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MINUTES OF THE REGULAR MEETING OF THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF STEGER, WILL & COOK COUNTIES, ILLINOIS

The Board of Trustees convened in regular session at 7:00 P.M. on this 3rd day of January, 2023 in the Municipal Building of the Village of Steger and via Teleconference that was made available to all residents. Mayor Peterson led all in attendance in the Pledge of Allegiance to the flag.

The roll was called. The following Trustees were present; Thurmond, Stewart, Trotier and Joyce. Trustee Perchinski was present via ZOOM. Trustee Lopez was absent. Mayor Peterson was present.

Also present: Director of Public Infrastructure Dave Toepper, Fire Chief Michael Long, Police Chief Greg Smith, EMA Chief Tom Johnston and Community Center Director Diana Rossi. Village Administrator Mary Jo Seehausen was absent.

AWARDS, HONORS AND SPECIAL RECOGNITION

Mayor Peterson announced the winners of the 2022 Christmas Decorating Contest.

MINUTES

Trustee Joyce made a motion to approve the minutes of the December 19th meeting as all members have copies. Trustee Stewart seconded the motion. Voice vote; all ayes. Motion carried.

AUDIENCE

Resident Mark Gerrity of 314 Royal Oak Dr. addressed the board regarding garbage pick-up this week. He confirmed that pick-up is one day late this week due to the New Year's holiday. He pointed out that the posted calendar was incorrect. He also pointed out pot holes that have developed on Oakland Drive and Royal Oak Drive. Mr. Toepper made note to address the issues.

REPORTS

Village Administrator Mary Jo Seehausen Mayor Peterson reported on the frozen pipe at the Community Center that did substantial damage to the storage room and the workout room. The water did not get to the gym floor. A request has been submitted to the insurance company to evaluate repairs that need to be made and exercise equipment that was damaged in the workout room. A service company was brought in to help dry out the affected areas, but a more thorough cleaning and repairs to damaged

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walls may be necessary. The insurance appraiser has to come in and assess the damage before we can allow public access to the building again. We hope to know more in the next 24 hours. We will better be able to layout a construction schedule and be able to understand how it is going to impact the Community Center. Until that time, the Community Center will remain closed as we go through this process.

Director of Public Infrastructure Dave Toepper I am in the process of gathering all the year end stats from the building department, the water department and I should have something together for the next board meeting.

Fire Chief Michael Long We had a record-breaking year in 2022. Each year we normally see about 100 call volume increase. This year we had 300 more than normal. We ended 2022 with a structure fire and we began 2023 with a structure fire. Thankfully they were both put out pretty quickly and I would like to thank Sargent Jordan Lane for his quick action on the first one. Part of the reason our call volume is up so much is our surrounding communities are hurting pretty bad for staffing. Thankfully we are not, we have enough EMT's at the moment so we were able to staff both ambulances for all of December. I am happy to report that we did not give up any income to anyone else. We will be billing out a little over \$50,000.00 more than normal. We ran 49 mutual aid calls when we normally do 10.

Police Chief Greg Smith We are working on our end of year stats, will be getting those out to you pretty soon. Last week I sent out 2 blotters because of the holidays. The one sent on Wednesday we had a suspicious person reported on Mach Lane. Detectives did a follow-up and determined individual was there legitimately on behalf of a mortgage company taking pictures. I want to reassure residents that there was no stalker in the area.

Community Center Director Diana Rossi No further report.

EMA Chief Tom Johnston We have had four calls for service since the last meeting. We helped Public Works with a water main break on Chicago Road and 30th Street where traffic is pretty heavy.

TRUSTEES REPORTS

Trustee Trotier I have nothing to report tonight, just thanks to Public Works besides their regular duties, I saw them removing Christmas Trees from the boulevard. There are still a few trees with ornaments. It was a long day for them so I thank you very much. Mayor Peterson joined in asking if we are doing a Christmas Tree bonfire. Fire Chief Long stated that since not all trees have been collected, it is still to be determined if and when the burn would take place. Mayor Peterson asked if people take their own trees over themselves to Veteran's Park, or are we picking them up. Dave Toepper stated we have done both ways. If someone calls Village Hall for pick-up, we will come get it.

Trustee Joyce I want to wish everyone a Happy New Year. I hope everyone had a safe Holiday Season. I want thank Diane Rossi, Pat Rossi the workers at Community Center and Roy Stone for taking care of the Community Center when the damage was discovered saving it from being much worse. Thank you to the Fire Department and all others that helped that night. I want to thank Dave and Public Works for the work they have been doing in the weather. A reminder to residents to clean-up in front of their homes so when it does snow again, nothing can be projectiled toward your house or cars by snow plows.

Trustee Lopez No Report.

Trustee Thurmond I want to congratulate and thank Diana Rossi for holding down the fort on her day off and vacation. We have had multiple main breaks the past two weeks. Our crew jumps in and takes care of them. I really want to thank Julie Stone for allowing her husband to be out at all hours to help take care of us. I appreciate that. Piggy backing the main break issue, I have done research and I would really like to take advantage of the Code Red system to announce main breaks so it can be a simple statement of main breaks in the area that may cause low pressure, you may need to run water to clear sediment, etc. It certainly is a public service announcement that we can make.

Trustee Stewart Happy New Year to everyone. Diane let me know about the Community Center. I am sure it has impacted some of the sign-ups for volleyball and a few stragglers for basketball. I am going to check with Dave and Steve, I know when I talked with Dave, we were nearing 100 for basketball. Volleyball was really down; it may be something we want to do a robocall or some type of announcement to the community that we are still taking signups for Volleyball. Mayor Peterson stated that when we have a better idea when the Community Center can re-open, we can let them know options for signing up. We are approaching the start of the season and need to know when we can schedule gym time. Steger schools are not available this week as the school buildings are closed for the holiday break.

Before casting his vote, Trustee Joyce stated that he does not see what the issue is in the different inducements of helping businesses stay in town. We keep tabling one, but we freely approve all the other ones. Trustee Joyce reiterated that he is just making a statement that we are holding up one business of their approved program through the county. Mayor Peterson interjected that the business asking for the inducement asked us to table this request. The village asked for certain information that they do not yet have available. Trustee Joyce asked if we ask other businesses for this information. Mayor Peterson stated that this a Class 6B that is different from other requests. This is the first time we had a Trustee request information. Trustee Perchinski stated that the other

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ordinance is not putting any money back into real property. Mayor Peterson stated that it is not reallocating the taxes it is already in a TIF district requesting funds. Trustee Joyce stated it is reallocating funds and it is no different than you asking at home for a reassessment on your property. The tax burden doesn't change if it's a homeowner or business. We have done this with multiple businesses, we did this at the meeting before this, 6A for a new business, but the end result and purpose of this program is to keep a business in town before they close up and move elsewhere which would leave us with vacant business on which the tax rate automatically goes down. With that Trustee Joyce voted yes.

Joyce and Perchinski. Mayor Peterson voted aye. Motion carried

AN ORDINANCE APPROVING AND CONSENTING TO AN APPLICATION BY 3300 HOLEMAN, LLC AND JDM COATINGS, INC. FOR A CLASS 6B DESIGNATION UNDER THE COOK COUNTY REAL PROPERTY ASSESSMENT CLASSIFICATION ORDINANCE, AS AMENDED, FOR CERTAIN REAL PROPERTY LOCATED WITHIN THE VILLAGE OF STEGER, STATE OF ILLINOIS

WHEREAS, the Village of Steger, Counties of Cook and Will, State of Illinois (the "Village") is a duly organized and existing municipality and unit of local government created under the provisions of the laws of the State of Illinois, and is operating under the provisions of the Illinois Municipal Code, and all laws amendatory thereof and supplementary thereto, with full powers to enact ordinances and adopt resolutions for the benefit of the residents of the Village; and

WHEREAS, the Cook County Real Property Assessment Classification Ordinance, as amended, (the "Classification Ordinance") provides a system for classifying real property located in Cook County, Illinois for real estate tax assessment purposes; and

WHEREAS, the Classification Ordinance established real estate tax assessment classifications to encourage industrial and commercial development in Cook County, which will increase employment opportunities and increase the real estate tax base in Cook County; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and the Village's Board of Trustees (collectively, the Corporate Authorities") desire to promote industrial and commercial development

within the Village; and

WHEREAS, the Classification Ordinance allows for an assessment classification known as Class 6b (the "Class 6b Designation") for real estate that is used primarily for industrial purposes and that (i) has newly constructed buildings or structures, (ii) is considered abandoned, (iii) is substantially rehabilitated, (iv) is located within certain designated areas, or (v) special circumstances establish that the real estate is qualified for Class 6b Designation under the Sustainable Emergency Relief ("SER") program; and

WHEREAS, a Class 6b Designation is also conditioned upon certain findings and approvals of the municipality governing the affected real estate; and

WHEREAS, a Class 6b Designation results in a substantial reduction of the real estate taxes levied against such industrial real estate by reducing the assessment level for the real estate; and

WHEREAS, 3300 Holeman, LLC and JDM Coatings, Inc. (the "Applicants") have applied for or are applying for the Class 6b Designation for the real estate located at the address commonly known as 3300 Holeman Avenue, Steger, Illinois, and having assigned Property Index Numbers: 32-33-331-020, 32-33-331-021, 32-33-331-022, 32-33-331-023, 32-33-331-024 (collectively, the "Subject Property"); and

WHEREAS, the Subject Property and the operations thereon are further described in the application submitted by the Applicants (the "Application"), which is attached hereto and incorporated herein as **Exhibit A**; and

WHEREAS, the Applicants have proven to the Village that the real estate tax incentive that would be provided by a Class 6b Designation is necessary to ensure the continued industrial use of the Subject Property; and

WHEREAS, the Applicants have submitted an Economic Disclosure Statement to the Village; and

WHEREAS, the Corporate Authorities have determined that the Applicants have occupied the Subject Property for at least ten (10) years prior to the date of the Application and find that the circumstances described in the Application supports a determination of hardship for the Applicants and therefore, these special circumstances establish that the Subject Property is qualified for Class 6b Designation under the SER program; and

WHEREAS, the Corporate Authorities have further determined that a Class 6b Designation is necessary for the Applicants to continue operations at the Subject Property and maintain its staff, and that without a Class 6b Designation, the Applicants' business would not be viable, which would cause the Subject Property to be in imminent risk of becoming vacant and unused; and, therefore, the industrial use of the Subject Property is necessary for and beneficial to the Village's economy; and

WHEREAS, the Corporate Authorities have determined that approving a Class 6b Designation for the Subject Property is in the best interests of the Village because it will, among other things, aid the Village in: (1) eliminating the blight factors and characteristics associated with the area; (2) facilitating the redevelopment of the area, (3) improving the environment of the Village, (4) increasing economic activity within the Village, (5) increasing employment opportunities within the Village, (6) producing increased tax revenues for the various taxing districts authorized to levy taxes on the Subject Property, and (7) furthering the growth of the Village; and

WHEREAS, based on the foregoing, the Corporate Authorities hereby approve, support and consent to the Application for a Class 6b Designation under the SER program for the Subject Property being submitted to and approved by the Cook County Assessor;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Board of Trustees of the Village of Steger, Counties of Cook and Will and State of Illinois as follows:

SECTION 1: The Corporate Authorities hereby find that all of the statements set forth in the preamble to this Ordinance are full, true and correct and do hereby, by reference, incorporate and make them part of this Ordinance as legislative findings.

SECTION 2: The Corporate Authorities hereby find that the incentive benefits provided by the Class 6b Designation under the SER program are necessary for the Applicants to continue operations at the Subject Property and maintain its staff, and that without a Class 6b Designation, the Applicants' business would not be viable, which would cause the Subject Property to be in imminent risk of becoming vacant and unused; and therefore, the industrial use of the Subject Property is necessary and beneficial to the local economy. The Corporate Authorities hereby approve, support and consent to a Class 6b Designation for the Subject Property and the Application being submitted to the Assessor. The Mayor is hereby authorized and directed to execute, and the Village Clerk is hereby authorized and directed to attest to, countersign and affix the Seal of the Village to any or all such documentation as may be necessary to carry out and effectuate the purpose of this Ordinance. The officers, employees and/or agents of the Village, shall take all action necessary or reasonably required to carry out, give effect to and effectuate the intent of this Ordinance.

SECTION 3: The headings of the sections, paragraphs and subparagraphs of this Ordinance are inserted solely for the convenience of reference and form no substantive part of this Ordinance, nor should they be used in any interpretation or construction of any substantive provision of this Ordinance. The provisions of this Ordinance are hereby declared to be severable. If any part of this Ordinance is held to be invalid or determined to conflict with any law, statute, or regulation by a court of competent jurisdiction, that portion shall be stricken from this Ordinance and the remaining portions of this Ordinance shall continue in full force and effect to the fullest extent possible.

SECTION 4: All prior actions of the Village's officials, employees and agents with respect to the subject matter of this Ordinance are hereby expressly ratified.

SECTION 5: All ordinances, resolutions, rules and orders, or parts thereof, in conflict herewith are, to the extent of such conflict, hereby superseded.

SECTION 6: This Ordinance shall be immediately in full force and effect after passage, approval and publication. A full, true and complete copy of this Ordinance shall be published in pamphlet form as provided by the Illinois Municipal Code, as amended.
