- 3/14 Domestic Battery – 3500 Block of Wallace Ave. Police responded to the area for a domestic disturbance. Upon arrival, police separated two siblings engaged in a physical altercation. While placing Marissa C. Bennett, 23 of Steger in custody for domestic battery, she resisted and battered the police officer. Bennett was charged with Domestic Battery, Aggravated Battery to a Peace Officer, and Resisting or Obstructing a Peace Officer. Bennett was processed and transported to the Will County Adult Detention Facility.
- 3/14 Harassment through Electronic Communication – 0-100 Block of 36<sup>th</sup> Pl. Victim told police every time her ex-boyfriend gets intoxicated he sends threatening text messages. Information provided to obtain an Order of Protection. Information forwarded to the Crisis Center of South Suburbia.
- 3/14 Domestic Dispute – 400 Block of W. 35<sup>th</sup> St. Verbal altercation between cohabitants. Parties agreed to remain in different parts of the residence for the evening, peace restored.
- 3/15 Theft, Criminal Damage to Property – 0-100 Block of W. 35<sup>th</sup> St. Victim reported her boyfriend rear-ended her car and took her cellphone. Police provided information to obtain an Order of Protection. TOT Investigations.
- 3/15 Disturbance – 3327 Chicago Rd. (Glass Tap). Police were dispatched to the business for a customer refusing to leave. Police spoke to all involved parties, the customer departed without incident.
- 3/15 Domestic Disturbance – 3500 Block of Peoria St. Altercation between cohabitants. Mutual combatants, conflicting statements, unable to substantiate complaints. One of the involved parties agreed to stay with a family member for the evening.

- 3/16 Traffic Arrest – 3300 Block of Emerald Ave. Motorist, Anthony D. Harris, 30 of Steger was stopped for speeding, 51 mph in a posted 30 mph zone. A status check revealed Harris’s license was suspended. Harris was cited and released on a Cook County Notice to appear. The offender’s vehicle was towed and impounded.
- 3/16 Check Well Being – 20 E. 34<sup>th</sup> St. Rodney Tyler, 61 of Steger was reported laying on his back near the train tracks. Police made contact with the subject who was highly intoxicated, and unable to sit up or stand without assistance. Subject was transported to the hospital for his high intoxication level and possible injuries. Tyler was cited for Trespassing on Railroad Property and Pedestrian under the Influence of Alcohol / Drugs.
- 3/16 Criminal Damage, Disorderly Conduct – 3100 Block of Phillips Ave. Juvenile on electronic monitoring caused a breach of the peace, and damaged property. Juvenile taken into custody and transported to the Cook County Juvenile Detention Center.
- 3/17 Motor Vehicle Theft – 3500 Block of Wallace Ave. An unknown offender stole the victim’s 2011 Hyundai Sonata. The vehicle was recovered in the area of 227<sup>th</sup> PL. The vehicle was towed from scene, and processed for evidence. TOT Investigations.
- 3/17 Harassment through Electronic Communication – 3300 Block of Green St. Victim reported receiving harassing and threatening messages from a relative. Police spoke to both parties, conflicting statements. Parties advised not to have contact.
- 3/17 Domestic Battery – 500 Block of W. Richton Rd. Christin D. Turner, 39 of Steger was arrested for causing bodily harm to a family member. Charges included, Domestic Battery, Endangering the Life or Health of a Child, and Aggravated Battery. Turner was processed and transported to the Will County Adult Detention Facility.
- 3/18 Domestic Disturbance – 3700 Block of Union Ave. Altercation between cohabitants. Conflicting statements, lack of supporting evidence, unable to substantiate complaints.
- 3/20 Criminal Damage to Property – 3500 Block of John St. Victim reported her ex-girlfriend damaged her 2017 Chevy Malibu. The offender broke the driver side mirror and damaged the license plate. The victim to follow up with a no stalking order from Will County.
