- 2/1 Battery – 3500 Block of Peoria St. Victim reported, an acquaintance came to his residence at approximately 2:40 am. The two engaged in a verbal altercation and the subject punched the victim in the face. Victim refused prosecution.
- 2/1 Recovered Stolen Motor Vehicle – Kings Rd. & 231st St. W.C.S.P. discovered an abandoned Nissan Maxima with a broken sunroof. Steger Police made notification to the owner, who confirmed the vehicle was stolen. The vehicle was removed from the scene and entered into LEADS as towed recovered stolen motor vehicle.
- 2/1 Burglary to Motor Vehicle – 3000 Block of Morgan St. Victim reported while parked in the 3100 Block of Morgan an unknown offender entered his unsecured motor vehicle and stole a gym bag containing two I-Phones and an I-Pad. Police are investigating.
- 2/2 Disturbance, Criminal Damage to Property – 11 W. 34th St. (Brown Onion Pub). Bar staff told police a patron was upset over her bill. The subject became aggressive and attempted to engage in a physical altercation with staff. Staff attempted to kick the subject out of the bar, when the offender broke a glass entry door. Police arrived and attempted to detain the aggressor. The subject broke free falling to the ground injuring her head against a bar stool. The subject was transported to St. James Hospital in Olympia Fields. TOT Investigations.
- 2/2 Domestic Battery – 3400 Block of S. Kings Rd. Victim reported being involved in a verbal altercation with her boyfriend, Kameron I. Tucker, 29 of Steger. The victim reported the argument was continued from the previous night. The victim told police, Tucker pulled off her wig causing a laceration to the back of her ear. Tucker was gone upon police arrival. Police located Tucker near 34th & Chicago Rd. The subject was taken into custody. Tucker was processed and transported to the Will County Adult Detention Facility.

- 2/3 Traffic Arrest – 34th & Florence Ave. Motorist, Dajour K. Richardson, 29 of Sauk Village was stopped for disobeying a traffic control device. A status check revealed Richardson's driver's license was suspended, and he had an active warrant out of Will County. Richardson was issued a Pre-Trial Notice to Appear for the traffic charges. And transported to the Will County Adult Detention Facility for the active warrant. The offender's vehicle was towed and impounded.
- 2/4 Harassment through Electronic Communication – 3400 Block of S. Kings Rd. Victim reported receiving harassing text messages from an acquaintance. Police spoke to both parties, and mitigated a peaceful resolution.
- 2/4 Criminal Damage to Property – 300 Block of W. 34th St. Victim reported his roommate threw a brick through the windshield of his 2017 Chevy Equinox. TOT Investigations, charges pending.
- 2/5 Domestic Dispute – 3400 Block of S. Kings Rd. Verbal altercation between cohabitants. Information provided to obtain an Order of Protection.
- 2/5 Harassment – 3000 Block of Butler Ave. Resident received threatening letters, and believes it is related to past damage to her vehicle.
- 2/6 Fraud – 35 W. 34th St. Victim received a call from a person identifying himself as a representative of JP Morgan Chase Bank. The subject informed the victim of fraudulent activity with his account. The victim provided the subject with his date of birth, account information and social security number. The subject convinced the victim to send money to cover the account. Police are investigating.
- 2/6 Disorderly Conduct – 3329 Chicago Rd. (Glass Tap). Staff requested a patron causing a breach of the peace be removed. Police located the individual and escorted her off of the property, peace restored.
