of Cook and Will, and the State of Illinois, as follows:

**ARTICLE I.
IN GENERAL**

SECTION 1: Incorporation Clause.

The Corporate Authorities hereby find that all of the recitals hereinbefore stated as contained in the preambles to this Ordinance are full, true, and correct and do hereby, by reference, incorporate and make them part of this Ordinance as legislative findings.

SECTION 2: Purpose.

The purpose of this Ordinance is to amend Chapter 82, Section 82-79 of the Village Code regarding the water rates and regulations for the Village, to authorize the President or his designee to take such steps as are necessary to carry out the intent of this Ordinance, and to ratify any actions previously taken that are consistent with the intent of this Ordinance.

**ARTICLE II.
AUTHORIZATION;
AMENDMENT TO CHAPTER 82, SECTION 82-79 OF
THE MUNICIPAL CODE OF STEGER, ILLINOIS**

SECTION 3: Amendment to Chapter 82, Section 82-79.

Section 82-79 of the Village of Steger Municipal Code is hereby amended as follows, with deletions stricken (strikethrough) and additions underlined (underline):

Sec. 82-79. - When license due and payable.

(a) All license fees under this article are due and payable on or before June 30 of each year, or if the vehicle is purchased after June 30 of the current year, or the applicant became a resident of the village after June 30, the license fee is due and payable within 30 days after the date of purchase or the date of establishing residence in the village.

(b) The fee for vehicle stickers is as follows:

The officers, employees and/or agents of the Village are specifically authorized and directed to draft and disseminate any and all necessary forms or notices to be utilized in connection with the intent of this Ordinance.

The provisions of this Ordinance are hereby declared to be severable and should any provision of this Ordinance be determined to be in conflict with any law, statute or regulation by a court of competent jurisdiction, said provision shall be excluded and

deemed inoperative, unenforceable and as though not provided for herein, and all other provisions shall remain unaffected, unimpaired, valid and in full force and effect.

SECTION: 6 Superseder.

All code provisions, ordinances, resolutions, rules and orders, or parts thereof, in conflict herewith are, to the extent of such conflict, hereby superseded.

SECTION: 7 Publication.

A full, true and complete copy of this Ordinance shall be published in pamphlet form or in a newspaper published and of general circulation within the Village as provided by the Illinois Municipal Code, as amended.

SECTION 8: Effective Date.

This Ordinance shall be effective immediately subject to its passage, approval and publication in accordance with applicable law.
