- 3/23 Disturbance – 3507 Chicago Rd. (Shell /Circle K Gas Station). Patron prepaid for gas. The credit was put on a different pump, which upset the subject. The patron went inside the store and created a disturbance by yelling profanity, and threatening staff. Staff refunded the account and requested the subject be trespassed from the business. Police served a trespass notice to the subject.
- 3/23 Disorderly Conduct, Trespass – 3327 Chicago Rd. (Glass Tap). Staff told police there were two subjects in the bar harassing the customers and requested the subjects be trespassed from the business. Police located the subjects and issued Trespass Notices to the individuals, peace restored.
- 3/23 Domestic Battery – 300 Block of W. 34th St. Victim told police her boyfriend grabbed her by the hair and threw her to the ground, punched her in the face and stomach. Charges pending.
- 3/24 Traffic Arrest – 34th & S. Kings Rd. Trever E. Curry, 31 of Park Forest was arrested for Driving While License Suspended, Operation of Uninsured Motor Vehicle, and Speeding (57 mph in a posted 35 mph zone). Curry was cited and released. The offender's vehicle was towed and impounded.
- 3/25 Theft – 3500 Block of Halsted Blvd. The victim reported he placed a clothes dryer against his garage, intending to move it to a different location. Offender(s) unknown removed the clothes dryer without his permission.
- 3/25 Criminal Trespass – 300 Block of W. 34th St. Victim viewed his ex-girlfriend in his apartment, via security camera. His ex-girlfriend gained access through an unsecured window. The resident did not give his ex-girlfriend permission to be in his residence, and wanted her removed. Police escorted the subject out of the residence. Prosecution declined.

- 3/26 Identity Theft – 0-100 Block of W. 35th St. Victim reported she was notified by the Illinois Department of Human Services that someone has been using her social security number. Referred to the Social Security Administration. TOT Investigations.
- 3/26 Criminal Damage to Property – 3400 Block of Florence Ave. Offender unknown damaged the victim's Hyundai by throwing a brick through the rear window. The vehicle was parked on the roadway at the time of the incident.
- 3/27 Recovered Stolen Motor Vehicle – 3200 Block of Halsted. A Dodge Ram reported stolen out of Robbins was recovered. TOT Robbins P.D.
- 3/27 Traffic Arrest – 35th & Emerald Ave. Christopher W. Sendra, 42 of Crete was arrested for Driving While License Revoked and Improper Lane Usage. Sendra was cited and released. The offender's vehicle was towed and impounded.
- 3/27 Traffic Arrest – 3401 Chicago Rd. (7-Eleven). Keith Sowell, 36 of Park Forest was arrested for Driving under the Influence of Alcohol. Police were dispatched to the area for a single vehicle crash. A vehicle driven by Sowell left the roadway striking the building. Both Sowell and 35 year old female passenger were transported to St. James Olympia Fields Hospital for minor injuries. Sowell's Blood Alcohol Concentration was over double the legal limit. Sowell was processed, cited and released. The offender's vehicle was towed and impounded.
- 3/28 Fraud – 23 W. 34th St. Victim told police she sent a money order, via United States Post Office to her landlord. After checking with her bank, she discovered someone altered the money order and cashed it. TOT U.S. Postal inspector.
- 3/29 Domestic Battery – 300 Block of W. 35th St. Victim told police she was involved in a verbal altercation with her boyfriend. The altercation escalated and her boyfriend grabbed her wrist and threw her to the ground. The victim's boyfriend was gone upon police arrival. TOT Investigations.
- 3/29 Fraud – 3000 Block of Carpenter St. Victim received a pop up on her computer that she believed was sent from Microsoft. She called the number provided and was told that she had been hacked. The offender(s) told her they could fix the damage and requested the victim send them Bitcoin. The victim complied and sent the Bitcoin. Information was provided to put alerts on the victim's credit cards.
