- 2/21 Fraud – 3500 Block of Sangamon St. Victim reported fraudulent activity with her bank account. The victim was provided information how to check her credit. TOT Investigation.
- 2/22 Domestic Battery – 300 Block of W. 35th St. Tanya A. Sharp, 23 of Steger was arrested for battering her girlfriend. Sharp was processed and transported to the Will County Adult Detention Facility.
- 2/22 Criminal Damage to Property – 430 W. 34th St. (PK's Pantry). Two juveniles entered the store. The employee advised only one juvenile at a time. The juveniles exited, one of the juveniles kicked the door causing it to shatter. The juveniles fled prior to police arrival. Police are investigating.
