Treasurer Mayor Joyce announced that we do have July and August finance reports that just came out. They were turned over to our Finance Department, so those will be reported on at the next Board meeting.

Fire Chief Mike Long Our Ambulances, thanks to a donation from Silver Cross Hospital are now carrying Ben's Blue Bags, which are filled with items for dealing with Autistic Children. Our Pancake Breakfast is coming up the end of the month, November 30th. It will run from 7 am until Noon. Raffle tickets should be going out in the mail soon.

Police Chief Greg Smith We had a pistol qualification which was a make-up from earlier in the year. Two special events we worked on were St. Liborius Trunk or Treat and the Village Bon fire and Fire Works. We received the Less Lethal Device Grant in the amount of \$17,926.82 due to great work by Deputy Chief Fajman and Sgt. Hillman.

Assistant Superintendent of Public Works Roy Stone Public Works continues with day to day operations which includes: mowing, locates, work orders. We will be out patching pot holes, trimming back as well as repairing some catch basins. Plow truck repairs are ongoing, since the last meeting we have had two water main breaks. The Water tower project should be complete before the next board meeting.

Community Center Director Christine Meyer reported our Halloween Party didn't get quite as big as it has been, but we still made 120 kids happy. We took the leftover food and donated it to Outreach which fed some seniors. I would like to thank Public Works for making me have light. It is bright out there, thank you so much. We have basketball and volleyball coming up. Our Cartwheel Club is starting up again and still going strong.

Parks and Recreation No report.

EMA Chief Jason Stevenson We were out all night for Halloween from 2 pm to the end. Trick or Treating, the bonfire and fireworks all went really well.

Code Enforcement My report for October, for the two weeks I have been here, I have done 35 Re-Occupancy Inspections, 25 Stop Work tickets and 40 warning tickets for grass and weeds, etc.

MAYORS REPORT I want to thank Public Works, the Fire Department, ESDA, Code Enforcement, the Police Department and Village Hall Staff for getting everything together for the Halloween Event last Friday. Trick or Treating went well, we had no reported incidents around town. The event at the park would not have been possible without all those departments that came out. I also want to thank Helsel-Jepperson, We Got You Covered, Dogz on the Run, Bambino's, Frank Elton, the Kiwanis Club, the American Legion for all their support and donations in making it successful. I want to thank Johnny Rockets for taking care of the fireworks for us. I think it was a wonderful display. At last count we were over 900 people in the park and the surrounding areas were completely full. So it was a good event and there were no incidents.

NEW BUSINESS

Trustee Thurmond made a motion to adopt ORDINANCE NO. 1342: AN ORDINANCE CREATING A NEW CHAPTER OF THE VILLAGE CODE TO REGULATE THE USE OF NON-HIGHWAY VEHICLES WITHIN THE VILLAGE OF STEGER, ILLINOIS. Trustee Stewart seconded the motion. Roll was called. The following Trustees voted aye; Hanus, Kaminski, Stewart, Thurmond and Trotier. Motion carried.

Mayor Joyce: So, what this Ordinance is, for the public, this is the Ordinance we were talking about for off road vehicles, mini bikes, E-bikes, golf carts, this ordinance gives the Police Department powers to enforce that they did not have before. It gives powers to impound vehicles and require that whoever is the responsible party has to pay to get them back. It also power to hold the parents responsible for a child's actions. Now that this is passed, this will be printed out in pamphlet form, it will be posted in a local newspaper and after being in the public for 10 days, it will then take affect.

Mayor Joyce: In going through and working with finance, we have multiple roads that are in very poor shape. Some are much worse than others. In going through this, we do have the opportunity to get a couple roads done before this winter. The asphalt plants close in three weeks. Currently we have 18 roads that are on the poor scale that need to be done. We have gotten bids for the 3200 block of Florence which is currently the worst road. The bids came in at \$49,000 with Holland, \$44,000 with D. Anderson and Iroquois Paving for \$42,000. The work will be completed before the end of the season which is in three weeks. The other bid that we got was from Iroquois Paving, they were the low bidder on the other two. We asked for a quote for milling and resurfacing of Kings Road from 35th Street to just south of Richton Road at the Village Limit which came in at \$102,000. I am asking for tentative approval for the Iroquois bid, I will ask the other two for quotes, but it is unlikely they will beat this price. That will be contingent on the STP Funds that were supposed to be used for Kings Road. The paperwork was not completed and the money was not received from those grants in the fiscal year 2024-25. I am going to ask for an extension, but if we are not allowed to get the extension or if the money is gone, I would like to go forward with repaving it before winter. Roy, can you explain the two roads please?

Roy Stone: The 3200 block of Florence, from 32nd Street to 33rd Street, and Kings Road will be from 35th Street across Richton Road past Pagoria's to the Village Limit Line. The Mayor asked for any discussion.

Trustee Trotier: So do we have to get a bond?

Mayor Joyce: We do not. We have money in the Motor Fuel Tax Fund that will cover both of these projects. It will not empty the account.

Mayor Joyce asked the Village Attorney if we are okay to go forward with the Florence Ave. project with 3 bids. Village Attorney: Yes you are.

Trustee Thurmond made a motion to approve the resurfacing of the 3200 block of Florence Ave. Trustee Kaminski seconded the motion. Roll was called. The following Trustees voted aye; Hanus, Kaminski, Stewart, Thurmond and Trotier. Motion carried.

Mayor Joyce: Now I am asking for tentative approval, I will get the documentation from the other two asphalt companies to go with the low bidder if the STP Funds are not available to the Village of Steger any longer.

Trustee Thurmond made a motion to tentative approval the resurfacing of Kings Rd. from 35th St. south to the Village limit. Trustee Kaminski seconded the motion. Roll was called. The following Trustees voted aye; Hanus, Kaminski, Stewart, Thurmond and Trotier. Motion carried.

**AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 1342 TO CORRECT
THE REFERENCE TO THE CREATION OF ARTICLE 18 OF CHAPTER 82
OF THE VILLAGE CODE OF THE VILLAGE OF STEGER, ILLINOIS**

WHEREAS, the Village of Steger, located in the Counties of Cook and Will, State of Illinois (the “Village”), is a duly organized and existing non-home rule municipality and unit of local government, established and operating under the Constitution and laws of the State of Illinois, including the Illinois Municipal Code (65 ILCS 5/1-1-1 *et seq.*), as amended, and other applicable laws; and

WHEREAS, the President and Board of Trustees of the Village (collectively, the “Corporate Authorities”) adopted Ordinance No. 1342 entitled AN ORDINANCE CREATING A NEW CHAPTER OF THE VILLAGE CODE TO REGULATE THE USE OF NON-HIGHWAY VEHICLES WITHIN THE VILLAGE OF STEGER, ILLINOIS on November 3, 2025 (the “Ordinance”); and

WHEREAS, Section 2 of the Ordinance inadvertently referred to the creation of a “new Chapter” of the Municipal Code of Steger, Illinois (the “Village Code”) without specifying that the new provisions were intended to be codified as Article 18 of Chapter 82 of the Village Code; and

WHEREAS, the Corporate Authorities find it necessary and appropriate to correct this scrivener’s error to ensure accurate codification of the Ordinance within Chapter 82 of the Village Code;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the President and Board of Trustees of the Village of Steger, Counties of Cook and Will, State of Illinois, as follows:

Section 1. Incorporation of Recitals. The foregoing recitals are hereby adopted as the findings of fact of the President and Board of Trustees and are incorporated herein as though fully set forth.

Section 2. Amendment. Section 2 of Ordinance No. 1342 is hereby amended to read as follows:

“Section 2. Creation of New Code Article. A new Article 18 of Chapter 82 of the Municipal Code of Steger, Illinois is hereby created and established. The full text of said Article 18 of Chapter 82 is set forth in Exhibit 1, which is attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference as though fully set forth in this Ordinance.”

Section 3. Repeal of Conflicting Provisions. All ordinances, resolutions, motions, rules, regulations, policies, or parts thereof, that conflict with the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict, effective as of the effective date of this Ordinance.

Section 4. Severability. If any provision of this Ordinance or its application to any person, property or circumstance is held invalid, such invalidity shall not affect other provisions or applications of this Ordinance which can be given effect without the invalid provision or application.

Section 5. Effective Date. This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage, approval, and publication as required by law.

D. Every electric bicycle used during night hours shall be equipped with:

1. Front Lamp that emits white light visible from a distance of 500 feet to the front; and
2. A rear red reflector visible from 100 to 600 feet when illuminated by lawful lower-beam headlights of a motor vehicle, or a steady or flashing rear red lamp visible from at least 500 feet to the rear.
3. All electric bicycle operators shall comply with all applicable provisions of the State of Illinois Rules of the Road regulation governing bicycle usage.
4. All class 3 low-speed electric bicycles are prohibited from operation on any bike trails, walking or running trails or any other similar recreation trails within the village.
5. A person shall not operate an electric bicycle upon any public street or highway within the Village while under the influence of alcohol, controlled substances or other intoxicating substances.
6. Every electric bicycle operated within the Village shall be maintained in safe and good operating condition, free from defects that could endanger persons or property.

.06 Impoundment of Regulated Vehicles

Authority to Impound. Steger Police Department or any law enforcement officer acting within the Village is authorized to impound regulated vehicles that are operated or parked or otherwise used in violation of this Chapter or provisions by the IVC, or that constitutes a public safety hazard or nuisance, or an obstruction to traffic or pedestrians.

.07 Parental Liability

A. It shall be unlawful for any parent, legal guardian, other person in custody or control of a minor to permit, authorize, allow or acquiesce in the operation of an electric bicycle by such minor in violation of any provision of this chapter, or to negligently fail to exercise reasonable care to prevent such operation or use.


.08 Violation and Penalty

- A. Any person who violates any provision of this Chapter shall, upon conviction be subject to a fine not less than \$50.00 1st Offense, \$150.00 2nd Offense, \$750.00 3rd Offense.
- B. Any parent, legal guardian or other person having custody/control of a minor who violates this Chapter shall be deemed to have committed a separate offense and shall be subject to the same penalties as provided herein.

LOWSPEED ELECTRIC BICYCLE/BIKES:

A bicycle or bike as defined in Section 11-1517 of the Illinois Vehicle Code (625 ILCS 5/11-1517), equipped with fully operable pedals and an electric motor of less than 750 watts (1 h.p.) and classified as follows.

Class 1 E-Bike – A low-speed electric bicycle equipped with a motor that provides assistance only when the rider is pedaling and that ceases to provide assistance when the bicycle reaches a speed of 30 miles per hour.

Class 2 E-Bike – A low-speed electric bicycle equipped with a motor that can propel the bicycle exclusively by its motor, but ceases to provide assistance when the bicycle reaches a speed of 20 miles per hour.

Class 3 E-Bike – A low-speed electric bicycle equipped with a motor that provides assistance only when the rider is pedaling and that ceases to provide assistance when the bicycle reaches a speed of 28 miles per hour.

The term “Low-Speed Electric Bicycle” may also be referred to as an “Electric-Bike” or “E-Bike”

Low-Speed Electric Bicycle (E-Bikes)

The operation of an electric bicycle within the Village of Steger is permitted, provided that such operation complies with the following conditions and limitations:

A. All electric bicycles operated within the Village shall comply with equipment and manufacturing requirements established by the United States Consumer Product Safety Commission under 16 C.F.R. 1512 and 625 ILCS 5/11-1517(b) and (c). No person shall knowingly tamper with or modify an electric bicycle so as to alter the motor speed capability or engagement threshold without replacing the label required under 625 ILCS 5/11-1517(c) to accurately reflect the modified classification


B. A person shall not operate an electric bicycle upon any public street, parking lot right-of-way, sidewalk, bike trail, walking trail, nature trail or recreation area without a valid driver's license.

Driver's License Required



C. A person shall not operate an electric bicycle on any public street where the posted speed limit is 30 miles per hour or greater.

Cannot operate E-Bikes on streets with a 30 MPH or greater speed limit!



- These streets include but are not limited to:
- Chicago Rd.
- Steger Rd. / 34th St. / W. 231st St.
- Union Ave.
- State St.
- Sauk Trail
- Parts of Richton Rd.

H. In a manner that creates loud, unnecessary noise that disrupts or interferes with the peace and quiet of other people.

I. It shall be unlawful for any parent or legal guardian of a minor to permit, authorize, or negligently fail to prevent the operation of a non-highway vehicle by such minor in violation of this chapter. A parent or legal guardian of a minor who violates this subsection shall be guilty violating this Chapter and shall be liable for all resulting injuries to persons or damage to property.

J. It shall be unlawful for any person to cause, authorize or knowingly permit a motor vehicle, including a motor driven cycle, owned or under such person's control to be operated on any public street, sidewalks, school grounds, park property, parking lots, playgrounds, bike & walking paths, nature trails, recreational areas, and golf courses in violation of the Illinois Vehicle Code or the Village Code.

K. Exemptions.

1. Non-highway vehicle used by first responders, authorized personnel of another governmental body, or other persons authorized by the Village are exempt from the conditions of this Chapter when operation is necessary in the performance of their official duties.

2. Motorized wheelchairs and other mobility devices used by people with disabilities are exempt from the provisions of this Chapter.

06 Impoundment of Regulated Vehicles

A. **Authority to Impound.** The Village Police Department or any law enforcement officer acting within the Village are authorized to impound any regulated vehicle that is operated, parked or otherwise used in violation of this Chapter or any provision of the Illinois Vehicle Code, or that constitutes a public safety hazard or nuisance, or an obstruction to traffic or pedestrians.

B. Grounds for Impoundment:

1. Operator arrested or cited for violation of this chapter or Illinois Vehicle Code, and regulated vehicle cannot be safely or lawfully driven from the scene.

2. When regulated vehicle is operated recklessly or in a manner endangering persons or property.

3. When the operator is under the influence of alcohol, controlled substances, or other intoxicating compounds.

4. When the regulated vehicle is operated without a valid driver's license or in violation of any age restriction established by this Chapter.

5. Regulated vehicle is operated or parked upon public or private property without authorization.

6. Regulated vehicle is abandoned, unclaimed, or determined to be unsafe for operation.

C. Towing and Storage:

Impounded regulated vehicles shall be towed, transported, and stored by a licensed towing or storage facility authorized by the Village. The owner or operator shall be responsible for all towing, transportation and storage charges.

D. **Notice of Impoundment:** The Police Department shall make reasonable efforts to notify the owner of the regulated vehicle. E. **Release of Regulated Vehicle:**

1. Provide proof of ownership
2. Pay all applicable towing and storage fees
3. Pay any fines, penalties, or administrative costs imposed under this Chapter or other applicable ordinances.

Non-Highway Vehicles

All-Terrain Vehicle (ATV): A motorized off-highway device designed to travel primarily off-highway, 50 inches or less in width, having a manufacturer's dry weight of 1,500 pounds or less, traveling on three or more non-highway tires, designed with seat or saddle for operator use, and handlebars or steering wheel for steering control.

Golf Cart: A vehicle specifically designed and intended for the purpose of transporting one or more persons and their golf clubs or maintenance equipment while engaged in the playing of golf, supervising the play of golf, or maintaining the condition of the grounds on a public or private golf course.

Low-Speed Electric Scooters/Electric Scooter/E-Scooter: A device weighting less than 100 pounds with 2 or 3 wheels, handlebars, and a floorboard designed to be stood upon while riding, that is powered primarily by an electric motor and human power, and whose maximum speed, with or without human propulsion, on a paved level surface is not more than 10 miles per hour.

Low-Speed Electric Scooter: See Low-Speed Electric Bicycle Brochure.

Motorized Play Vehicle: Any device that, together with its operator, passenger, or load, is propelled in whole or in part by a motor engine. Is not designed, manufactured, or licensed for on-road use. The term includes but not limited to motorized skateboards, motorized unicycles, hover boards, go-carts, mini-bikes, and similar devices providing a platform or seat for an operator or passenger. The term does not include non-highway vehicles, low-speed electric bicycles, low-speed electric scooters, or mobility devices used by people with disabilities.

Non-Highway Vehicle: A motor vehicle not specifically designed to be used on a public highway, including all-terrain vehicles, golf carts, dune buggies, off-highway motorcycles, motor driven cycles, and recreational off-highway vehicles.

Off-Highway Motorcycle: Any motorized device designed to travel primarily off-highway on two wheels, having a seat or saddle for the use of the operator, upon or by which any person or property may be transported or drawn; also known as a dirt-bike.

Recreational Off-Highway Vehicle: A motorized off-highway device designed to travel primarily off-highway, 64 inches or less in width, having a manufacturer's dry weight of 2,000 pounds or less for gas-powered engine or 3,000 pounds or less for electric-powered engines, traveling on four or more non-highway tires, designated with a non-straddle seat and a steering wheel for steering control. This term excludes equipment such as lawnmowers.

Regulated Vehicle: A regulated vehicle means any non-highway vehicle, low-speed electric bicycle, low-speed electric scooter, or motorized play vehicle, as defined in this section.

.02 Operation of Non-Highway-Vehicles

It shall be unlawful for any person to operate, drive or be in actual physical control of a non-highway vehicle within the Village under any of the following conditions:

A. At a rate of speed that is unreasonable or improper under the existing circumstances.

B. On public property, including, but not limited to, public streets, bike paths, walking paths, nature trails, recreational areas and golf courses, without express written permission or authorization by the proper public authority.

C. Within the right-of-way of any public street or highway, unless the non-highway vehicle fully complies with applicable state laws governing motor vehicles operated on public streets and highways and the operator possesses a valid state driver's license. A non-highway vehicle may be towed on public streets in compliance with all laws related to towing.

D. On private property of another without the express written consent of the owner or lessee of the property. The absence of "No Trespassing" or similar signs at the property shall not imply consent for non-highway vehicle use.

E. In careless, reckless or negligent manner so as to endanger the safety of any person or property of any other person. Reckless Driving (625 ILCS 5/11-503).

- Operating/riding/controlling any non-highway vehicle in path of other motor vehicles, pedestrians, or bicyclists.

- Riding non-highway vehicle while clinging to any highway vehicle in a manner to interfere with vehicles, bicycle or pedestrian traffic.

F. Non-highway vehicle operated in violation of this section may be towed and/or impounded by the Village. The owner may recover the vehicle by providing identification, proof of ownership, and by paying fines, and towing and impoundment fees.

G. Operating non-highway vehicle under the influence of intoxicating liquor, controlled substances, or drugs. The vehicle may be towed & impounded. The operator of such vehicle may be arrested and detained. (525 ILCS 5/11-01). The owner may recover vehicle upon paying fines and towing & impoundment fees.
