MINUTES OF THE PUBLIC HEARING BEFORE THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF STEGER, WILL & COOK COUNTIES, ILLINOIS

The Public Hearing convened at 6:45 P.M. on this 5th day of February 2024 in the Municipal Building of the Village of Steger, Illinois. Mayor Peterson called the meeting to order and led all in attendance in the Pledge of Allegiance to the flag.

Village Clerk Joseph M. Zagone, Jr. called the roll. The following Trustees were present, Thurmond, Lopez, Stewart, Trotier, Joyce and Perchinski. Mayor Peterson was present.

Mayor Peterson announced that this is a PUBLIC HEARING REGARDING THE PROPOSED ANNUAL APPROPRIATION ORDINANCE FOR THE FISCAL YEAR BEGINNING JANUARY 1, 2024 AND A CERTIFIED ESTIMATE OF REVENUES BY SOURCE.

Mayor Peterson asked for public comment. Hearing none, Mayor Peterson asked for comments from the Village Board.

Trustee Thurmond presented several questions to the Village Administrator regarding salary of office manager, the bus salary, the Union Avenue project, training for staff. Trustee Thurmond questioned the \$10,000 increase in the Admin Code. Village Administrator Seehausen explained where those increased are and where they can be found. Trustee Thurmond questioned how we are budgeted on Village Events. The events have been budgeted on what has been raised in the past so as not to be a burden on the Village. Trustee Thurmond questioned the 50/50 sidewalk program. Funds not used last year do not carry over. Mayor Peterson explained the workings of items like this including funds not spent on projects like the Water tower repair. Trustee Thurmond questioned if we know how much repairs will be on the Ladder Truck. The repair is somewhere in the area of \$15,000 and is in the budget.

Trustee Lopez: I have one question in regard to the allocation for EMA. Village Administrator Seehausen stated that Public Safety is only split between Fire and Police. EMA does not have its own Trustee. EMA falls within the realm of Public Safety, but EMA is funded through the General Fund.

Trustee Joyce questioned other incomes including cable franchise taxes, is there a reason why they dropped? Village Administrator Seehausen stated that it is based on how it is collected through the state.

Trustee Lopez stated that a lot of the time we budget for something, many times we don't spend that money and we stay within our allocation. I only wish we get more up to date monthly budget reviews. That will be my goal moving forward.

Governmental Consulting Solutions, Inc., a bipartisan lobbying firm that presented an overview of help they are able to provide the Village of Steger in acquiring help on all levels through legislatures in the State of Illinois. They offered a look at their experience and successes for other communities. They would work closely with our state representatives in finding aid to the Village on all levels. Trustees questioned the representatives. Mayor Peterson gave a vast overview of reasons why the Village of Steger could benefit from this opportunity.

Trustee Stewart made a motion to adopt ORDINANCE NO. 1312: ANNUAL APPROPRIATION ORDINANCE OF THE VILLAGE OF STEGER, ILLINOIS, FOR THE FISCAL YEAR BEGINNING JANUARY 1, 2024, AND ENDING DECEMBER 31, 2024. Trustee Lopez seconded the motion. Roll was called. The following Trustees voted aye; Lopez, Stewart, Trotier, Joyce and Perchinski. Mayor Peterson voted aye. Trustee Thurmond abstained. Motion carried.

Trustee Perchinski made a motion to deny ORDINANCE NO. 1313: AN ORDINANCE APPROVING AND AUTHORIZING A CONSULTING SERVICES AGREEMENT BY AND BETWEEN THE VILLAGE OF STEGER, AND GOVERNMENT CONSULTING SOLUTIONS, INC. Trustee Thurmond seconded the motion. Roll was called. The following Trustees voted aye; Thurmond, Lopez and Perchinski. Trustees Stewart, Trotier and Joyce voted no. Mayor Peterson voted no. Motion failed.

Trustee Stewart made a motion to adopt ORDINANCE NO. 1313: AN ORDINANCE APPROVING AND AUTHORIZING A CONSULTING SERVICES AGREEMENT BY AND BETWEEN THE VILLAGE OF STEGER, AND GOVERNMENT CONSULTING SOLUTIONS, INC. Trustee Trotier seconded the motion.

Discussion: Trustee Perchinski pointed out that we had a guy named Al Ronen working for us. We must have put \$240,000 in that guys pocket and he never did anything for us. This is nothing personal against these people, but in my eyes, lobbyist are the scourge of government. Mayor Peterson acknowledged Trustee Perchinski's opinion. Trustee Perchinski: and we do have representation through SSSMA. Mayor Peterson acknowledged that representation but said it does not single out the Village of Steger, and we have specific needs especially where it relates to our drainage. We need money and we need to fight for that. We need to get through the red tape at the IDNR to get the money that appears to be available. Trustee Stewart: I'll back you up on that Mayor, if you don't have a lobbyist that is working for you directly, Trustee Perchinski: that's what our representatives do. Trustee Stewart: We need someone in Springfield working for us, and if this firm does not produce, their contract will not be renewed next year.

Roll was called. The following Trustees voted aye; Thurmond, Stewart, Trotier and Joyce. Trustees Lopez and Perchinski voted no. Mayor Peterson voted aye. Motion carried.

Village Administrator Seehausen introduced Henry Haddad to present for the board the concept for his new restaurant/store at the corner of Chicago Rd and Steger Rd. Henry is in front of the board to see if the board is good with the concept before he puts a lot of money into it.

Mr. Haddad presented his plans for the venture. The plans call for sit down restaurant with a drive-thru, a small specialty store with top shelf liquor. The project would include a gaming room. Trustee Perchinski mentioned concerns with past interactions with neighbors in the past. Trustee Thurmond questioned the drive-thru plans and the liquor license. Trustee Trotier questioned the quality of the food to be served and what is the look and décor planned for the facility.

Trustee Perchinski made a motion to table a new Business Application from Henry Haddad for the Corner Store/County Line Grill at 3345 Chicago Rd. in Steger, IL. Trustee Joyce seconded the motion but added: Henry, put a business plan together with a floor plan and what you want to do. Mayor Peterson explained concerns that exist on the board and want to know more about what is planned for the restaurant.

Mr. Haddad passed out drawings and plans that laid out what he plans to do with the property. Trustee Perchinski stated he wants assurances that Henry will be a good neighbor. After reviewing the plans distributed to the board:







- 2.4 Customer shall maintain information security measures to safeguard Customer's Access Equipment and Placer Data in Customer's possession, including appropriate physical, technical, and organizational measures to ensure the security of such data. Such measures shall include, but not be limited to, the highest degree of care that Customer utilizes to safeguard its own sensitive data, which shall be no less than industry standard security measures in any event.
- 2.5 Customer shall maintain accurate and complete records relating to its use of Placer Data during the Term and for a period of one (1) year thereafter. Placer or its designee(s) may, at any time upon not less than ten (10) business days' notice to Customer, examine such records of Customer (and its affiliates and contractors, if any are permitted to use Placer Data) related to Customer's and any such parties' use of Placer Data ("Audit"). Customer will cooperate fully, and cause its affiliates and contractors to cooperate fully, with any such Audit(s) and will provide all records, data, documentation, and other information reasonably requested by Placer. The Audit(s) will be conducted during normal business hours, and at Placer's expense; provided however if such Audit reveals misuse of Placer Data by Customer, then Customer will bear the cost of such Audit, without limiting any other rights or remedies that Placer may have with respect to any such misuse of Placer Data.

3. PROPRIETARY RIGHTS

- 3.1 Placer shall own and retain all right, title and interest in and to (a) the Services and Placer Data, and all improvements, enhancements or modifications thereto, (b) any software, applications, inventions or other technology developed in connection with supporting the foregoing, and (c) all intellectual property rights related to any of the foregoing. No licenses are granted by estoppel or by implication.
- 3.2 Customer may provide feedback to Placer in respect of the Services or Placer Data. Feedback may include, without limitation, updates to or corrections of Placer Data (e.g., a retail store may have moved or may have been closed). Placer may use any such feedback to improve the Services or for other purposes, without any obligation to Customer.
- 3.3 In the course of using the Services, Customer may upload data (e.g., Customer's customer data) to the Services. Such uploaded data is referred to herein as "Customer Data". Customer hereby grants Placer a nonexclusive, worldwide, royalty-free, perpetual, irrevocable, sublicensable and transferable right to use, modify, reproduce, distribute, prepare derivative works of, display and perform Customer Data (including all related intellectual property rights) in an aggregated and de-identified format ("Anonymized Customer Data") in connection with the Services. Customer also hereby grants each user of the Services a non-exclusive license to access Anonymized Customer Data through the Services, and to use, modify, reproduce, distribute, prepare derivative works of, display and perform such Anonymized Customer Data as permitted through the functionality of the Services. For clarity, the foregoing license grant to Placer and users of the Services does not affect Customer's ownership of Customer Data. Placer reserves the right to remove any Customer Data and/or Anonymized Customer Data from the Services at any time for any reason. Customer, not Placer, remains solely responsible for all Customer Data that Customer uploads, posts, emails, transmits, or otherwise disseminates using, or in connection with, the Services, and Customer represents and warrants that Customer possesses all rights necessary to provide such Customer Data to Placer and to grant the rights to use such Customer Data as provided herein.

4. WARRANTY AND DISCLAIMER

4.1 Placer shall use reasonable efforts consistent with prevailing industry standards to provide access to the Services and Placer Data. Access may be temporarily unavailable for scheduled maintenance or for unscheduled emergency maintenance, either by Placer or by third-party providers, or because of other causes beyond Placer's reasonable control, but Placer shall use reasonable efforts to provide advance notice, by posting in the Services, email, or otherwise, of any scheduled service disruption. PLACER DOES NOT WARRANT THAT ACCESS TO THE SERVICES OR PLACER DATA WILL BE UNINTERRUPTED OR ERROR FREE; NOR DOES IT MAKE ANY WARRANTY AS TO THE RESULTS THAT MAY BE OBTAINED FROM USE OF THE SERVICES OR PLACER DATA.

- 4.2 Placer Data shall not include (i) any personally identifiable data, including but not limited to, name, email address, address or any other personal identifier ("Personal Data"), nor (ii) any sensitive data, including but not limited to Personal Data relating to social security numbers and other government identifiers, information relating to health or medical conditions, and information relating to sex life or sexual orientation, political opinions, and financial account numbers ("Sensitive Data").
- Placer represents and warrants that to its knowledge the Services and Placer Data do not infringe the intellectual property rights of any third party and comply with applicable laws and regulations. EXCEPT AS EXPRESSLY SET FORTH IN THIS SECTION 4, THE SERVICES AND PLACER DATA ARE PROVIDED "AS IS" AND PLACER DISCLAIMS ALL WARRANTIES, EXPRESS OR IMPLIED, INCLUDING, BUT NOT LIMITED TO, WARRANTIES OF MERCHANTABILITY AND FITNESS FOR A PARTICULAR PURPOSE AND NON-INFRINGEMENT. PLACER DATA ARE COMPILED BASED ON PROPRIETARY ALGORITHMS, AND PLACER DOES NOT WARRANT THAT ALL DATA SHALL BE COMPLETE AND ACCURATE. FURTHER, PLACER MAKES NO WARRANTY AS TO THE RESULTS THAT MAY BE OBTAINED FROM USE OF THE SERVICES OR PLACER DATA. Without limiting the foregoing disclaimer, Customer acknowledges and agrees that Placer Data consist of and represent the result of statistical inferences. Placer is not a backup service, and Customer is solely responsible for creating any backups of data provided by Placer. Placer is not responsible for decisions made by Customer based on Placer Data.

5. INDEMNITY

Placer shall defend, indemnify and hold Customer harmless from liability to third parties resulting from infringement by Placer's provision of Placer Data of any United States patent or any copyright or misappropriation of any trade secret. Placer shall additionally defend, indemnify, and hold Customer hamless from any claims, losses, or liabilities arising out of or related to the infringement of privacy rights. This indemnification obligation shall apply regardless of whether the alleged infringement occurs during or after the term of this Agreement. The foregoing obligations do not apply with respect to any portions or components of Placer Data (i) that are created, compiled, or modified by any party other than Placer, (ii) combined with other products, processes, data, or materials where the alleged infringement relates to such combination, (iii) where Customer continues allegedly infringing activity after being notified thereof or after being informed of alternatives that would have avoided the alleged infringement, or (iv) where Customer's use of Placer Data is not strictly in accordance with this Agreement. If, due to a claim of infringement, Placer Data are held by a court of competent jurisdiction to be or are believed by Placer to be infringing, Placer may, at its option (a) obtain for Customer a license to continue using Placer Data or (b) terminate the Order Form and Customer's rights thereunder and provide Customer a refund of any prepaid, unused fees for Placer Data.

This Agreement is not assignable, transferable or sublicensable by either party except with the other party's prior written consent provided, however, that no consent shall be required for any assignment in connection with a Sale of Business (as defined below). The following will survive any termination of this Agreement and Order Form: Sections 2.1, 2.4, 2.5, 3.1, 3.2, 4 through 8 of this Agreement.
