MINUTES OF THE REGULAR MEETING
OF THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE
VILLAGE OF STEGER, WILL & COOK
COUNTIES, ILLINOIS

The Board of Trustees convened in regular session at 7:00 P.M. on this 20th day of October 2025 in the Municipal Building of the Village of Steger, Illinois. Mayor Joyce led all in attendance in the Pledge of Allegiance to the flag.

The roll was called. The following Trustees were present; Hanus, Kaminski, Stewart, Thurmond, Trotier and Perchinski. Mayor Joyce was present.

Also present: Executive Administrative Assistant DaVanna Terry, Assistant Superintendent of Public Works Roy Stone, Fire Chief Mike Long, Police Chief Greg Smith, EMA Chief Jason Stevenson and Village Attorney Vlado Vranjes.

AWARDS, HONORS AND SPECIAL RECOGNITION

Village Clerk Zagone read the Proclamation honoring the life of former Village Mayor Kenneth A. Peterson.

Trustee Perchinski made a motion to adopt the Proclamation honoring Kenneth A. Peterson, Jr. and keep a permanent record of it. Trustee Thurmond seconded the motion. Voice vote; Ayes: Hanus, Kaminski, Stewart, Thurmond, Trotier and Perchinski. Motion carried.

AUDIENCE PARTICIPATION

Steve Thurmond: I was not able to submit my report in time, so I just wanted to give everyone a report on the Octoberfest Event. The final numbers came in for what the Village expenses were. \$3,513.44. For those who were questioning what the Chamber of Commerce's role was in this, they provided all of the electricity for the event, for the vendors, the band and all the other events.

Trustee Perchinski: When you say provided electricity, can you expand on that?

Mayor Joyce: All electricity came off the meter on the pole that the Chamber pays for.

Trustee Perchinski: What about the power cords, the work we did on the curbs. Is that included in this price, the painting of the Gazebo.

Mayor Joyce: The painting of the Gazebo was maintenance and power cords went to the Community Center where they will using them again for the Halloween Party.

MINUTES

Trustee Perchinski made a motion to approve the minutes of the October 6th meeting as all members have copies. Trustee Hanus seconded the motion.

Voice vote; Ayes: Hanus, Kaminski, Stewart, Thurmond, Trotier and Perchinski. Motion carried.

REPORTS

Village Administrator No report.

Village Engineer The water tower work progresses. They took a two day stoppage in the work as there was some damage found internally to the water tower that is being addressed tomorrow. Once that decision is made, then they will continue painting. Right now it is on track to be finished before Halloween.

Village Attorney No report.

Treasurer No report.

Fire Chief Mike Long For the month of September we ran a total of 181 calls, 152 of those were medical and 29 were fire. We have our annual Coloring Contest that is underway. All of the coloring books have gone out to the kids in School District 194. We will pick winners on Halloween and the winners of those will win a ride to school on a Firetruck. We will be at Trunk or Treat this Thursday and the Intermediate Center on Friday as we have been asked to be judges for their Red Ribbon Contest. We will see you all at the Bonfire and Fireworks on Halloween.

Police Chief Greg Smith Sgt Lane and Det. Hoppe attended the Homicide Conference to update their certification. For the month we had 43 warning citations, 33 State Citations, 86 local ordinances, 4 misdemeanors, 1 felony, 3 felony warrants issued, 70 case reports and 14 traffic crashes.

Mayor Joyce: Before I ask for the next report, I want to inform everyone here that Roy Stone has been named the Assistant Superintendent of Public Works for the Village of Steger.

Assistant Superintendent of Public Works Roy Stone Since the last meeting, we have had 2 water main breaks, Public Works is continuing day-to-day operations. Maintenance on the plow trucks is still in progress. Out of 4 trucks that we need for plowing and salting, one is ready to go, work will continue on the other three trucks until they are ready. The railroad crossing: there are some signs that need to be changed, paint markings need to be put down and refreshed at 31st and 35th Street crossings to stay in compliance with the Train Quiet Zone.

Community Center Director Christine Meyer reported that the Halloween Party is going well. I have everyone I need to help me. I have all the products; I just need the electrical cords. Everything will be good for the party on Saturday October 25th. Basketball and Volleyball will both be starting soon.

Parks and Recreation No report.

EMA Chief Jason Stevenson We have had 2 assists out of town, we have had 3 patrols in town. I have been working the last couple of days with Cook County Emergency Management. We are working on the multi-jurisdictional hazardous mitigation plan for our annual report which is a continuation of what I worked on with VA Seehausen last year. I am working with them right now, we need to meet and go over some questions I have. This will set us up hopefully for some grants that are out there. Last weekend we finished the first phase of the Command Unit, so we can talk about filling it now.

MAYORS REPORT I want to announce my appointment of Paul E. Myers who has accepted the position of Village Code Enforcement Officer and Building Inspector.

Sandy and Scott Maschmeyer, the owners of Crank's Kitchen introduced themselves and gave a thorough rundown of what they plan to do with their food truck and described many of the dishes that they will make available throughout the Village at events, etc.

Trustee Thurmond made a motion to approve a new Food Truck License for Cranks Kitchen at 20 E. 227th Pl. pending inspections and event approval. Trustee Stewart seconded the motion.

Trustee Perchinski made a motion to adjourn to Executive Session pursuant to Section 2 (c)(5) of the Open Meetings Act, 5 ILCS 120/2(c)(5), to discuss the purchase or lease of real property for the Village of Steger: for the purposes of discussion of the appointment, employment, compensation, discipline, performance, or dismissal of specific employees of the public body pursuant to 5 ILCS 120/2 (1). Trustee Stewart seconded the motion.

Roll was called. The following Trustees voted aye; Hanus, Kaminski, Stewart, Thurmond, Trotier and Perchinski. Motion carried.

At 8:41:

Trustee Thurmond made a motion to reconvene the regular meeting of the Steger Village Board. Trustee Perchinski seconded the motion. Roll was called. The following Trustees voted aye; Hanus, Kaminski, Stewart, Thurmond, Trotier and Perchinski. Motion carried.

Trustee Perchinski made a motion to pay the bills minus the bills for David Wheeler and any other bills to auto parts stores that he's able to sign the Village's name for.

Discussion: Trustee Perchinski: My reason behind this is not to pick on a guy, but our ordinance says that if you do work for the Village you have to have a license which includes having proper insurance, a bond and to pay for the license. We also paid a bill for gas painting who didn't have a license either. You hired David Wheeler in violation of the hiring policy of the Village of Steger. Mayor Joyce: Let's start with it's a motion that you are either going to pay the bills, or you are not going to pay the bills.

Mayor Joyce asked for a second to the motion. None was made. Motion died.

Mayor Joyce: While we are talking about paying the bills, since we are talking about one specific person, because he is my brother, Mr. Stone, can you please explain what Mr. Wheeler is doing for you and your department.

Roy Stone: So, all four of our plow trucks, salting trucks are in very bad need of a lot of work. He has come a long way with what he has started.

Trustee Perchinski: That's great, but, we have to do it the right way.

Roy Stone: So we really need to continue. I cannot comment on the rest, I am just here to do Village business. If we don't get these trucks fixed, we are going to have major problems.

Mayor Joyce: So, in that, the other places that we do business with to fix our vehicles do not have a Village license. One would be Ray and Wallys in Lynwood. We have another company, R & R comes in to work on the firetrucks in our fire house.

Trustee Perchinski: You also hired them in violation of the hiring policy.

Mayor Joyce: I am not going to disparage anybody that was here before me. I hire a man, and what I said I would do is I would hire anybody whether they were related to me or not if they are qualified for the job they were hired for.

Trustee Perchinski: Then you need to read the policy, because that is not what the policy says.

Mayor Joyce: You should have pointed that out years ago Tim. With lack of a second, there is no motion. The motion dies. Does someone want to make a motion to pay the bills?

Trustee Stewart made a motion to pay the bills as listed when funds become available. Trustee Kaminski seconded the motion. Voice vote; Ayes: Hanus, Kaminski, Stewart, Trotier. Trustee Thurmond voted no. Trustee Perchinski abstained. Motion carried.

Trustee Thurmond made a motion to adopt Ordinance No. 1340: An ordinance establishing the position of Program Coordinator. Trustee Stewart seconded the motion.

Discussion: Trustee Perchinski: I would like everyone to look at this position which will have some overlap to another position we need to fill and to combine those two positions to save the Village money. Having a secondary full time employee is an expensive idea in itself, especially when I think a competent person could take care of both of these positions, at a higher rate than either one, but I still feel it is a bet use of Village money. Trustee Trotier: I think in a perfect world, yeah, bring him on, lets get these programs started. We also know that we lack money in different departments, water main breaks, everyone knows that. Evaluating what the program director does versus, what the coordinator does, maybe it's time to re-evaluate the roles of the Community Center Director. When was the last time that was done? We should be open to reviewing that before we spend for another full time person. It's not that I don't think it is a good idea, however, it's a lot of money. Let's go back and look at what we have now, can that person do other jobs also.

Voice vote; Ayes: Hanus, Kaminski, Stewart, Thurmond. Trustees Trotier and Perchinski voted no. Motion carried.

Trustee Thurmond made a motion to adopt Ordinance No. 1341: An Ordinance establishing the salary and wages to be paid to management and non-union employees of the Village of Steger, Counties of Cook and Will in the State of Illinois. Trustee Kaminski seconded the motion. Voice vote; Ayes: Hanus, Kaminski, Stewart, Thurmond and Perchinski. Trustee Trotier voted no. Motion carried.

Being no further business:

Trustee Perchinski made a motion to adjourn the meeting.

Trustee Stewart seconded the motion to adjourn. Voice vote; all ayes. Motion carried.

**AN ORDINANCE CREATING A NEW CHAPTER OF THE VILLAGE
CODE TO REGULATE THE USE OF NON-HIGHWAY VEHICLES
WITHIN THE VILLAGE OF STEGER, ILLINOIS.**

WHEREAS, the Village of Steger, located in the Counties of Cook and Will, State of Illinois (the "Village"), is a duly organized and existing non-home rule municipality and unit of local government, established and operating under the Constitution and laws of the State of Illinois, including the Illinois Municipal Code (65 ILCS 5/1-1-1 *et seq.*), as amended, and other applicable laws; and

WHEREAS, Section 1-2-1 of the Illinois Municipal Code (65 ILCS 5/1-2-1), authorizes the corporate authorities of each municipality to adopt ordinances and make all rules and regulations necessary to carry into effect the powers granted to them by law, including the imposition of such fines and penalties as may be deemed proper; and

WHEREAS, Section 11-1426.1 of the Illinois Vehicle Code (625 ILCS 5/11-1426.1), authorizes municipalities, by ordinance, to regulate the operation of non-highway vehicles on roadways under their jurisdiction upon determining that such operation will not jeopardize public safety; and

WHEREAS, Section 11-1517 and 11-1518 of Illinois Vehicle Code (625 ILCS 5/11-1517, and 11-1518) also authorize municipalities to regulate the use of electric bicycles and electric scooters within the municipal corporate boundaries; and

WHEREAS, the President and Board of Trustees of the Village of Steger (the "Corporate Authorities") have determined that the regulation of non-highway

vehicles, including e-bikes and e-scooters, is necessary and appropriate to protect the health, safety, and welfare of Village residents and the general public, and that adoption of such regulations will not jeopardize public safety;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the President and the Board of Trustees of the Village of Steger, Counties of Cook and Will, the State of Illinois, as follows:

Section 1. Incorporation of Recitals. The foregoing recitals shall be and are hereby adopted, incorporated and made a part of this Ordinance as the findings of fact as if said recitals were fully set forth herein.

Section 2. Creation of New Code Chapter. A new Chapter ____ of the Village Code of the Village of Steger is hereby created and established. The full text of said Chapter is set forth in **Exhibit 1**, attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference as though fully set forth in this Ordinance.

Section 3. Effective Date. This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect immediately following its adoption, approval and publication as required by law.

Section 4. Repeal of Conflicting Provisions. All ordinances, resolutions, motions, rules, regulations and policies or parts thereof, in conflict with the provisions of this Ordinance are, to the extent of such conflict, hereby expressly repealed as of the effective date of this Ordinance.

Section 5. Severability. If any provision of this Ordinance or its application to any person, property or circumstance is found to be unconstitutional or otherwise invalid, such invalidity shall not affect, impair, or invalidate the remaining provisions or applications of this Ordinance, which can be given effect without the invalid provision or application, and each invalid provision or invalid application of this Ordinance is severable.

Section 6. Headings. The headings and captions identifying the various sections and subsections of this Ordinance are for reference only and do not define, modify, expand or limit any of the terms or provisions of this Ordinance and shall not be used in the interpretation of this Ordinance.

Section 7. Publication. The Village Clerk is hereby authorized and directed by the Corporate Authorities to publish this Ordinance in pamphlet form as provided by law. This Ordinance shall thereafter be in full force and effect after its passage and publication in accordance with 65 ILCS 5/1-2-4.

EXHIBIT 1

§ __.01 DEFINITIONS.

For purposes of this Chapter, the following words and phrases shall have the meanings ascribed to them below:

ALL-TERRAIN VEHICLE (ATV). A motorized off-highway device designed to travel primarily off-highway, 50 inches or less in width, having a manufacturer's dry weight of 1,500 pounds or less, traveling on three or more non-highway tires, designed with a seat or saddle for operator use, and handlebars or steering wheel for steering control. The term excludes equipment such as lawnmowers.

GOLF CART. A vehicle specifically designed and intended for the purposes of transporting one or more persons and their golf clubs or maintenance equipment while engaged in the playing of golf, supervising the play of golf, or maintaining the condition of the grounds on a public or private golf course.

LOW-SPEED ELECTRIC SCOOTERS: A device weighing less than 100 pounds, with 2 or 3 wheels, handlebars, and a floorboard designed to be stood upon while riding, that is powered primarily by an electric motor and human power, and whose maximum speed, with or without human propulsion, on a paved level surface is not more than 10 miles per hour. The term "Low-Speed Electric Scooter" may also be referred to as an "*Electric Scooter*" or "*E-Scooter*".

LOW-SPEED ELECTRIC BICYCLES/BIKES: A bicycle or bike as defined in Section 11-1517 of the Illinois Vehicle Code (625 ILCS 5/11-1517), equipped with fully operable pedals and an electric motor of less than 750 watts (1 h.p.), and classified as follows:

Class 1 E-bike – A low-speed electric bicycle equipped with a motor that provides assistance only when the rider is pedaling and that ceases to provide assistance when the bicycle reaches a speed of 20 miles per hour.

Class 2 E-bike – A low-speed electric bicycle equipped with a motor that can propel the bicycle exclusively by its motor, but ceases to provide assistance when the bicycle reaches a speed of 20 miles per hour.

Class 3 E-bike – A low-speed electric bicycle equipped with a motor that provides assistance only when the rider is pedaling and that ceases to provide assistance when the bicycle reaches a speed of 28 miles per hour.

The term "Low-Speed Electric Bicycle" may also be referred to as an "*Electric-Bike*" or "*E-Bike*".

MOTOR DRIVEN CYCLE: Any motorcycle, all-terrain vehicle, or motor scooter with less than 150 cubic centimeters piston displacement, any electric cycle or

scooter, any electric or motorized pedal cycle, or any electric or motor driven skateboard, but does not include any electric toy with a maximum speed of 4 miles per hours.

MOTORIZED PLAY VEHICLE: Any device that, together with its operator, passenger, or load, is propelled in whole or in part by a motor or engine, and that is operated or IS capable of being operated upon a highway, road, street, public parking lot, sidewalk, path, park, or other public property within the Village, but is not designed, manufactured, or licensed for on-road use. The term includes, but is not limited to, motorized skateboards, motorized unicycles, hoverboards, go-carts, mini-bikes, and similar devices providing a platform or seat for an operator or passenger. The term does not include nonhighway vehicles, low-speed electric bicycles, low-speed electric scooters, or mobility devices used by people with disabilities.

NON-HIGHWAY VEHICLE: A motor vehicle not specifically designed to be used on a public highway, including all-terrain vehicles, golf carts, dune buggies, off-highway motorcycles, motor driven cycles, and recreational off-highway vehicles.

OFF-HIGHWAY MOTORCYCLE: Any motorized device designed to travel primarily off-highway on two wheels, having a seat or saddle for the use of the operator, upon or by which any person or property may be transported or drawn;also known as a dirt-bike.

RECREATIONAL OFF-HIGHWAY VEHICLE.: A motorized off-highway device designed to travel primarily off-highway, 64 inches or less in width, having a manufacturer's dry weight of 2,000 pounds or less for gas-powered engines or 3,000 pounds or less for electric-powered engines, traveling on four or more non-highway tires, designed with a non-straddle seat and a steering wheel for steering control. This term excludes equipment such as lawnmowers.

REGULATED VEHICLE. A regulated vehicle means any non-highway vehicle, low-speed electric bicycle, low-speed electric scooter, or motorized play vehicle, as defined in this Section.

§ __.02 OPERATION OF NON-HIGHWAY VEHICLES.

It shall be unlawful for any person to operate, drive or be in actual physical control of a non-highway vehicle within the Village under any of the following conditions:

- A. At a rate of speed that is unreasonable or improper under the existing circumstances.
- B. On public property, including, but not limited to, public streets, sidewalks, school grounds, park property, parking lots, playgrounds, bike paths, walking paths,

nature trails, recreational areas and golf courses, without express written permission or authorization by the proper public authority.

- C. Within the right-of-way of any public street or highway, unless the non-highway vehicle fully complies with all applicable state laws governing motor vehicles operated on public streets and highways and the operator possesses a valid state driver's license. A non-highway vehicle may be towed on public streets in compliance with all laws related to towing.
- D. On private property of another without the express written consent of the owner or lessee of the property. The absence of "No Trespassing" or similar signs at the property shall not imply consent for non-highway vehicle use.
- E. In a careless, reckless or negligent manner so as to endanger the safety of any person or property of any other person. For the purposes of this subsection, *reckless* includes:
 - 1. Any act described in 625 ILCS 5/11-503;
 - 2. Operating, riding or controlling any non-highway vehicle in the path of other motor vehicles, pedestrians or bicyclists; or
 - 3. Operating, riding or controlling any non-highway vehicle while clinging to any highway vehicle or in such a manner as to interfere with vehicular, bicycle or pedestrian traffic.
- F. Non-highway vehicles operated in violation of this subsection may be towed and/or impounded by the Village. The registered owner of a non-highway vehicle may recover the vehicle by furnishing evidence of his or her identity and ownership or possessory right to the vehicle, by signing a receipt for the vehicle and by paying or causing to be paid all applicable fines, towing and impoundment fees.
- G. While under the influence of intoxicating liquor or controlled substances or drugs. A non-highway vehicle operated in violation of this subsection may be towed and/or impounded, and the operator of such vehicle may be arrested and detained pursuant to the 625 ILCS 5/11-501, *et seq.* The registered owner of a non-highway vehicle may recover the vehicle by furnishing evidence of his or her identity and ownership or possessory right to the vehicle, signing a receipt for the vehicle and paying or causing to be paid all applicable fines, towing and impoundment fees.
- H. In a manner that creates loud, unnecessary or unusual noise that disturbs or interferes with the peace and quiet of other persons.
- I. It shall be unlawful for any parent or legal guardian of a minor to permit, authorize or negligently fail to prevent the operation of a non-highway vehicle by such minor in violation of this Chapter. A parent or legal guardian of a minor who violates this

subsection shall be guilty of violating this Chapter and shall be liable for all resulting injuries to persons or damage to property.

J. It shall be unlawful for any person to cause, authorize or knowingly permit a motor vehicle, including a motor driven cycle, owned or under such person's control to be operated on any public streets, sidewalks, school grounds, park property, parking lots, playgrounds, bike and walking paths, nature trails, recreational areas and golf courses in violation of the Illinois Vehicle Code or the Village Code.

K. Exemptions.

1. Any non-highway vehicles used by first responders, authorized personnel of another governmental body, or other persons authorized by the Village are exempt from the conditions of this Chapter when operation is necessary in the performance of their official duties.

2. Motorized wheelchairs and other mobility devices used by people with disabilities are exempt from the provisions of this Chapter.

§ __.03 LOW-SPEED ELECTRIC SCOOTERS.

The operation of an electric scooter within the Village of Steger is permitted, provided that such operation complies with the following conditions and limitations:

A. A person shall not operate an electric scooter on any street or highway with a posted speed limit greater than 30 miles per hour.

B. A person shall not operate an electric scooter unless he or she is 18 years of age or older and has a valid driver's license.

C. An electric scooter may be parked in the same manner and locations as bicycles are lawfully permitted to be parked.

D. When operated during nighttime hours, every electric scooter shall be equipped with:

1. A front lamp emitting a white light visible from a distance of at least 500 feet to the front; and

2. A rear red reflector visible from all distances from 100 feet to 600 feet when illuminated by lawful lower beam headlamps on a motor vehicle, or a steady or flashing red light visible from a distance of 500 feet to the rear.

3. An electric scooter shall not be equipped with, nor shall any person use upon an electric scooter, any siren or similar audible warning device. This subsection does not apply to an electric scooter that is operated by a

member of the police department or the fire department in the performance of their official duties.

- E. Every electric scooter shall be equipped with a brake capable of adequately controlling movement and of stopping and holding the electric scooter under normal operating conditions.
- F. A person shall not operate an electric scooter while carrying any package, bundle or article that prevents the operator from keeping at least one hand on the handlebars at all times.
- G. A person shall not use an electric scooter to carry more than one person at a time. A person operating an electric scooter shall not attach himself or herself or the electric scooter to any other vehicle being operated on a public right-of-way.
- H. A person shall not operate an electric scooter upon any public street or highway within the Village while under the influence of alcohol, controlled substances or other intoxicating substance.
- I. A person shall not operate an electric scooter on State highways within the Village.
- J. Every electric scooter operated within the Village shall be maintained in safe and good operating condition, free from defects that could endanger persons or property.

§ __.04 LOW-SPEED ELECTRIC BICYCLES (E-BIKES).

The operation of an electric bicycle within the Village of Steger is permitted, provided that such operation complies with the following conditions and limitations:

- A. All electric bicycles operated within the Village shall comply with equipment and manufacturing requirements established by the United States Consumer Product Safety Commission under 16 C.F.R. 1512 and 625 ILCS 5/11-1517(b) and (c). No person shall knowingly tamper with or modify an electric bicycle so as to alter the motor speed capability or engagement threshold without replacing the label required under 625 ILCS 5/11-1517(c) to accurately reflect the modified classification.
- B. A person shall not operate an electric bicycle upon any public street, parking lot right-of-way, sidewalk, bike trail, walking trail, nature trail or recreation area without a valid driver's license.

- C. A person shall not operate an electric bicycle on any public street where the posted speed limit is 30 miles per hour or greater.
- D. Every electric bicycle used during night hours shall be equipped with:
1. A front lamp that emits a white light visible from a distance of at least 500 feet to the front; and
 2. A rear red reflector visible from 100 to 600 feet when illuminated by lawful lower-beam headlamps of a motor vehicle, or a steady or flashing rear red lamp visible from at least 500 feet to the rear.
 3. All electric bicycle operators shall comply with all applicable provisions of the State of Illinois Rules of the Road regulations governing bicycle usage.
 4. All Class 3 low-speed electric bicycles are prohibited from operation on any bike trails, walking or running trails or any other similar recreation trails within the Village.
 5. A person shall not operate an electric bicycle upon any public street or highway within the Village while under the influence of alcohol, controlled substances or other intoxicating substance.
 6. Every electric bicycle operated within the Village shall be maintained in safe and good operating condition, free from defects that could endanger persons or property.

§ __.05 OPERATION OF MOTORIZED PLAY VEHICLES.

- A. It shall be unlawful for any person to operate, drive, ride, use or be in actual physical control of a motorized play vehicle under any of the following conditions:
1. Public Property. Upon, over, or across any public road, highway, street, sidewalk, bicycle path, parkway, parking area or other public property within the Village, except when specifically directed by a sworn law enforcement officer of the Village; or
 2. Private Property. Upon, over or across any private road, driveway, sidewalk, bicycle path, parking lot or other private property within the Village without the express written consent of the property owner or lawful occupant.

- B. Nothing in this section shall be construed to prohibit the use of a mobility device by a person with a disability or to restrict the lawful operation of a non-highway vehicle, electric bicycle or electric scooter as otherwise permitted by this Chapter or by state law.

§ __.06 IMPOUNDMENT OF REGULATED VEHICLES

- A. **Authority to Impound.** The Village Police Department or any law enforcement officer acting within the Village is hereby authorized to impound any regulated vehicle that is operated, parked or otherwise used in violation of this Chapter or any provision of the Illinois Vehicle Code, or that constitutes a public safety hazard or nuisance, or an obstruction to traffic or pedestrians.
- B. **Grounds for Impoundment.** Impoundment may occur under the following circumstances or any other appropriate circumstances:
 - 1. When the operator has been arrested or cited for a violation of this Chapter or of the Illinois Vehicle Code, and the regulated vehicle cannot be safely or lawfully driven from the scene;
 - 2. When the regulated vehicle is operated recklessly or in a manner endangering persons or property;
 - 3. When the regulated vehicle is operated while the operator is under the influence of alcohol, controlled substances, or other intoxicating compounds;
 - 4. When the regulated vehicle is operated without a valid driver's license or in violation of any age restriction established by this Chapter;
 - 5. When the regulated vehicle is being operated or parked upon public or private property without authorization; or
 - 6. When the regulated vehicle is abandoned, unclaimed or determined to be unsafe for operation.
- C. **Towing and Storage.** Impounded regulated vehicles shall be towed, transported and stored by a licensed towing or storage facility authorized by the Village. The owner or operator shall be responsible for all towing, transportation and storage charges.

D. **Notice of Impoundment.** Within a reasonable time following impoundment, the Chief of Police or his/her designee shall make reasonable efforts to notify the owner of the regulated vehicle of:

1. The reason for impoundment;
2. The location of the regulated vehicle; and
3. The procedure for reclaiming the regulated vehicle.

E. **Release of Regulated Vehicle.** The registered owner may obtain release of the regulated vehicle upon:

1. Providing satisfactory proof of ownership of the regulated vehicle;
2. Paying all applicable towing and storage fees; and
3. Paying any fines, penalties, or administrative costs imposed under this Chapter or other applicable ordinances.

F. **Administrative Hearing and Review.**

1. **Hearing Process.** Any person seeking to contest the validity of an impoundment under this Chapter shall do so through the Village's administrative adjudication system for vehicular standing, parking and compliance regulation violations, as established in Section 82-512 et seq. of the Village Code and authorized by 625 ILCS 5/11-208.3.
2. **Jurisdiction.** The Traffic Compliance Administrator and Hearing Officer appointed under Section 82-512 shall have jurisdiction to conduct hearings, administer oaths, issue subpoenas, admit evidence and make final determinations regarding the validity of any impoundment made pursuant to this Chapter.
3. **Request for Hearing.** A request for hearing must be filed with the Traffic Compliance Administrator within five (5) days after receiving the notice of impoundment. Failure to make a timely request for hearing shall constitute a waiver of the right to contest the impoundment and shall render the impoundment final.
4. **Final Determination.** Upon conclusion of the hearing, the Hearing Officer shall make a final determination sustaining or releasing the impoundment. A finding that the impoundment was proper shall constitute a final determination of liability, subject to judicial review under the Administrative Review Law (735 ILCS 5/3-101 et seq.).

5. **Fees Pending Hearing.** The owner or operator may recover the regulated vehicle prior to the hearing upon payment of all towing and storage charges.

G. Disposition of Unclaimed Regulated Vehicles. Any impounded regulated vehicle not claimed within the time provided by law may be disposed of in accordance with the Illinois Vehicle Code (625 ILCS 5/4-201 et seq.) and other applicable regulations governing unclaimed or abandoned vehicles.

§ ____.07 PARENTAL LIABILITY

- A. It shall be unlawful for any parent, legal guardian, or other person having custody or control of a minor to permit, authorize, allow or acquiesce in the operation or use of any motorized play vehicle, non-highway vehicle, electric bicycle or electric scooter by such minor in violation of any provision of this Chapter, or to negligently fail to exercise reasonable care to prevent such operation or use.
- B. Any parent, legal guardian or other person having custody or control of a minor who violates this subsection shall be deemed to have committed a separate offense and shall be subject to the same penalties provided in this Chapter for the underlying violation.
- C. In addition to any fine or penalty imposed, any such parent, legal guardian, or other person having custody or control of a minor shall be jointly and severally liable for any and all damages or injuries to persons or property resulting from the operation or use of a motorized play vehicle, non-highway vehicle, electric bicycle or electric scooter by such minor in violation of this Chapter.

§ ____.08 VIOLATION AND PENALTY

- A. Any person who violates any provision of this Chapter shall, upon conviction, be subject to a fine of not less than \$50 for the first offense, \$150 for the second offense, \$500 for a third offense and \$750 for a fourth offense. Each violation shall constitute a separate and distinct offense.
- B. Any parent, legal guardian or other person having custody or control of a minor who violates this Chapter shall be deemed to have committed a separate offense and shall be subject to the same penalties as provided herein.
- C. The enforcement of this Chapter and the imposition of penalties provided herein shall not preclude the Village from pursuing any other remedies

available at law or in equity, including recovery of damages, restitution or injunctive relief.
